Hooded Jacket - Women & Plus size



Knitted in Go handmade's Cosy - a wonderfully soft and high quality cotton mix that keeps the shape: 60% Cotton/40% Acrylic, 50 g/100 m.

YARN USAGE

XS:	800 g
S:	850 g
M:	950 g
L:	1050 g
XL:	1100 g
XXL:	1200 g
XXXL:	1300 g

Duffle Buttons
Circular knitting needle:
3,5 mm
Gauge: 21 sts/10 cm

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Folded on the front of the hood



Hood - stitches picked up from the neckline

YARN USAGE

XS:	800 g
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MATERIAL

Duffle Buttons

Circular knitting needle: 3,5 mm

Gauge: 21 sts/10 cm

Specified yarn quantities are indicative.

FINAL MEASUREMENTS

Circumference **84 (88) 98 (108) 116 (126) 136** cm.

Length **57 (61) 65 (65) 65 (68) 70** cm.

Sleeve length **42 (43) 44 (46) 48 (48) 48** cm.

NOTE: Gauge

- it is **VERY** important
for the jacket's finished result
to respect the gauge.

If worked too loose, the shape will not be maintained, which is why it is important to pay attention to the firmness of the stitches at all times, not just at the start.

ABBREVIATIONS AND DEFINITIONS

st(s)	Stitch(es)
N	Needle(s)
r	Row
Button hole	Bind off 3 sts. In the following row, cast on 3 new sts.
(..)	Indicates number of sts per r for the 7 sizes. XS (S) M (L) XL (XXL) XXXL

Cosy's thread is perfect for knitted cardigans and sweaters. The thread is quite lightspun, soft and with a very special elasticity, which preserves the knit beautiful. The nature of the fiber gives a special fluffyness, which is ideal for knitting beautiful sweaters.

The Cosy yarn is a bit vintage in its expression – warm, strong and even breathable.

Cosy has been awarded the AZO certificate and is thus a yarn that everyone can feel safe wearing.

HOODED JACKET

XS (S) M (L) XL (XXL) XXXL

The hoodie is knitted from the right sleeve to the left sleeve in garter stitch.

1. Cast **52 (52) 58 (58) 58 (64) 64** sts on 3,5 mm N and knit in garter stitch.
Increase 1 st on each side every 2. cm
- **20 (20) 21 (21) 21 (23) 23** times
= **92 (92) 100 (100) 100 (110) 110** sts.
2. When the piece measures
42 (43) 44 (46) 48 (48) 48 cm,
cast on **74 (82) 87 (87) 88 (88) 92** sts each side
= **240 (256) 274 (274) 276 (286) 294** sts.
3. Knit until height of
12 (12) 14 (16) 17,5 (19,5) 22 cm is reached.
Divide piece for front and back
- **120 (128) 137 (137) 138 (143) 147** sts on each part.

UK

BACK

4. Decrease 1 st at the neck and knit until the work measures **30 (32) 35 (38) 40,5 (43,5) 46** cm from the cast on, increase 1 st and put part on hold.

RIGHT FRONT PIECE

5. Decrease 1 st at the neck side
16 (16) 16 (16) 16 (17) 17 times
= **104 (112) 121 (121) 122 (126) 130** sts.
Knit until work measures
21 (22) 24,5 (27) 29 (31,5) 34 cm from the cast on,

insert **8 (8) 8 (8) 9 (9) 10** evenly distributed button holes - or desired number of button holes.

Knit until height of **23 (24) 26,5 (29) 31 (33,5) 36** cm and bind off.

LEFT FRONT PIECE

The left front piece is knitted separately until it is the same size as the right front piece. Then it is knitted together with the back's sts.

6. Cast on **104 (112) 121 (121) 122 (126) 130** sts and knit like the right front piece, but increase 1 st x **16 (16) 16 (16) 16 (17) 17** times at the neck side instead of decreasing
= **120 (128) 137 (137) 138 (143) 147** sts.
7. When the left front piece mirrors the right front piece, knit the parts together with the back's sts
= **240 (256) 274 (274) 276 (286) 294** sts.
8. When piece measures
12 (12) 14 (16) 17,5 (19,5) 22 cm after knitting parts together, bind off at the beginning of the next 2 rows: **74 (82) 87 (87) 88 (88) 92** sts for a total of **92 (92) 100 (100) 100 (110) 110** sts.
9. Now work on sleeve: knit **2 (3) 2 (4) 2 (2) 2** cm, then dec 1 st on each side (*start decrease at the same place as the other sleeve*).
Repeat decreases every 2. cm,
to a total of **20 (20) 21 (21) 21 (23) 23** times
= **52 (52) 58 (58) 58 (64) 64** sts and both sleeves are the same length.
Bind off.

HOOD

- 10.** Cast on 10 sts, then pick up **88 (92) 98 (102) 104 (110) 110** sts from the neckline, through the outer loops.
Start at the right front piece after the first 10 sts and finish 10 sts before the end of the left side part, then cast on 10 sts
= **108 (112) 118 (122) 124 (130) 130** sts.


Knit until the piece measures 8 cm, then increase by 15 sts evenly distributed within the central **88 (92) 98 (102) 104 (110) 110** sts (10 sts on each side are folded)
= **123 (127) 133 (137) 139 (145) 145** sts.

When the work measures 13 cm, increase by 15 sts evenly distributed within the central **103 (107) 113 (117) 119 (125) 125** sts (10 sts on each side are folded)
= **138 (142) 148 (152) 154 (160) 160** sts.

When the work measures **26 (27) 28 (29) 30 (31) 32** cm, divide the work as to have two pieces of **69 (71) 74 (76) 77 (80) 80** sts each.
Knit pieces together, binding off at the same time.
Fold the 10 sts on both sides and sew them to the hood.

ASSEMBLY

*Sew sides and sleeves together.
Weave in ends and sew on buttons.*



Good to know

Needle Size & Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us.

The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles.



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
