

## Ribbon "C2C" Pot holders

## Materials:

- Crochet hook 5 mm (US size
- Hobbii Ribbon
- $2 \times 30 \mathrm{~cm}$ leather string or $2 \times 16 \mathrm{~cm}$ leather strap 18 mm as suspension
- 2 x rivets $6-9 \mathrm{~mm}$ to attach the leather straps (optional)
- Leather hole punch (optional)

Usage: Approx. 190g per set

Measurement: Approx. $20 \times 20 \mathrm{~cm}$

## Abbreviations:

Ch: chain stitch
St: stitch(es)
Sl st: slip stitch
Hdc: half double crochet

## About this pattern

"C2C" - Corner to corner is worked with the following stitches: ch, hdc and sl st.
As the name also states, the pattern is worked from one corner to another.
"C2C" consist of little "squares". You inc on each row, which means that you get one more square for each row worked. The same goes for dec, where you get 1 "square" less for each row worked.

## Pattern/Instruction: make 2 pcs.

## Increases

1. Ch 5 . Work 1 hdc in $3^{\text {rd }}$ ch from hook and 1 hdc in each of the next 2 ch. You have now worked 1 "square

2. Ch 5 to turn. Work 1 hdc in $3^{\text {rd }}$ ch from hook and 1 hdc in each of the next 2 ch. Work 1 sl st in left hook of the first "square" on the first row. You have now worked 1 "square".


Ch 2 ch (= replaces 1 hdc ) and 3 hdc in the same "hole" which was made with sl st and ch 2 . You have now worked one more "square" and you have a total of 2 squares on your row.

3. Ch 5 to turn. Work 1 hdc in $3^{\text {rd }}$ ch from hook and 1 hdc in each of the next 2 ch . Work 1 sl st in left hook on $1^{\text {st }}$ "square" from previous row. You have now worked 1 "square.



Ch 2 ( = replaces 1 hdc ) and 3 hdc in the same "hole" which was made with sl st and ch 2 . Work 1 sl st in left hook on 2 nd "square" from previous row. You have now worked one more "square" and you have 2 "squares" on your row.


Ch 2 (= replaces 1 hdc ) and 3 hdc in the same "hole" which was made with sl st and ch 2 . You now worked one more "square" and you have a total 3 "squares" on your row.


Repeat the rows and inc in each row until you have 5 squares on your row.


## Increases:

You have finished increasing and the pot holder has the desired width. Now we continue with decreasing to make the square.

1. Turn. Work sl st along the side of the first"square". Ch 2 (= replaces 1 hdc ) and 3 hdc . Work 1 sl st in top corner of the next "square".



Work entire row like this until the last "square.


When at the last "square" on the row, you finish as follows:
Ch 1 in the top corner of the next "square". You have now decreased 1 "square" on your row.

2. Turn and work sl st along the side of the first "square". Ch 2 (= replaces 1 hdc ) and 3 hdc . Work 1 sl st in the top corner of the next "square".

Work row as described until the last "square".


When at the last "square" on the row, you finish as follows:
Ch 1 in the top corner of the next "square". You have now dec 1 "square" on your row.

Repeat the decrease on each row until you have 1 "square" left on your row. Turn and work sl st along the side of this "square". Cut the yarn and weave in ends.


## Leather string/leather strap suspension

Leather string suspension: cut 2 leather strings measuring approx. 30 cm each. Attach 1 string in one corner of the pot holder and close with a firm knot.


Leather strap suspension: Cut 2 leather straps measuring approx. 16 cm each. Punch through 1 hole in each end of both straps using a leather hole punch. Fold the strap around the pot holder and attach the straps to the pot holder with the rivets, use a hammer to assemble.
