



Sparkling Rainbow Jumper

No. 1006-202-2552

Sizes: XS, S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL

Skill Level: Intermediate

Crochet Hook: 4.00 mm (US size G)

Materials: Stitch markers, sewing needle for weaving in the ends, scissors

Gauge: 19 dc = 10 cm

10 rows = 10 cm

Yarn: Universe in color Supercluster (#05)

How much yarn do you need?

XS: 3 skeins

S, M: 4 skeins

L: 5 skeins

XL: 6 skeins

2XL, 3XL: 7 skeins

4XL: 8 skeins

Abbreviations used in this pattern:

ch - chain
dc - double crochet
BPdc - back post double crochet
FPdc - front post double crochet
st(s) - stitch (es)
ch sp - chain space
* - repeat section
R| - row/round

Special Stitches

Mesh stitch

1dc, ch 1, skip 1 Repeat to the end of the row.

Notes about the design

This jumper has an oversized fit, with a positive ease of about 14 cm around bust circumference.

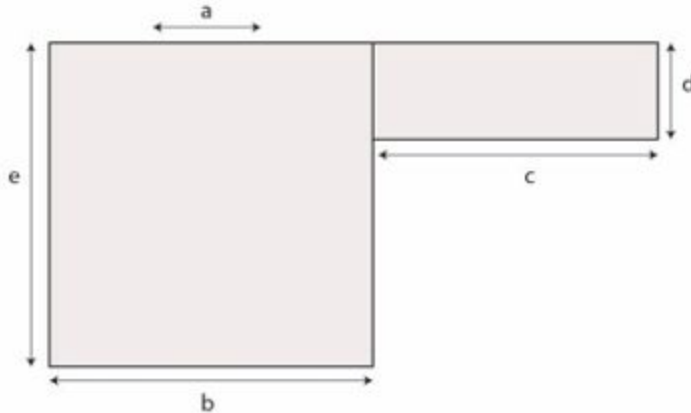
The construction of the jumper is from 2 identical panels sewed together. The crochet direction is vertical. Number of stitches in a row gives the jumper's length and the number of rows gives the width.

For a longer jumper, start with more stitches as foundation. To adjust the width, just work more or less rows on the main rectangle.

The sleeves are worked by continuing the main rectangle. You can adjust the width of the sleeve, by starting with less stitches. The length of the sleeve can be adjusted by working more or less rows.

Final Measurements

This pattern is available in 8 sizes, from XS up to 4XL. The final measurements of the jumper are listed below.



Neck line a: 22 cm (22, 22, 24, 24, 26, 26, 26)

Width b: 50 cm (54, 58, 66, 70, 74, 78, 86)

Sleeve length c: 40 cm (40, 44, 44, 48, 48, 48, 48)

Sleeve width d: 19 cm (20, 22, 23, 24, 25, 27, 28)

Length e: 50 cm (51, 52, 52, 53, 53, 54, 54)

Pattern Notes

Ch 3 at the beginning of the row counts as first dc.

Every mesh stitch row will start with ch 4 and skip the 1st st.

Numbers for sizes S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL and 4XL are written between brackets. If not the instructions apply for all sizes

Instructions

Front Panel

Start| Ch 95 (97, 99, 99, 101, 101, 103, 103) sts

R1| Ch 3, 1 dc in the 5th st from the hook, 1 dc in next sts to the end of the row, ch 3 and turn

R2| 1 dc in each st to the end of the row, ch 4 and turn

R3| skip 1st st, 1 dc in next, *ch 1, skip next st, 1 dc in next* Repeat to the end of the row, ch 4 and turn

R4| skip 1st ch sp, 1 dc in next dc, *ch 1, skip the ch sp, 1 dc in next dc* Repeat to the end of the row, ch 3 and turn

R5 – R6| Repeat R2

Repeat R3 – R6 until you will have in total 50 (54, 58, 66, 70, 74, 78, 86) rows.

Sleeve

For the first sleeve, you will continue working from where your yarn is, continuing the main rectangle.

You can use a stitch marker to mark the sts for the sleeve:

XS - 37 sts

S - 39 sts

M - 43 sts

L - 45 sts

XL - 45 sts

2XL - 47 sts

3XL - 51 sts

4XL - 53 sts

The first row for the sleeve has to be a mesh stitch row.

R1| ch 4, skip next st, 1 dc in next, *ch 1, skip the next st, 1 dc in next* Repeat to the end of the row (the last st you marked for sleeve width), ch 4 and turn

R2| skip 1st ch sp, 1 dc in next dc, *ch 1, skip the ch sp, 1 dc in next dc* Repeat to the end of the row, ch 3 and turn.

R3| 1 dc in each st to the end of the row, ch 3 and turn.

R4| Repeat R3.



Repeat R1 – R4 until you will have in total 40 (40, 44, 44, 48, 48, 48, 48, 48) rows or until you get to the desired length.

For the second sleeve, mark the same number of sts on the other side. Join the yarn and repeat the same pattern as for the 1st sleeve.

Back Panel

Repeat the same pattern as for the front panel.

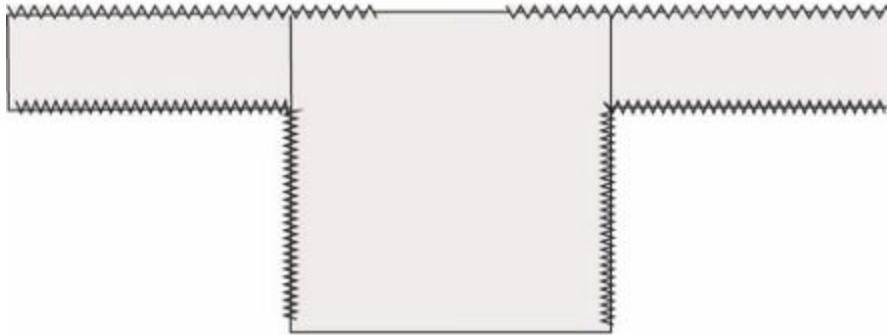
Assembling

Place both panels, one over the other.

Before assembling use 2 stitch markers to mark the neckline. Count total number of rows from cuff to cuff (or you can use as reference just the main rectangle)

You will have for the neckline 22 (22, 22, 24, 24, 26, 26, 26) rows.

Next sew the top part of the sleeves and shoulder. Then sew the inside part of the sleeves and the sides of the jumper, like in the diagram below:



Edging

Ch 3 at the beginning of the round counts as first dc

The edge is worked in circular rounds, at the bottom of the sweater, cuffs and neckline.

Start| working on the right side, join the yarn in one stitch.

R1| ch 3, 1 dc in each st around

R2| ch 3, *1 FPdc in next st, 1 BPdc in next st* Repeat to the end of the round.

R3 – R5| Repeat R2.

Fasten off.

Repeat the pattern for all sections.

To finish

Weave in all ends and block to measurements.
