Mounting of the safety eyes:

The eyes are inserted, and the rear stops to the eyes are pushed from the inside.

The rear stops can and should be a little hard to plug in to ensure that they are sticking well.

HEAD

Cast on 4 sts on 2,5 mm needle and work in the round. 1.) *k2 in the same st* (8) 2.) *k2 in the same st, k1* (12)3.) *k2 in the same st, k2* (16)*k2 in the same st, k3* 4.) (20)5. - 11.) Insert the yarn wrapped part of the wire in one arm. Insert the other end of the wire at shoulder height through the body and sew the arm onto the body. Wrap yarn around the other end of the wire and bend as done for the first arm.

Insert the wire into the other arm. Sew the arm to the body.

Sew the legs onto the body and bend as to create feet for the mouse to stand on.

TAIL

Cut approx. 19 cm of wire. Wrap the whole piece with yarn except 2 cm on one end.

Bend this end, creating a hook allowing to attach it in the body.

Make a hole in the back of the lower body with a knitting needle, fill the hole with glue and insert crooked the part into the body.

Maybe sew the hole closed with a couple of sts in order to better attach the tail.

If desired, use a bit of lace ribbon for a little bow around the tail.

Sew lace ribbon on the neckline, including regularly spaced pleats.

Good to know

Needle Size & Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us. The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles. Therefore, we will recommend a range of needle sizes.
