

## Summerday Shawl

No. 1001-202-4248

## Materials:

Twister Solid col. 113
Crochet hook, 4 mm
Yarn usage, about: 215g (3 skeins)
Buy yarn and accessories here:
http://shop.hobbii.com/summerday-shawl

Measurements: About $150 \times 74 \mathrm{~cm}$ without fringe

## Gauge:

About 22 sts $\times 11$ rows $=10 \times 10 \mathrm{~cm}$

## Abbreviations:

st(s): stitch(es)
ch: chain stitch
dc: double crochet
sc: single crochet
sl st: slip stitch


NB: the work is turned with ch 4 each row, which takes the place of 1 dc. Last st of a row is worked in the 4th ch from beginning of last row.

Pattern instructions - Guide with pictures can be found below

1. Ch 4. Work 2 dc in the 4 th ch from the hook. (3)
2. Turn and ch 4 . Work 2 dc in the first st. Ch 1 , skip 1 st and make 3 dc in the last st. (7)
3. Turn and ch 4 . Work 2 dc in the first st. *Ch 1 , skip 1 st, and dc in the next st*. Repeat between ** once more. Ch 1, skip 1 st and make 3 dc in the last st. (11)
4. Turn and ch 4 . Work 2 dc in the first st. *Ch 1 , skip 1 st, and dc in the next st*. Repeat between ** 3 times more. Ch 1, skip 1 st and make 3 dc in the last st. (15)
5. Turn and ch 4 . Work 2 dc in the first st. *Ch 1 , skip 1 st, and dc in the next st*. Repeat between ** 5 times more. Ch 1, skip 1 st and make 3 dc in the last st. (19)
6. Turn and ch 4 . Work 2 dc in the first st. *Ch 1 , skip 1 st, and dc in the next st*.

Repeat between ${ }^{* *} 7$ times more. Ch 1, skip 1 st and make 3 dc in the last st. (23)

## Repeat this method until you have 82 rows in total

## Ahobbiil

Now, an edge is worked all around the shawl.
Turn and ch 1. Make 3 sc in the first st. Continue with 1 sc in every st (including ch's) until end of the top edge of the shawl. Make 3 sc in the last $\mathrm{st}=$ corner.

Now make 1 sc in every st along the first side. When you reach the "tip", make 3 sc in that st. Continue with 1 sc in every st along the other side. Join with a sl st into the first st. Cut the yarn and weave in ends.

## Fringe

Cut a good bunch of 25 cm long pieces of yarn. You need a lot.
Make the fringe as pictured below.


1. Cut a good bunch of 25 cm long pieces of yarn. You need a lot.

2. Fold the piece of yarn in half. Thread the hook through the first sc of the edging along the side of the shawl.

3. The fringe pieces are fastened 1 by 1 to the sc's of the edge along the sides of the shawl in the following manner. You can use a smaller hook size to ease the work.

4. Pull the yarn through the st to make a loop.

5. Pull the ends through the loop.

6. To make the fringe dense, follow the pattern of "add 2 strands of yarn to the first st, 1 strand in the next". So, repeat the method to add another strand to the st. Thread the hook through the st and fold a strand of yarn in half

7. And tighten lightly.

8. Pull the yarn through to make a loop.

9. Tighten lightly.

10. Repeat this fringing method in the next st of the edge. There are now 2 strands in the first st and 1 strand in the next.

11. Continue this all around the two sides of the shawl.

12. Continue in the pattern: " 2 strands in the next st, 1 strand in the one after that".

13. To finish off the fringe, trim them to your desired length to even them out. Here, they are about 10 cm long.

1. Ch 4.

2. Make 2 dc in the 4th ch from the hook.
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3. Like so. (3)

## Row 2



1. Turn and ch 4.

2. Like so.

3. Make 2 dc in the first st.

4. Ch 1 , skip 1 st and make 3 dc in the last st.

5. Like so. (7)

## Row 3



1. Turn and ch 4.

2. Like so.

3. Make 2 dc in the first st.

4. *Ch 1, skip 1 st, and dc in the next st*.

1. Turn and ch 4.

2. Like so.

5. *Ch 1, skip 1 st, and dc in the next st*.

6. *Ch 1, skip 1 st, and dc in the next st*.

7. Like so.

8. Like so.

9. Like so.

10. *Ch 1 , skip 1 st, and dc in the next st*.

11. *Ch 1 , skip 1 st, and dc in the next st*.

12. Ch 1 , skip 1 st and make 3 dc in the last st.

## Row 5



1. Turn and ch 4.

2. Like so.

3. Make 2 dc in the first st.

4. *Ch 1, skip 1 st, and dc in the next st*.

5. Like so.

6. Ch 1 , skip 1 st and make 3 dc in the last
7. Repeat this method until you have 82 rows in total.

8. Repeat between ** 5 times more.

9. Like so. (19)
st.

## Row 6 to 82



Sc edging kant


1. Now, an edge is worked all around the shawl.

Turn and ch 1. Make 3 sc in the first st. Continue with 1 sc in every st (including ch's) until the end of the top edge of the shawl.

3. Now make 1 sc in every st along the first side. When you reach the "tip", make 3 sc in that st.

2. Make 3 sc in the last st = corner.

4. Continue with 1 sc in every st along the other side. Join with a sl st into the first st. Cut the yarn and weave in ends
