MATERIALS

2 (2) 3 Amigo XL color Sunflower (A36)
1 (1) 1 Amigo XL color Curry (A38)
2 (2) 3 Amigo XL color Light Pink (A57)
2 (2) 3 Amigo XL color Cornflower (A17)
2 (2) 3 Amigo XL color Black (A12)
1 (1) 1 Amigo XL color Mint (A29)
2 (2) 2 Amigo XL color Bright Red (A43)
2 (2) 2 Amigo XL color Light Peach (A46)

Crochet hook 5 mm (US H/8)

3 Bling Bling Buttons - 15 mm

YARN QUALITY

Amigo XL, Hobbii

100 % Acrylic, 50 g / 1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

GAUGE

10 x 10 cm / 4" x 4" = 14 sts x 10 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

sc = single crochet

bubble st = bubble stitch

sl st(s) = slip stitch(es)

ch = chain

tog = together (is used when crocheting stitches together to make one)

dc = double crochet

SIZES

S (M) L

MEASUREMENTS

Length: 45 (45) 50 cm / 18" (18") 20"

Width: 40 (45) 50 cm / 16" (18") 20"

NOTE! True to size! Please note that the crocheting makes the sweater very stretchy. Therefore, choose the size that normally fits you best.

PATTERN INFORMATION

Heart on crop sweater is a delicious, warm, and voluminous Christmas sweater with a playful look. The sweater is designed with a cropped fit, high neck, and large, voluminous puff sleeves. It's crocheted in beautiful, bright colors that sparkle like a Christmas tree, and it's decorated with red Christmas hearts that bubble out and give the otherwise smooth surface a beautiful texture.



Pattern instructions



INFO AND TIPS



Heart chart:

The chart shows how to crochet a heart. A heart consists of sc and bubble sts and is worked in color Bright Red (A43) indicated with red on the chart, while the other color is indicated with blue. You start from the tip of the heart and follow the chart upwards. When crocheting a heart, carry the other color thread along the back of your work behind the stitches, so that you crochet over it. Throughout the pattern, reference will be made to the chart (see chart) each time you are going to crochet another heart. I.e., it is not specified in the actual pattern instructions how to make it. The chart is explained only in the first color section (stripes with Sunflower (A36) and Black (A12)).

Bubble st:

Yarn over, you now have two loops on your hook. Pass the hook through the stitch. Then pull the yarn back through the stitch, you now have three loops on your hook, and then pull the yarn through the first two loops, you now have two loops on your hook. With two loops on your hook, yarn over and pull the thread back through the same stitch and then through the first two of the four loops, you now have three loops on your hook. Repeat this process until you have five loops on your hook. Finally, pull the yarn through all five loops to create a bubble st. A bubble st is worked from the wrong side i.e., the right side is where the bubbles and thus the hearts will puff out.

Repetitions are indicated with (brackets) followed by number of times.

Ch 1 to turn at the end of each row, unless otherwise indicated.

BODY

The body consists of a front panel and a back panel, both crocheted in color sections separated by Black (A12).

FRONT PANEL

Sunflower (A36)

Ch 54 (60) 68 + 1, which is a turning chain.

Section 1: Sunflower (A36) & Black (A12)

Sunflower (A36)

Row 1: 1 sc in each st (54 (60) 68 sts).

Row 2: 11 (14) 18 sc, attach *Bright Red (A43)* and make 1 bubble st (see chart), switch back to *Sunflower (A36)* and work 42 (45) 49 sc.

Black (A12)

Row 3: 41 (44) 48 sc, switch to *Bright Red (A43)* and work 3 sc, switch back to *Black (A12)* and work 10 (13) 17 sc.

Row 4: 9 (12) 16 sc, switch to *Bright Red (A43)* and work 1 bubble st, 1 sc, 1 bubble st, 1 sc, 1 bubble st, switch back to *Black (A12)* and work 40 (43) 47 sc.

Sunflower (A36)

Row 5: 39 (42) 46 sc, *Bright Red (A43)* (see chart), 8 (11) 15 sc.

Row 6: 7 (10) 14 sc, *Bright Red (A43)* (see chart), 38 (41) 45 sc.

Black (A12)

Row 7: 38 (41) 45 sc, *Bright Red (A43)* (see chart), 7 (10) 14 sc.

Row 8: 6 (9) 13 sc, *Bright Red (A43)* (see chart), 37 (40) 44 sc.

Sunflower (A36)

Row 9: 37 (40) 44 sc, *Bright Red (A43)* (see chart), 6 (9) 13 sc.

Row 10: 7 (10) 14 sc, *Bright Red (A43)* (see chart), 38 (41) 44 sc.

Black (A12)

Rows 11-12: 1 sc in each st.

Section 2: Cornflower (A17)

Row 1: 1 sc in each st (54 (60) 68 sts).

Row 2: 31 sc, *Bright Red (A43)* (see chart), sc in each of the remaining sts.

Rows 3-10: See chart.

Row 11: 1 sc in each st.

For size L: add one more row working 1 sc in each st.

Black (A12)

Work 1 row with 1 sc in each st

Section 3: Light Pink (A57)

Row 1: 1 sc in each st (54 (60) 68 sts).

Row 2: 14 sc, (first heart) *Bright Red (A43)* (see chart), 24 (30) 36 sc (second heart) *Bright Red (A43)* (see chart) sc in each of the remaining sts.

Rows 3-10: See chart.

Row 11: 1 sc in each st.

For size L: add one more row working 1 sc in each st.

Black (A12)

Work 1 row with 1 sc in each st

Section 4: Light Peach (A46)

Row 1: 1 sc in each st (54 (60) 68 sts).

Row 2: 10 sl sts, 18 (21) 25 sc, *Bright Red (A43)* (see chart), 15 (18) 22 sc, turn (34 (40) 48 sts).

NOTE: You have now decreased for armhole.

Rows 3-10: See chart.

Row 11: 1 sc in each st.

For size L: add one more row working 1 sc in each st.

Black (A12)

Work 1 row with 1 sc in each st

Section 5: Mint (A29)

Rows 1-11: 1 sc in each st (34 (40) 48 sts)

Black (A12)

Work 1 row with 1 sc in each st

For size L: add one more row working 1 sc in each st.

Section 6: Curry (A38)

Rows 1-4: 1 sc in each st (34 (40) 48 sts)

For size L: add 2 more rows working 1 sc in each st.

Row 5: 7 (10) 14 sc, turn (7 (10) 14 sts). NOTE: This is one of the shoulders.

Rows 6-8: 1 sc in each st.

Break off the yarn and crochet the opposite shoulder in the same way, 4 rows x 7 (10) 14 sc.

BACK PANEL

Sunflower (A36)

Ch 58 (64) 72 + 1, which is a turning chain.

Section 1: *Sunflower (A36) & Black (A12)*

Sunflower (A36)

Rows 1-2: 1 sc in each st (58 (64) 72 sts).

Black (A12)

Rows 3-4: 1 sc in each st.

Sunflower (A36)

Rows 5-6: 1 sc in each st.

Black (A12)

Rows 7-8: 1 sc in each st.

Sunflower (A36)

Rows 9-10: 1 sc in each st.

Black (A12)

Rows 11-12: 1 sc in each st.

Section 2: *Cornflower (A17)*

Rows 1-11: 1 sc in each st (58 (64) 72 sts).

For size L: add 1 more row working 1 sc in each st.

Black (A12)

Work 1 row with 1 sc in each st

Section 3: *Light Pink (A57)*

Rows 1-11: 1 sc in each st (58 (64) 72 sts).

For size L: add 1 more row working 1 sc in each st.

Black (A12)

Work 1 row with 1 sc in each st

Section 4: *Light Peach (A46)*

Row 1: 1 sc in each st (58 (64) 72 sts).

Row 2: 12 sl sts, 40 sc, turn (34 (40) 48 sts). NOTE: You have now decreased for armhole.

Rows 3-11: 1 sc in each st.

For size L: add 1 more row working 1 sc in each st.

Black (A12)

Work 1 row with 1 sc in each st

Section 5: *Mint (A29)*

Rows 1-11: 1 sc in each st (34 (40) 48 sts)

For size L: add 1 more row working 1 sc in each st.

Black (A12)

Work 1 row with 1 sc in each st

Section 6: Curry (A38)

Rows 1-6: 1 sc in each st (34 (40) 48 sts)

For size L: add 2 more rows working 1 sc in each st.

Row 7: 7 (10) 14 sc, turn (7 (10) 14 sts). NOTE: This is one of the shoulders.

Row 8: 1 sc in each st.

Break off the yarn and crochet the opposite shoulder in the same way, 2 rows x 7 (10) 14 sc.

Assembling of front and back panels: Place front panel and back panel with right sides facing each other. Crochet together at the right and left shoulder seam, respectively, with a row of 7 (10) 14 sc.

SLEEVES

The sleeves are crocheted directly onto the body along the armholes up along the shoulders and down on the opposite side.

Section 1: Sunflower (A36) & Black (A12)**Left sleeve (when wearing the sweater):**

Begin in the outermost stitch of the armhole on the front panel working from the right side.

Black (A12)

Row 1: Work 10 sc inward along the armhole of the front panel, 1 sc down into the corner, 31(31) 35 sc up along the front panel, 1 sc in the middle of the shoulder seam, 31(31) 35 sc down along the back panel, 1 down into the corner, 12 sc outward along the armhole of the back panel, turn (87 (87) 95 sts).

Row 2: 1 sc in each st.

Sunflower (A36)

Rows 3-4: 1 sc in each st (87 (87) 95 sts).

Black (A12)

Rows 5-6: 1 sc in each st.

Sunflower (A36)

Rows 7-8: 1 sc in each st.

Black (A12)

Rows 9-10: 1 sc in each st.

Sunflower (A36)

Rows 11-12: 1 sc in each st.

Black (A12)

Rows 13-14: 1 sc in each st.

Section 2: Cornflower (A17)

Rows 1-11: 1 sc in each st (87 (87) 95 sts).

Black (A12)

Row 12: 1 sc in each st.

Section 3: Light Pink (A57)

Rows 1-11: 1 sc in each st (87 (87) 95 sts).

Black (A12)

Row 12: 1 sc in each st.

Section 4: Light Peach (A46)

Rows 1-9: 1 sc in each st (87 (87) 95 sts).

Sizes S and M:

Row 10: (1 sc, sc2tog) repeat 29 times (58 sts).

Row 11: (11 sc, sc2tog) repeat 19 times, 1 sc (39 sts).

Size L:

Row 10: 2 sc, (1 sc, sc2tog) repeat 30 times, 3 sc (65 sts).

Row 11: 2 sc (1 sc, sc2tog) repeat 21 times (44 sts).

Sleeve edging: Bright Red (A43)

Row 1: 1 sc in each st (39 (39) 44 sts).

Row 2: 1 sl st in each st.

Sizes S and M:

Row 3: (1 sc, 4 dc in one st, 1 sc) repeat 13 times. Fasten off.

Size L:

Row 3. 1 sc (1 sc, 4 dc in one st, 1 sc) repeat 14 times, 1 sc. Fasten off.

Now, join one side of the sweater together working from the wrong side (in any color of your choice) inward along the sleeve and down along the body with a sl st into each row.

Right sleeve (when wearing the sweater):

Begin in the outermost stitch of the armhole on the back panel working from the right side.

Row 1: Work 12 sc inward along the armhole of the back panel, 1 sc down into the corner, 31(31) 35) sc up along the back panel, 1 sc in the middle of the shoulder seam, 31(31) 35) sc down along the front panel, 1 down into the corner, 12 sc outward along the armhole of the front panel, turn (87 (87) 95 sts).

Work the remaining part of the sleeve in the same way as for the left sleeve and join the sweater together working from the wrong side with 1 sl st into each row.

NECKLINE

The neckline has a ribbed edging. When making the rib edge, work all stitches in the back loop only, unless otherwise indicated.

For all sizes.

Bright Red (A43)

Ch 15 + 1, which is a turning chain.

Rows 1-78: 1 sl st in each st.

Row 79: 1 sl st, (ch 1, 3 sl sts) repeat 3 times, 2 sl sts. You have now made 3 small buttonholes. Keep the thread for assembling of the neck rib.

ASSEMBLING OF THE NECKLINE:

Begin in the middle st on the back panel and crochet the neck rib onto the neck opening working from the wrong side and with VERY loose sc so that it will be possible to pull the sweater over the head. Work 1 sc in each st/row. Then join the bottom part of the neck opening together with 5 sl sts. And now, sew the three buttons on parallel to the buttonholes on the opposite side.

Rib edge for the waist:

The waist has a ribbed edging. When making the rib edge, work all stitches in the back loop only, unless otherwise indicated.

Bright Red (A43)

Ch 8 (8) 10 + 1, which is a turning chain.

Work 112 (124) 140 rows with 1 sl st in each st.

Assembling of the rib edge for the waist:

Begin in any of the side seams and crochet the rib edge onto the waist of the body working from the wrong side and with loose sc. Work 1 sc in each st/row. Then crochet the rib edge together at the opposite side of the body with 8 (8) 10 sl sts. Fasten off and weave in all loose ends.
