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# **Ribbon Shopper with a Leather Base – Small**

### Materials:

Crochet hook US size H/8 (5 mm) (if your tension's usually tight, you can use a size J/10 (6 mm) Hobbii Ribbon Go Handmade leather base size str. 31 x 10 cm (12.2 x 4 inches) Handbag strap or handle Magnetic lock or magnetic button w. flap 4 cm (1.6 inches)

**Measurements**: Approx. 10 inches (25 cm) tall and 15.8 inches (40 cm) wide at the top (measured lying flat)

#### Abbreviations:

Ch: Chain St: Stitch Sc: Single crochet Sl st: Slip stitch Blo: Back loop only Lsc: Long single crochet Ks: Knit stitch

**Usage:** Approx. 1lb 2.8 oz (530 g) Ribbon (3 skeins)

Start by making sl st around in the holes in the base. Cut and pull the end of the yarn through the hole and tie a knot.

Now work sc around in the sl sts on the base like this:

- Start in the top left side. Work "1 sc in the first sl st, 2 sc in the next sl st, 1 sc in the next sl st". Repeat "to" 2 times. Now work 3 sc in the sl st in the corner. Now work on the bottom long side. Work "1 sc in the first sl st, 2 sc in the next sl st". Repeat "to" 10 times. Work 1 sc in the next st. Work 3 sc in the sl st in the corner. Now work on the short side to the right. Work "1 sc in the first sl st, 2 sc in the next sl st, 1 sc in the next sl st, 1 sc in the next sl st". Repeat "to" 2 times. Now work 3 sc in the sl st in the corner. Now work on the top long side. Work "1 sc in the first sl st, 2 sc in the next sl st, 1 sc in the next sl st". Repeat "to" 2 times. Now work 3 sc in the sl st in the corner. Now work on the top long side. Work "1 sc in the first sl st, 2 sc in the next sl st". Repeat "to" 10 times. Work 2 sc in the next st. Work 3 sc in the sl st in the corner (91).
- 2. Work 1 sc in the next 9 st, work 3 sc in the next st (the middle one of the 3 sc in the corner). Work 1 sc in the next 33, work 3 sc in the next st (the middle one of the 3 sc in the corner). Work 1 sc in the next 10 st and 3 sc in the next st (the middle one of the 3 sc in the corner). Work 1 sc in the next 34 st and work 3 sc in the next st (the middle one of the 3 sc in the corner). Work 1 sc in the next st (the middle one of the 3 sc in the corner). Work 1 sc in the next 34 st and work 3 sc in the next st (the middle one of the 3 sc in the corner). Work 1 sc in the next st (99).
- 3. Work sc in blo around (99).
- 4. Work "1 sc, 1 lsc". Repeat "to" around. Finish with 1 sc (99).
- 5. Work "1 lsc, 1 sc". Repeat "to" around. Finish with 1 lsc (99).

Now repeat round 4 and 5 16 times all in all and finish with 1 sl st.

## Now the top brim is worked.

Make 1 ch and work 1 round of sc. Finish with 1 sl st.

Make 1 ch and work 1 round of ks and finish with 1 sl st. Repeat this round all in all 4 times or until you have the wanted height of your shopper. Finish with 1 round of sl st. Cut the yarn and weave in ends.



### Instructions - base:



1. Now you have to make sl st in the holes in the 2. Now work sl st in the holes all the way base. Start in the top left corner as in the picture above.



around.



3. Cut the yarn.



4. Pull the end of the yarn to the back.



5. Tie a knot and twist the end in between the chains on the back.



6. Flip the base so you have the sl st up.



#### 1st round



1. Attach the yarn in the 2nd sl st as in the picture above.



2. Work "1 sc in the first sl st, 2 sc in the next sl st, 1 sc in the next sl st". (The first sc is worked in the sl st where you attached the yarn). Repeat "to" 2 times.



3. Now work 3 sc in the sl st in the corner.



 Now work on the bottom long side. Work "1 sc in the first sl st, 2 sc in the next sl st". Repeat "to" 10 times. Work 1 sc in the next st.



5. Work 3 sc in the sl st in the corner.




6. Now work on the short side to the right. Work "1 sc in the first sl st, 2 sc in the next sl st, 1 sc in the next sl st". Repeat "to" 2 times.


7. Now work 3 sc in the sl st in the corner.



8. Now work on the top long side. Work "1 sc in the first sl st, 2 sc in the next sl st". Repeat "to" 10 times.



9. Work 2 sc in the next st (make 1 more st on this side because we need an uneven amount of st for the pattern on the sides).



10. Work 3 sc in the sl st in the corner.



11. You have now made sc all the way around.



## 2nd round



1. Work 1 sc in the next 9 st



2. work 3 sc in the next (the middle one of the 3 sc in the corner).



3. Work 1 sc in the next 33 st



4. work 3 sc in the next st (the middle one of the 3 sc in the corner).



5. Work 1 sc in the next 10 st and 3 sc in the next st (the middle one of the 3 sc in the corner).



6. Work 1 sc in the next 34 st

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7. and work 3 sc in the next (the middle one of the 3 sc in the corner). Work 1 sc in the last st.




8. You have now made another round of sc.

# **3rd round**



1. On this round work sc in blo. Here the needle 2. Like this. Repeat around. marks the bl where your sc should be made.

### Instructions - sides:

# 1st round



1. Work 1 sc in first st.



2. In the next st work 1 lsc. Here the needle marks where to work your lsc.



3. There. You have now made 1 sc and 1 lsc.



4. Work 1 sc in the next st.



5. Work 1 lsc in the next st. Here the needle marks where to work your lsc.



6. There. Now repeat "1 sc, 1 lsc" around.





7. Finish with 1 sc.

#### 2nd round



1. Work 1 lsc. Here the needle marks where to work your lsc.



2. Like this.



3. Work 1 sc in the next st. You have now made 1 lsc and 1 sc.



4. Work 1 lsc in the next st. Here the needle marks where to work your lsc.

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5. Like this.



7. Repeat around and finish with 1 lsc.



6. Work 1 sc in the next st.



8. Repeat these 2 rounds all in all 16 times or until you have the wanted height of your shopper. Finish the last round with 1 sl st.

# Instructions - top brim:



1. Make 1 ch. Work 1 sc around and finish with 1 sl st.



2. Now work knit stitch. Make 1 ch. Work 1 sc in the v of the stitch below. Here the needle marks where to work your sc.

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3. You have now made the first ks.



4. Work ks in the v of the next st. Here the needle marks where to work your ks.



5. You have now made another ks.



6. Work ks around and finish with 1 sl st.



7. Repeat the round so you have 4 rounds of ks. Work 1 round of sl st. Cut the yarn and weave in ends.



### Sewing on the magnetic button w. flap:

Sew on 1 flap on each side inside the shopper as shown in the picture below. Use sewing thread, yarn or embroidery yarn. Now the shopper can be closed in the middle.



#### Sewing on the magnetic lock:

You can also choose to use a magnetic lock. Sew on 1 magnetic lock on each side inside the shopper as shown in the picture below. Use sewing thread, yarn or embroidery yarn. Now the shopper can be closed in the middle.



#### Sewing on the handbag handle:

You can use which ever handle you wish. There are short or long, with or without hook and in many different colors. You can see a large selection of handles and accessories here: <a href="http://shop.hobbii.dk/taske-hanke">http://shop.hobbii.dk/taske-hanke</a>

Here a handbag handle of 42 cm (16.5 inches) with a buckle has been used. It is attached by sewing the buckle with Ribbon yarn on the shopper with the desired space between them.





For this shopper a handbag handle of 60 cm (23.6 inches) has been used. It is sewn on with regular cotton yarn. You can also use sewing thread or embroidery yarn.
