YARN USAGE

Jennifer H: 33 cm

The dolls in the series including
toy stuffing, metal wire, safety eyes
and hair weigh approx. 250 g

Dress and shoes
uses approx. 10 - 50 g
The hair uses approx. 60 g

MATERIALS

Metal wire, Buttons, Toy Stuffing

Safety eyes: 12 mm

Crochet Hook: 2,5 - 3,5 mm

Gauge: 20 st/10 cm

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Buttons

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Crochet Hook: 2,5 - 3,5 mm

Gauge: 20 st/10 cm

The given amounts of yarn are for guidance only.

If nothing else is specified, work in spiral rounds. To finish the work, join the round with a sl st. Leave a 20 cm length of yarn and cut. Pull the yarn through the stitch.

It is recommended that the filling continues on an ongoing basis as the work progresses.

Mounting of the safety eyes:

The eyes are inserted, and the rear stops to the eyes are pushed from the inside.

The rear stops can and should be a little hard to plug in to ensure that they are sticking well.

Cosy

Cosy's thread is perfect for knitted cardigans and sweaters. The thread is relatively lightweight, soft and with a very special elasticity, which keeps the knit beautiful and the shape in place. The nature of the fiber gives a special fluffiness, which is great to knit beautiful sweaters.

It can be said about the Cosy yarn that it is a bit vintage-like in its expression - a yarn that gives warmth and offers a breathable fabric to wear.

Cosy has been awarded the AZO certificate and is thus a yarn that everyone can feel safe using.

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COSY DOLL - JENNIFER

LEGS (GREY BROWN & TERRACOTTA, 2 X)

Start with Grey Brown:

- 1.) Work 9 ch. 2 dc into the 2nd st from the hook, 6 dc, 3 dc in the last st. Continue on the other side of the length of ch sts with 6 dc, 2 dc inc (19)
- 2.) 2 dc inc, 7 dc, 3 dc in next st, 1 dc, 3 dc in next st, 7 dc 2 dc inc (25)
- 3.) 2 dc inc, 10 dc, 2 dc inc x 4, 9 dc, 2 dc inc (31)
4. - 6.) 31 dc (31)
- 7.) 8 dc, *1 dc, dc 2 tog* x 5, 8 dc (26)
- 8.) 26 dc (26)
- 9.) 10 dc, dc 2 tog x 4, 8 dc (22)
- 10.) 10 dc, dc 2 tog x 2, 8 dc (20)
- 11.) 6 dc, dc 2 tog, 6 dc, dc 2 tog, 4 dc (18)
12. - 31.) 18 dc (18)

Change to Terracotta:

32. - 34.) 18 dc (18)

The first leg is finished here.

Cut yarn and pull yarn through the stitch.

Second leg:

Crochet like the first leg, but after round 34 add 9 dc and then 2 ch, which connect the 2 legs with each other.

After the 2 ch, continue from there to the body.

BODY (GREY BROWN & TERRACOTTA)

The body is crocheted as a continuation of the legs with Terracotta:

- 1.) 18 dc (around Leg 1), 2 dc in chain loops, 18 dc (around Leg 2), 2 dc in chain loops (40)
- 2.) 7 dc, 2 dc inc, 22 dc, 2 dc inc, 9 dc (42)
3. - 7.) 42 dc (42)

Stuff the feet with Toy Stuffing.

Cut 2 pieces of Metal wire approx. 30 cm.

Bend the end of each wire in a loop and place it in leg while working.

Join wires as per illustration when making belly.

Wire ends in the head, with a loop on top.

- 8.) *5 dc, dc 2 tog* x 6 (36)

Change to Grey Brown:


9. - 11.) 36 dc (36)
- 12.) *4 dc, dc 2 tog* x 6 (30)
- 13.-16.) 30 dc (30)
- 17.) *3 dc, dc 2 tog* x 6 (24)
18. - 21.) 24 dc (24)
- 22.) *2 dc, dc 2 tog* x 6 (18)
- 23.) 18 dc (18)
- 24.) *4 dc, dc 2 tog* x 3 (15)
25. - 26.) 15 dc (15)

Do not cut the yarn.

Stuff the body with Toy Stuffing.

Continue onto head.

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* Guide - transition from first to 2nd leg.

HEAD (GREY BROWN)

The head is crocheted as a continuation of the body.

Position the safety eyes between Rounds 12 and 13, with 11 st between the eyes.

Stuff the head with Toy Stuffing.



FACE

Place eyelashes and mouth as per photo.

Use skin color to create a nose 3 stitches wide, between Rounds 10 - 11.

ARMS (GREY BROWN, 2 X)

Stuff the hand with Toy Stuffing.



Cut 2 pieces of Metal wire the length of the arm.

Bend the ends over and place the inside arm.

See illustration.

Sew the arms onto the body.

HAIR (BLACK)

Hair cap:

- 1.) cr with 6 dc (6)
- 2.) *2 dc inc* (12)
- 3.) *1 dc, 2 dc inc* (18)
- 4.) *2 dc, 2 dc inc* (24)
- 5.) *3 dc, 2 dc inc* (30)
- 6.) *4 dc, 2 dc inc* (36)
- 7.) *5 dc, 2 dc inc* (42)
- 8.) *6 dc, 2 dc inc* (60)
- 9.) *7 dc, 2 dc inc* (54)
- 10.) *8 dc, 2 dc inc* (60)
11. - 15.) 60 dc (60)

Continue making hair strands.

- 16.) *50 ch, turn, 48 sl st starting from second st from the hook, 1 sl st* x 32 (*hair in the neck*)
40 ch, turn 38 sl st starting from second st from the hook, 1 sl st x 28 (*bangs*)



- 8.) 3 ch, 3 tr, 2 tr inc
9 tr, 2 tr inc x 3, 9 tr (47)
- 9.) 8 ch ("*eye*"), 1 sl st in 8th st from the hook, 3 ch, 47 tr (47)
10. - 12.) 3 ch, 47 tr (47)
- 13.) 8 ch ("*eye*"), 1 sl st in 8th st from the hook, 3 ch, 47 tr (47)
- 14.) 3 ch, 47 tr (47)

Sew 4 buttons to the back side of the dress to close.
Sew 3 buttons in front.

SHOES (TERRACOTTA, 2 X)

- 1.) Work 9 ch. 2 dc into the 2nd st from the hook, 6 dc, 3 dc in the last st. Continue on the other side of the length of ch sts with 6 dc, 2 dc inc (19)
- 2.) 2 dc inc, 7 dc, 3 dc in next st, 1 dc, 3 dc in next st, 7 dc, 2 dc inc (25)
- 3.) 2 dc inc, 10 dc, 2 dc inc x 4, 9 dc, 2 dc inc (31)
- 4.) 31 dc (*back loop only*) (31)
5. - 7.) 31 dc (31)
- 8.) 9 dc, *1 dc, dc 2 tog* x 5, 7 dc (26)



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DRESS (TERRACOTTA)

The dress is worked in rows from the top down.

- 1.) 37 ch, 1 sl st in the 8th st from the hook ("*eye*"), 3 ch and work 29 tr (29)
- 2.) 3 ch, *1 tr, 2 dc inc* x 14, 1 tr (43)
- 3.) 1 ch, 6 dc, 8 ch, skip 10 dc (*armhole*), 11 dc, 8 ch, skip 10 dc (*armhole*), 6 dc (39)
- 4.) 3 ch, 6 tr, 8 tr on chain, 11 tr, 8 tr on chain, 6 tr (39)
- 5.) 8 ch ("*eye*"), 1 sl st in 8th from the hook, 3 ch, 39 tr (39)
- 6.) 3 ch, *8 tr, 2 tr inc* x 4, 3 tr, (43)
- 7.) 3 ch, 43 tr (43)



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Good to know

Hook Size + Tension

Crocheters crochet very differently: some crochet with a hook size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design and quality as a person who crochets with a hook size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of crocheters who join us.

The key to crochet a specific size is a lot about the crochet style/hands/skills, rather than the size of hook. Therefore, we will recommend a range of hook sizes.



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
