Materials

7 (8, 9) balls Amigo col. 7, work with 2 threads

Circular needle 80 cm and single pointed needle 9 mm

Size

S(M)L

Measurements

Width 55 (60) 65 cm Length 49 (50) 51 cm

Gauge

- with 2 threads on needle 9 mm 10 stitches and 15 rounds on 10 cm

Pattern information

Work with 2 threads.
This sweater is worked bottom up.
Bind off for the armhole and
neckline. Sew the shoulders
together and pick up stitches
around the armhole. The sleeves
are worked top down.

German Short Rows

Work German short rows TS = turning stitch

Explanation

Make 1 stitch: Pick up yarn between the stitches and knit through back loop.

Body

CO 110 (121, 132) stitches on circular needle 80 cm and work 1 round in stockinette stitch in the round.

Round with increases

Work *k11, make 1 stitch*, repeat * to * on entire round = 120 (132, 144) stitches.

Work stockinette stitch in the round until piece measure 30 cm.

Insert a marker in each side = side seams = 60 (66, 72) stitches for the back and front piece.

Now separate the piece for the armholes. Slip the stitches for the front piece on a stitch holder or leave them on the circular needle and work the back piece on single pointed needles.

Back piece

Work stockinette stitch back and forth on the single pointed needles or circular needle. Continue until armhole measures 19 (20) 21 cm. Finish with a WS row.

Right shoulder (as sweater is worn)

Shape the shoulder with short row needles:

Work 27 (30) 33 stitches, wrap and turn (TS),

*work until there are 7 stitches left at the shoulder, turn,

work 1 TS, work until there are 3 stitches left at the neck, turn,

work 1 TS, work until there are 15 stitches left at the shoulder, turn,

work 1 TS, work until there are 6 stitches left at the neck, turn,

work 1 TS, work the entire row and work the wrapped stitches as 1 stitch, turn,

Bind off 21 (24) 27 stitches for the shoulder and work the wrapped stitches as 1 stitch*. Place 6 stitches on a stitch holder for the neck. Cut the yarn.

Neck

Slip 6 stitches on a stitch holder. Attach yarn and work the rest of the row = 27 (30) 33 stitches.

Left shoulder

Work the left shoulder in the same way as the right from * to *.

Bind off the 21 (24) 27 stitches for the shoulder.



Slip 6 stitches on a stitch holder for the neck.

Front piece

Continue working the front piece in stockinette stitch, until armhole measures 10 cm. Finish with a WS row.

Work 25 (28) 31 stitches in knit stitch, bind off 10 stitches for the neck, and work the rest of the row in knit stitch.

The right and left side of the front piece are worked separately.

Right front piece (when sweater is worn)

Decrease for the neck as follows:

1st row: purl

2nd row: k2tog tbl, work the rest of the row.

Repeat these 2 rows until you have decreased 4 stitches = 21 (24) 27 stitches left for the shoulder

Continue until armhole measures 19 (20) 21 cm. Finish with a WS row.

Bind off.

Left front piece (when sweater is worn)

Decrease for the neck as follows:

1st row: purl

2nd row: work until there are 2 stitches left, k2tog.

Repeat these 2 rows until you have decreased 4 stitches = 21 (24) 27 stitches.

Continue until armhole measures 19 (20) 21 cm. Finish with a WS row.

Bind off.

Assembly

Sew the shoulder seams together.

Sleeves (worked top down)

Pick up approx. 46 (48) 50 stitches (tightly) around the armhole using double pointed needles. Insert a marker at the beginning of the round.

Work in stockinette stitch and decrease 1 stitch on each side the marker, with 2 stitches in between.

Decrease on every 5 cm. Continue until piece measures 40 cm.

On next round decrease 6 stitches evenly.

Bind off.

Work the other sleeve in the same way.

Neck edge

Pick up stitches (tightly) from RS around the neckline.

Bind off in knit stitches.
