Sizes: S, M, L, XL, XXL **Skill level:** Beginner

Crochet hook: 4 mm (US size G)

Materials: Needle, scissors **Yarn:** 1 cake of Sultan Deluxe in color: Mojave Azurite (17)



Abbreviations used in this pattern:

- Ch = chain
- **Sc** = single crochet
- **Dc** = double crochet
- V St = V stitch (1 dc, ch 1, 1 dc in the same st)
- St(s) = stitch (es)

Gauge:

- **17 dc** = 10 cm
- 9 rows = 10 cm

About the design

I love this Green Sea Poncho. It's so light and elegant and perfect for any season. You can wear it over anything you like, tank tops, t-shirts, shirts etc.

The Design of this poncho is super easy and any beginner will be able to make it. You just make a big rectangle, fold it in half and sew about half of the length on the upper side. Super simple, right?

About the yarn

For this pattern I used Hobbii Sultan Deluxe which is a Fingering, 4 ply, Super Fine yarn. It's 100% cotton, it's really soft and you can find it in such beautiful colors. Plus, one cake has 250 grams and approximately 1000 m of yarn, which is enough to complete a lot of big projects.





About the stitch pattern

For this pattern we will use simple stitches. For the entire project we will alternate 2 rows of double crochet and 1 row of V sts. At the end we will make a border in shell stitches, which is pretty simple too.

How to make the Double Crochet V stitch:


1 dc, ch 1, 1 dc in the same st, ch 1, skip 3

How to make the Shell stitch:

5 dc in the same st, skip 2, 1 sc in next, skip 2



Below you will find the stitch chart for the main pattern of the Green Sea Poncho:





Final Measurements

This pattern is available in 5 sizes: Small, Medium, Large, XLarge and XXLarge and is written in US terms. Below you will find the diagrams with the final measurements.

Pattern Notes

- The Ch 3 at the beginning of the row counts as first double crochet.
- When making the shell stitch border on the wider part, make the sc and shell stitch in between the rows.

Now that we have all the details in place, let's start making this beautiful poncho!

First the foundation chain:

- **S** = 93 sts
- **M** = 93 sts
- L = 97 sts
- **XL** = 97sts
- **XXL** = 97 sts



Row 1

Ch 3, starting with 5th ch, 1 dc in each st, ch 3 and turn

Row 2

1 dc in the 2nd st, 1 dc in each st across. Ch 3 and turn

Row 3

1 dc in 2nd st, ch 1, skip 2, 1 V st in next [ch 1, skip 3, 1 V st in next]. Repeat the section to the end of the row. Finish the row with ch 1, skip 2, 1 dc in last 2 sts. Ch 3 and turn.



Repeat rows 1–3 until you have in total:

- **S** = 114 rows
- M = 118 rows
- L = 120 rows
- **XL** = 126 rows
- **XXL** = 130 rows

After finishing the length of the rectangle make the border in shell stitches as explained above. Start the border from where your yarn is and go around the edges.





After finishing the border, fold the piece in half. Use a stitch marker to mark the neck opening.

Leave space for the neck line:

- **S** = 30 rows
- **M** = 31 rows
- L = 32 rows
- **XL** = 33 rows
- **XXL** = 34 rows

To join the rest of the rows you can sew them or you can proceed as I did to obtain this lace look on the shoulder:

Join the yarn in the 3rd st of the first shell stitch on the right side, ch 1 and make 1 sc, ch 5 and move to the 3rd dc of the first shell on the left side and make 1 sc, ch 5 and move to the right side in the 3rd st of the second shell and make 1 sc.

^{*}if you feel that the neck line is to wide you can leave less rows for it.



Continue like this until you get to the marked stitch.



And done! Now wave in all ends and wear it as you like or give it as a present to someone you love.
