



Basketweave dishcloth

Materials:

Crochet hook US size C/2 (3 mm) Mayflower Cotton 8

Measurements: approx. 9.4×9.4 inches (24×24) cm). If you prefer a larger cloth: just add a number of stitches divisible with 4+2

Yarn usage: approx. 1.8 oz. (50g) per cloth

Abbreviations:

ch: chain stitch

s: stitch

 \mathbf{sc} : single crochet

dc: double crochet

 $\boldsymbol{bpdc}: back\ post\ double\ crochet$

fpdc: front post double crochet



Pattern:

- 1. Start with a foundation ch. Ch 62.
- 2. In the 4th ch from the hook, work 1 dc. Work dc till the end of the row.
- 3. Turn your work by chaining 2. Work 2 fpdc, "2 bpdc, 2 fpdc" Repeat from "to" until the end of the row. Work 1 regular dc in the turning stitch.
- 4. Turn your work by chaining 2. Work 2 bpdc, " 2 fpdc, 2 bpdc" Repeat from "to" until the end of the row. Work 1 regular dc in the turning s.
- 5. Turn your work by chaining 2. Work 2 bpdc, " 2 fpdc, 2 bpdc" Repeat from "to" until the end of the row. Work 1 regular dc in the turning s.
- 6. Turn the work by chaining 2. Work 2 fpdc, "2 bpdc, 2 fpdc". Repeat from "to" until the end of the row. Work 1 regular dc in the turning s.
- 7. Repeat row 3-6 until you have the desired cloth size.

Edge:

The edge can be left as it is, or you can work an edge of sc sts around the edge of the cloth.

Instructions:



1. Start by making a foundation ch. In the 4th ch from the hook, work 1 dc.



2. Work dc sts till the end of the row.





3. Turn your work by chaining 2.



4. The first fpdc needs to be crocheted around the post of the 2nd dc of the previous row. The needle marks how the hook should be placed around the post from the front.



5. Now, you have worked the first fpdc.



6. Now, work one more fpdc around the next post of the previous row.



7. Now, you have worked 2 fpdc.



8. Now, you need to work 1 bpdc around the next dc post. The needle marks how the hook should be placed around the post from behind.





9. Now, you have worked 1 bpdc.



10. Now, you should work one more bpdc around the next dc post of the previous row.



11.Now, you have worked 2 bpdc.



12. Repeat fpdc and bpdc throughout the row. In the last s, work 1 regular dc.



13. Turn your work by chaining 2.



14. Work 1 bpdc around the next 2 dc posts of the previous row.





15. Work 1 fpdc around the next 2 dc posts of the previous row.



16. Repeat alternating between 2 fpdc and 2 bpdc till the end of the row, work 1 regular dc in the turning s.



18. Turn your work by chaining 2.



19. Work 1 bpdc around the next 2 dc posts of the previous row.



21. Work 1 fpdc around the next 2 dc posts of the previous row.



22. Repeat alternating between 2 bpdc and fpdc until the end of the row. Work 1 regular dc in the turning s.





23. Turn your work by chaining 2. Work 1 fpdc around the next 2 dc posts of the previous row.



24. Work 1 bpdc around the next 2 dc posts of the previous row.



25. Repeat alternating between 2 fpdc and 2 bpdc till the end of the row. Work 1 regular dc in the turning s.

Now, repeat row 3-6 until you have the desired measurements for your cloth.
