## Beach Hut

No. 1009-192-3033

**Level:** Intermediate

**Crochet hook US size:** E/4 & B/1 -C/2  
(3.5 mm & 2.5 mm)

**Materials:** embroidery needle, fiber fill,  
scissors,  
stærkt cardboard, tape.

**Yarn:** Rainbow Cotton 8/8: blue, white,  
black.

Rainbow Cotton 8/4: white, gray

**How much yarn do I need?**

**The house:**

Rainbow 8/8 Blue: 2 skeins

Rainbow 8/8 White: 2 skeins

Rainbow 8/8 Black: 1 skein

**Towel and fish:**

Rainbow 8/4 White: 1 skein

Rainbow 8/4 Gray: 1 skein

**Abbreviations:**

**ch:** chain stitch

**sc:** single crochet stitch

[...] = number of stitches

(...) = number of rounds

**inc=** 2 sc in the same stitch

**dec** = crochet 2 sc together

This pattern is crocheted back and forth. You crochet 2 pieces with a roof top shape (front and back), 3 squared patches (sides and bottom of the hut), 1 rectangle for the roof and 1 small rectangle as a door. In this pattern, we do not use turning stitches, since it provides the prettiest result.

**Front and back**

**In blue,** ch 21 with hook size E/4 (3.5 mm). Start in the 2nd ch from the hook and work 20 sc.

**Rnd 2-20**

1 sc in each s (19 rnds) [20].

**Rnd 21**

dec, 16 sc, dec [18].

**Rnd 22**

dec, 14 sc, dec [16].

**Rnd 23**

dec, 12 sc, dec [14].

**Rnd 24**

dec, 10 sc, dec [12].

**Rnd 25**

dec, 8 sc, dec [10].

**Rnd 26**

dec, 6 sc, dec [8].

**Rnd 27**

dec, 4 sc, dec [6].

**Rnd 28**

dec, 2 sc, dec [4].

**Rnd 29**

dec 2 times [2].

Cut the yarn and weave in the ends.

## 2 striped sides in blue/white

**In blue**, ch 21 with hook size E/4 (3.5 mm).  
Start in the 2nc ch from the hook and work 20 sc.

### Rnd 2

1 sc in each s [20].

**Change to white:** at the last sc when you have two loops on the hook, pull the white thread through (instead of the blue) and turn the work. Please see pictures below.

### Rnd 3 – 4

1 sc in each s [20]. Change to blue.



### Rnd 5 – 6

1 sc in each s [20]. Change to white.

### Rnd 7 – 8

1 sc in each s [20]. Change to blue.

### Rnd 9 – 10

1 sc in each s [20]. Change to white.

### Rnd 11 – 12

1 sc in each s [20]. Change to blue.

**Rnd 13 – 14**

1 sc in each s [20]. Change to white.

**Rnd 15 – 16**

1 sc in each s [20]. Change to blue.

**Rnd 17 – 18**

1 sc in each s [20]. Change to white.

**Rnd 19 – 20**

1 sc in each s [20]. Cut the yarn and weave in ends.

**Base/foundation of the house in blue**

Ch 21 using hook size E/4 (3,5 mm) in blue.

Start in the 2nd ch from the hook and work 20 sc.

**Rnd 2 - 20**

1 sc in each s (19 rounds) [20].

Cut the yarn and weave in ends.

**Roof in white**

Ch 24 with crochet hook E/4 (3.5 mm) in white.

Start in the 2nd ch from the hook and work 23 sc.

**Rnd 2 – 15**

1 sc in each stitch (14 rnds) [23].

**Rnd 16**

1 sc in each s, but only in the front loops [23]. This will become the ridge of the roof.

**Rnd 17 – 30**

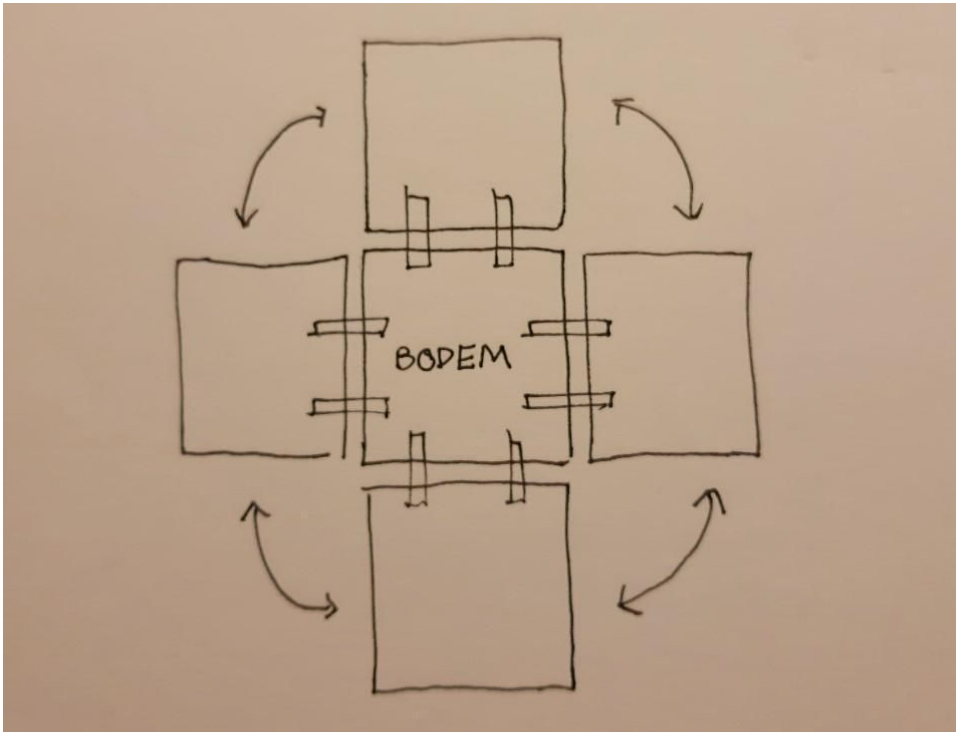
1 sc in each s (14 rnds) [23].

Cut yarn and weave in ends.

**Container of cardboard**

Transfer the crocheted foundation onto the paper or cardboard to get the right size. Make 5 squares.

Cut the squares on the inside of the dotted lines. Start with 1 square and place another square on each side of the square, and tape the sides together using tape. Then you follow the arrows to keep the container together. Please see the pictures below:



## Assembling the house

Place the front piece of the house and 1 striped side next to each other and sew the two pieces together using small sewing stitches (I have used thinner yarn). Then you sew the back piece onto the other side of the striped piece. And then you sew the other striped side together with the back piece. Weave in the ends on the inside.

Now, you sew the base together with the four sides. Now, you have an empty container. Since I use the house for decoration, I have made an inner container of cardboard which makes the house more stable. If you want the hut to be a toy, then you can stuff the hut with fiber filling and insert a jingle bell. Place the container in the hut. Please see the picture below:



Place the roof. The roof is slightly bigger than the hut. In front of the hut the roof continues 2 stitches further than the hut itself. Sew the roof onto the hut and don't forget to stuff the hut until you are satisfied with its shape. Using white yarn, you crochet a foundation chain of 28 ch stitches, sew it onto the front of the roof edge (the same side as the front door) using small sewing stitches.

## **Door in Black**

Ch 18 with hook size E/4 (3.5 mm) in black.  
Start in the 2nd ch from the hook and work 17 sc.

### **Rnd 2 – 8**

1 sc in each s (7 rnds) [17].

Cut the yarn and weave in the ends.

Sew the door onto the front using small sewing stitches. Sew 2 loops as a door handle.

## **Fish, crochet hook B/1-C/2 (2.5 mm) and cotton 8/4**

The fish is crocheted by using amigurumi technique. You crochet in the round.

**1. rnd:** 6 sc in a magic ring [6].

- 2. rnd:** 1 sc, inc, 3x [9].  
**3. rnd:** 2 sc, inc, 3x [12].  
**4. – 8. rnd:** 1 sc in each s (4 rnds) [12].  
**9. rnd:** 2 sc, dec, 3x [9].  
**10. – 11. rnd:** 1 sc in each s (2 rnds) [9].  
**12. rnd:** 1 sc, dec, 3x [6].

Fold the fish flat. Work through both sides:

3 sc, ch 1, turn your work [3].

Inc, 1 sc, inc, ch 1, turn your work [5].

Inc, 3 sc, inc [7].

Cut the yarn and weave in the ends.

Embellish the fish with small sewing stitches and an eye.

## White kitchen towel on a washing line

The kitchen towel is crocheted back and forth without using turning stitches.

Ch 11 with hook size B/1-C/2 (2.5 mm) in white.

Start in the 2nd ch from the hook and work 10 sc.

### Rnd 2 – 10

1 sc in each s ( 9 rnds) [10].

Make a washing line using a optional color on one side of the house and attach the kitchen towel with small clothes pegs.

Now, you have your very own beach hut... Enjoy!

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
