MATERIALS

2 skeins of Friends Cotton 8/4, col Mustard (28)
1 skein of Friends Cotton 8/4, col Silver (118)
1 skein Friends Cotton 8/4, col White (01)

Crochet hook 2.5 mm
Scrap of black yarn
Filling

YARN QUALITY

 **Friends Cotton 8/4**, Hobbii
100% Cotton / 50 g = 160 m

ABBREVIATIONS

mr = magic ring
ch = chain
sc = single crochet
sl st = slip stitch
dc = double crochet
inc = increase – work 2 sts in the same st
dec = decrease – work 2 sts together
BO = bind off
(xx) = parenthesis at the end of round = total number of sts after this round

TIPS AND INFO

Make sure you work all your stitches firmly so as to not have any gaps between them.
All parts are worked in rounds without joining

HEAD

With Mustard

Round 1: 6 sc in mr
 Round 2: inc x 6 (12)
 Round 3: (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)
 Round 4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)
 Round 5: (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)
 Round 6: (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36)
 Round 7: (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42)
 Round 8: (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)
 Round 9: (7 sc, inc) x 6 (54)
 Round 10-18: 1 sc in each st (54)

Remember to stuff the head as you go along.

Round 19: (7 sc, dec) x 6 (48)
 Round 20: (6 sc, dec) x 6 (42)
 Round 21: (5 sc, dec) x 6 (36)
 Round 22: (4 sc, dec) x 6 (30)
 Round 23: (3 sc, dec) x 6 (24)
 Round 24: (2 sc, dec) x 6 (18)
 Round 25: (1 sc, dec) x 6 (12)
 Round 26: (1 sc, dec) x 3 (9)

Bind off and cut yarn, leaving a long tail for joining the last 9 sts.
Using a tapestry needle, pull yarn through the front loops of the remaining 9 sts and pull tight so they come together nicely. Fasten off.

BODY

Make 2. With Mustard

Round 1: 6 sc in mr
 Round 2: inc x 6 (12)
 Round 3: (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)
 Round 4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)

Round 5: (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)
Round 6: (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36)
Round 7: (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42)
Round 8: (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)
Round 9: (7 sc, inc) x 6 (54)
Round 10: (8 sc, inc) x 6 (60)
Round 11: (9 sc, inc) x 6 (66)
Round 12: (10 sc, inc) x 6 (72)
Round 13: (11 sc, inc) x 6 (78)
Round 14: (12 sc, inc) x 6 (84)
Round 15: (13 sc, inc) x 6 (90)
Round 16: (14 sc, inc) x 6 (96)
Round 17: (15 sc, inc) x 6 (102)

Next round you will work decreases parallel on two sides to make the body a little more oblong
Round 18: 15 sc, dec x 2, 14 sc, inc, 16 sc, inc, 15 sc, dec x 2, 14 sc, inc, 16 sc, inc (102)

Round 19: 32 sc, inc, 17 sc, inc, 32 sc, inc, 17 sc, inc (106)
Round 20: 33 sc, inc, 18 sc, inc, 33 sc, inc, 18 sc, inc (110)
Round 21: 34 sc, inc, 19 sc, inc, 34 sc, inc, 19 sc, inc, (114)
Round 22: 35 sc, inc, 20 sc, inc, 35 sc, inc, 20 sc, inc (118)
Round 23: 36 sc, inc, 21 sc, inc, 36 sc, inc, 21 sc, inc (122)
Round 24: 37 sc, inc, 22 sc, inc, 37 sc, inc, 22 sc, inc (126)

BO

Stretch the body into shape, otherwise it tends to pull together, you want it to be slightly oblong. After working two pieces, place them with right sides facing and sew or crochet them together, leaving the top part open. You want to keep a hole at the point where the head will be in order to be able to turn it inside out before attaching the head.

LEGS

Make 4. Start with Silver

Round 1: 6 sc in mr
Round 2: inc x 6 (12)
Round 3: (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)
Round 4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)
Round 5-7: 1 sc in each st (24)
Round 8: (2 sc, dec) x 6 (18)
Round 9: 1 sc in each st (18)
Round.10: (4 sc, dec) x 3 (15)
Round 11: 1 sc in each st (15)

Change color to Mustard.
Stuff the paw with filling.
Round 12-27: 1 sc in each st (15)

BO leaving a long tail for joining later.

MUZZLE

With White

Round 1: 6 sc in mr
Round 2: inc x 6 (12)
Round 3: (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)

Round 4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)
 Round 5-6: 1 sc in each st (24)

BO leaving a long tail for joining later.

EARS

Make two with Mustard

Round 1: 6 sc in mr
 Round 2: inc x 6 (12)
 Round 3: (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)
 Round 4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)
 Round 5-7: 1 sc in each st (24)
 Round 8: (2 sc, dec) x 6 (18)
 Round 9: 1 sc in each st, 1 sl st

BO leaving a long tail for joining later.

MANE

With Silver

Row 1: Ch 55
 Row 2: starting in the 2. St from the hook, 2 dc in each st, ch 1, turn.
 Row 3: Now you will work a jagged edge along the row of dc: *(1 sc, ch 2, 1 sc) in the same stitch, skip next dc* repeat *-* until end of row.
 BO leaving a long tail for joining later.

FINISHING

- Sew the mane together at the ends and attach to the middle of the head.
- Sew or crochet the legs onto all 4 corners of the body as shown in the picture, making sure the sts don't show when the lion is lying on his tummy.
- Attach the ears on rounds 6-14 counting from the crown, right behind the mane.
- Attach the muzzle on rounds 16-24. Use the Silver yarn to embroider a little nose on the muzzle.
- Embroider the eyes diagonally onto the head on rounds 14-16
- Sew the head onto the body on round 7 counting from the bottom of the head.
