1 skein of Purple (33) color A
2 skeins of Powder Pink (30) color B
2 skeins of Sage (22) color C
1 skein of Bordeaux (27) color D
2 skeins of Dark Teal (17) color E
1 skein of Koala (10) color F
1 skein of Light Petrol Blue (19) color G
4 skeins of Prussian Blue (16) color H
Crochet hook 6 mm (US 4)
Snap button
2 stitch markers

## YARN QUALITY

(66) Baby Snuggle Solid, Hobbii

100\% polyester
$100 \mathrm{~g}(3.5 \mathrm{oz})=120 \mathrm{~m}(131 \mathrm{yds})$

## GAUGE

1 granny square is $20 \mathrm{~cm} \times 20 \mathrm{~cm}\left(8^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{\prime \prime}\right)$

## SIZE

S (M/L)

## INFO AND TIPS

This soft, colorful coat consists of 34 squares, 2 triangles and a collar made at the end. Sizing: the model of the coat in the picture is size M/L. Depending on where you sew the snap, the coat may be wider or narrower.

For size S: make granny squares consisting of 4 rounds only. You can also easily make the coat and sleeves wider, or longer. Just make the extra rounds on the hems of the sleeves, or on the bottom hem of the coat to make them longer, or make extra rows where the sleeves and sides of the coat are sewn together to make it wider.
I used the following color combinations for the squares (the color order from the center): square $1 \times 2$ - F, C, D, B, G; square $2 \times 2$ - G, A, F, C, B; square $3 \times 2$ - E, C, C, B, D; square $4 \times$ 2 - E, E, G, B, F; square $5 \times 2$ - C, B, F, E, C; square $6 \times 2$ - B, D, A, C, G; square $7 \times 1$ - G, D, F, $\mathbf{C}, \mathbf{E}$; square $8 \times 2-\mathbf{B}, \mathbf{A}, \mathbf{C}, \mathbf{E}, \mathbf{E}$; square $9 \times 2-\mathbf{F}, \mathbf{E}, \mathbf{C}, \mathbf{A}, \mathbf{B}$; square $10 \times 2-\mathbf{A}, \mathbf{A}, \mathbf{B}, \mathbf{F}, \mathbf{C}$; square $11 \times 2-\mathbf{E}, \mathbf{F}, \mathbf{B}, \mathbf{G}, \mathbf{A}$; square $12 \times 1$ - $\mathbf{D}, \mathbf{B}, \mathbf{B}, \mathbf{G}, \mathbf{C}$; square $13 \times 2-\mathbf{F}, \mathbf{D}, \mathbf{B}, \mathbf{C}, \mathbf{E}$; square $14 \times 1$ - F, F, A, E, G; square $15 \times 2$ - D, A, F, B, C; square $16 \times 2$ - F, C, D, B, A; square $17 \times 2$ G, G, C, D, B; square $18 \times 1$ - G, D, C, B, E, square $19 \times 1$ - G, D, C, E, B; square $20 \times 1-\mathbf{F}, \mathbf{A}, \mathbf{A}$, E, G; triangle 1 - C, C, A, E, E; triangle 2 - E, E, D, C, C.

You can, of course, combine colors as you like, but keep in mind that I used a different number of skeins of each color in this pattern and that the color to finish the coat is Prussian Blue (16) and it is not used to make squares.

## BODY

## Granny square

The ch 4 at the beginning of each rnd counts as 1 dc and 1 ch sp between sts. Join all rnds with sl st to the 3rd ch of ch 4.
Try to weave the yarn tails on the fly, it will save you work at the end.
Make 34 granny squares in total.
Start with a MR.
Round 1: ch $4,{ }^{*} 3 \mathrm{dc}$, ch 1 * repeat from * to * 3 times, ch $1,2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{sl}$ st to the 3 rd ch of ch 4. Fasten off. $=12 \mathrm{dc}$ and 4 ch sps.
Round 2: change the color by attaching it with sl st in any ch sp. Ch 4, 3 dc in the same ch sp. *Ch 1, 3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp* repeat from * to * 2 more times. Ch 1, 2 dc in the first ch sp. Join and fasten off. $=24 \mathrm{dc}$ and 8 ch sps.

Round 3: change the color by attaching it with sl st in any ch sp. Ch 4, 3 dc in the same ch sp. *Ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in the same ch sp* repeat from * to * 2 more times. Ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch 1, 2 dc in the first ch sp. Join and fasten off. $=36 \mathrm{dc}$ and 12 ch sps.
Round 4: change the color by attaching it with sl st in any ch sp. Ch 4, 3 dc in the same ch sp. *Ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the same ch sp* repeat from * to * 2 more times. Ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch $1,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in the first ch sp. Join and fasten off. $=48 \mathrm{dc}$ and 16 ch sps.
If you are making a S size coat, your square is ready.
Round 5: change the color by attaching it with sl st in any ch sp. Ch 4, 3 dc in the same ch sp. *Ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in the same ch sp* repeat from * to * 2 more times. Ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch $1,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in the first ch sp. Join and fasten off. $=60 \mathrm{dc}$ and 20 ch sps . Fasten off.

## Granny triangle.

## Make 2.

Start with a MR, but do not close it too tightly.
Round 1: ch $4,3 \mathrm{dc}$, ch 1, 3 dc , ch 1, 1 dc , turn.
Round 2: change the color by attaching it with sl st in the first 1 ch sp . Ch $4,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in first ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in the same ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch 1, 1 dc in the first st, turn.
Round 3: change the color by attaching it with sl st in the first 1 ch sp . Ch $4,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the first ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch $\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{ch} 1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the next ch $\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{ch} 1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the same ch $\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{ch} 1$, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch 1, 1 dc in last st, turn.
Round 4: change the color by attaching it with sl st in the first 1 ch sp . Ch $4,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the first ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the next ch $\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{ch} 1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the same ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp , ch $1,1 \mathrm{dc}$ in last st, turn.
If you are making a $S$ size coat, your triangle is ready.
Round 5: change the color by attaching it with sl st in the first 1 ch sp . Ch $4,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the first ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in the next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in the same ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch sp, ch 1, 1 dc in last st. Fasten off.

Now, make 1 round of sc around each square and the triangles with Prussian Blue (16) color. Work sc, ch 1, sc on every corner of the square.

## BACK PIECE

NOTE: the whole coat is assembled in the same way and with the same color. Work it loosely!

With Prussian Blue (16), join 12 granny squares together as follows:
Fold 2 squares front side facing each other. Insert the hook into the corner and make a sl st, then insert the hook underneath the loop of the square facing you and the back loop of the other square (you connect the outer loops of both squares this way) and make a sl st, continue with all of the stitches, when you get to the end of the edge, take another 2 folded granny squares and join them with the sl st into the corner. Connect the squares vertically and horizontally in this way.

## FRONT PIECE LEFT

The triangles form the neckline.
Join a total of 7 squares and one triangle, so that you have two columns. On the outside column, 4 squares, next to the top outer square a triangle and the other 3 squares below it.

## FRONT PIECE RIGHT

Repeat as on the left piece, but in mirror image.

## SLEEVES

Make two.
Join 4 squares in the same way as the other parts of the coat.

## FINISHING

Joining parts of the coat.
Lay the back piece and one front piece right side together. Join only the outer squares, on the shoulders together in the same way like before. Repeat with the other side of the front piece.
Next, join the sleeve pieces so that one square is sewn to one square of the back piece and the other square is sewn to the square of the front piece.
Now join along the sleeves and sides of the coat.
Attach the yarn at the bottom hem on the right side of the coat, ch 1, *sc, sc, 2sctog* repeat from * to * to the end, fasten off.
Attach yarn to the hem of the sleeve, ch 1 and work as follow:
round $1-2$ sctog to the end, join the round with $s l$ st,
round $2-s c$ to the end, join the round with sl st, fasten off.
Repeat on the other sleeve.

## Collar

With the stitch markers, mark evenly 65 sts around the neckline. With the coat wrong side facing you, join the Prussian Blue (16) yarn to the first marked st.
Row 1: ch 2, dc to the back loop only to the end of the row, turn.
Row 2: ch 2, $1 \mathrm{hdc}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$, * $1 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{dtr}, 1 \mathrm{dtr}, 3 \mathrm{dr}$ tr in the same st, $1 \mathrm{dtr}, 1 \mathrm{dtr}, 1 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ in next 3 sts* repeat from * to * one more time. 1 dc , *1 tr, $1 \mathrm{dtr}, 1 \mathrm{dtr}, 3 \mathrm{tr}$ tr in the same st, $1 \mathrm{dtr}, 1$ $\mathrm{dtr}, 1 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ in next 3 sts* repeat from * to * one more time. 1 dc , * $1 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{dtr}, 1 \mathrm{dtr}, 3 \mathrm{tr} \mathrm{tr}$ in the same st, 1 dtr, $1 \mathrm{dtr}, 1 \mathrm{tr}$, 1 dc in next 3 sts. Repeat from * to * one more time, $1 \mathrm{dc}, 1$ hdc, 1 sc, turn.
Row 3: ch 2, dc in next 6 sts, ( $1 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 1,1 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in the middle tr tr from the previous row, dc in next 4 sts, $1 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sl}$ st in the dc from the previous row, 1 sc . Continue this way, forming the rounding with ( $1 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 1,1 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in the middle tr tr from the previous row, and an indentation with $1 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sl}$ st in the dc from the previous row, 1 sc , besides, work dc where the dc's are. There are 4 dc instead of 3 dc in two places, just make a dc in that st. Finnish with 1 sl st in the last st, turn.
Rows 4-5: ch 2, work dc where the dc's are, to form the rounding work ( $1 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 1,1 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in the 1 ch space from the previous row, and to form an indentation, slip the sc sts from the previous row and work 1 sl st to the sl st from the previous row.
Fasten off.
With the right side of the collar facing you, attach the Powder Pink (30) color to the side of the first row of the collar. Work all around the edge of the collar with sc, finish with sl st.
Sew the snap button in the place you like.
