



## Universe Shawl

No. 1001-204-7210

**Materials:**

- Crochet hook 3.5 mm
- Hobbii Universe color 32

**Yarn usage:** Approx. 200 g (2 skeins)

**Buy the yarn and supplies here:**

**Measurements:** Approx. 150 x 64 cm.

**Gauge:**

14 rws x 6 "pattern arches" = 10 x 10 cm  
(1 pattern arch consists of ch 3, 1 dc, ch 1, 1 dc  
and 1 sl st)

**Abbreviations:**

**St(s):** Stitch(es)

**Ch:** Chain

**Sl st:** Slip slip stitch

**Dc:** Double crochet

**Pattern:**

The shawl is crocheted in an open corner to corner “C2C” pattern. The technique is the same as for a regular “C2C”, the only difference is that 1 dc is replaced by a ch 1.

You will be working 89 rows plus a finishing row, which will have a straighter edge.

**Pattern tutorial:** The tutorial depicts another yarn, but the procedure is the same.

**Row 1:**



1. Ch 6 to begin.



2. Work 1 dc in the 4th ch from the hook.



3. This is how it will look.



4. Ch 1, skip 1 ch and work 1 dc in the last ch.



5. This is how it will look. Now you have a small “square” consisting of “2 dc, ch 1 and 1 dc.” (The first dc has been replaced by chains) An open “C2C” pattern is actually just made up of many of these “squares”.

**Row 2:**



1. Ch 6 and turn.



2. Work 1 dc in the 4th chain from the hook.



3. Ch 1 and work 1 dc in the last ch. You have now made another square.



4. Now you are going to attach this “square” to the first one by making a sl st in the left side of the first square.



5. This is how it will look.



6. Ch 3.



7. Work "1 dc, ch 1 and 1 dc" down into the chain arch where you just made a sl st.



8. You have now made another "square". And you have now 2 "squares" on row 2.

### Row 3:



1. Ch 6 and turn.



2. Work 1 dc in the 4th ch from the hook.



3. Ch 1 and work 1 dc in the last ch.



4. Work 1 sl st into the square below. The needle shows where to work the sl st.



5. Ch 3.



6. Work "1 dc, ch 1 and 1 dc" down into the chain arch where you just made a sl st.



7. Work 1 sl st into the square below. The needle shows where to work the sl st.



8. Ch 3.



9. Work "1 dc, ch 1 and 1 dc" down into the chain arch where you just made a sl st. You have now 3 "squares" on row 3.

**Row 4:**



1. Ch 6 and turn.



2. Work 1 dc in the 4th ch from the hook. Ch 1 and work 1 dc in the last ch.



3. Work 1 sl st into the square below.



4. Ch 3 and work 1 dc, ch 1 and 1 dc down into the chain arch where you just made a sl st.



5. Work 1 sl st into the square below.



6. Ch 3 and work 1 dc, ch 1 and 1 dc down into the chain arch where you just made a sl st.



7. Work 1 sl st into the square below.



8. Ch 3 and work 1 dc, ch 1 and 1 dc down into the chain arch where you just made a sl st.



Repeat the rows until you have a total of 89 rows, or until the desired size.

### Finishing row - Row 90:



1. Ch 1 and turn.



2. Work 1 sc in the 2 dc.



3. Now you will be working between the squares of the previous 2 rows. The needle shows where you will be working.



4. Work 3 dc.



5. Skip 2 dc and work 1 sc in the chain arch.



6. This is how it will look. Work 3 dc between the "squares" of the previous 2 rows. The needle shows where you will be working.



7. This is how it will look.



8. Skip 2 dc and work 1 sc in the chain arch.



9. This is how it will look.



10. Repeat to the end of the row.



11. Finish with sc in the last dcs. Cut the yarn and weave in ends.
