MATERIALS

Amigo XL

24 skeins of color 37
2 skeins of color 21
1 skein of color 19
1 skein of color 20
1 skein of color 23

Crochet hook 5 mm (US H)
Tapestry needle
Scissors

YARN QUALITY

 **Amigo XL**, Hobbii
100 % Acrylic
50 g (1.8 oz) = 100 m (109 yds)

GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 12 sts x 10 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain
hdc = half double crochet
fhdc = foundation half double crochet
RS = right side
WS = wrong side

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 152 cm / 60"
Length: 127cm / 50"

A graphgan blanket with a geometric style Dachshund made by using simple half double crochets.

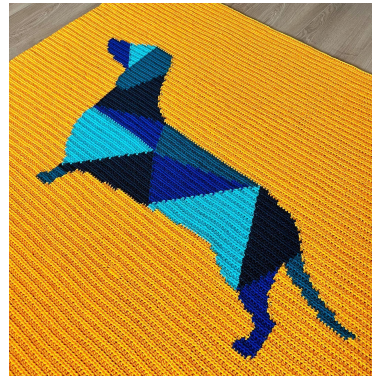
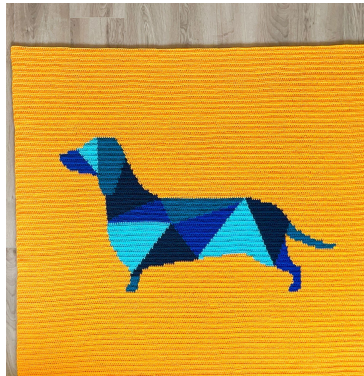
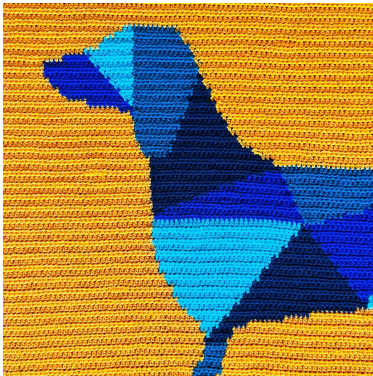

INFO AND TIPS

This blanket is made using chains, half double crochets and foundation half double crochets. To begin the blanket use yarn color 37 and make 180 foundation half double crochets (this is your first row). Then, chain 1 (this does not count as a stitch) and turn. For every following row, you will work 1 HDC into every stitch, when you reach the end of the row, ch 1 and turn. You will work the entire blanket this way changing colours as instructed by the chart or written pattern.

How to read the written pattern

Here is an example of one row from a written pattern:

Row 10 [WS]: C84, B6, C6, A17

Legend

A: Green

B: Blue

C: Red

Each letter in the row corresponds with a color of yarn shown in the legend above. The number after the letter tells you how many stitches you need to do in that color. Therefore, for the example row, you would be doing 84 stitches in Red, 6 stitches in Blue, 6 stitches in Red and 17 stitches in Green.

If you would prefer to use the color chart to make your blanket, 2 versions can be found at the end of the written pattern - a full-size chart and a zoomed-in version recommended for printing.

GUIDE: CHANGING COLORS



For the purpose of this tutorial, I will be using green and yellow yarn and the stitch I am using is a half double crochet. In the first photo, I have made it to my final stitch using green yarn and I am ready to change to yellow. For the final green stitch, **DO NOT** complete the stitch. Instead, yarn over, insert your hook and pull up a loop (you should have three loops on your hook). Now, bring your green working yarn to the front of your work and drop it. You will now complete your stitch by yarning over and pulling through all three loops with the yellow yarn. You can then continue crocheting with the yellow yarn. Make sure to leave the green yarn at the front where you dropped it.



On your return row, once you reach the green stitches, the yarn you dropped on the first row will now be at the back of your work for you to pick up and work with. To change color, do the same thing as before - in your final yellow stitch yarn over, insert your hook and pull up a loop (you should have three loops on your hook). Bring your yellow yarn to the front, drop it and pick up the green yarn from the back of your work to complete your stitch.



If you need to change color after the point where you've dropped your working yarn, you will need to crochet over the loose strand, carrying it with you until you reach the point where you need to change colors. When you reach this point, gently pull on the strand to ensure no loops are visible on the back of your work - do not pull too tightly as this will cause the fabric to bunch up. You can then complete the color change.



If you need to change color before you reach the point where you have dropped your working yarn, you can still carry it over to change color. When you yarn over with the new color there will be a loose strand of yarn (shown in photos 2 & 3), make sure this is not too loose or too tight - it should sit close to your stitches. You will need to crochet over this strand as you continue crocheting to hide it.



If you need to use the same color twice in a row, for example, if I was to change back to green at the point indicated by the red arrow, I would need to add a new green bobbin. This means that you don't have to carry the green yarn under the yellow stitches as this would be visible and your blocks of color would not be as neat.

Row 34 [WS]: A53, B6, A74, E6, A41

Row 35 [RS]: A41, E5, A75, B5, A54

Row 36 [WS]: A55, B4, A76, E4, A41

Row 37 [RS]: A41, E4, A75, B5, A55

Row 38 [WS]: A55, B5, A75, E4, A41

Row 39 [RS]: A41, E4, A75, C5, A55

Row 40 [WS]: A55, D1, C5, A72, E6, A41

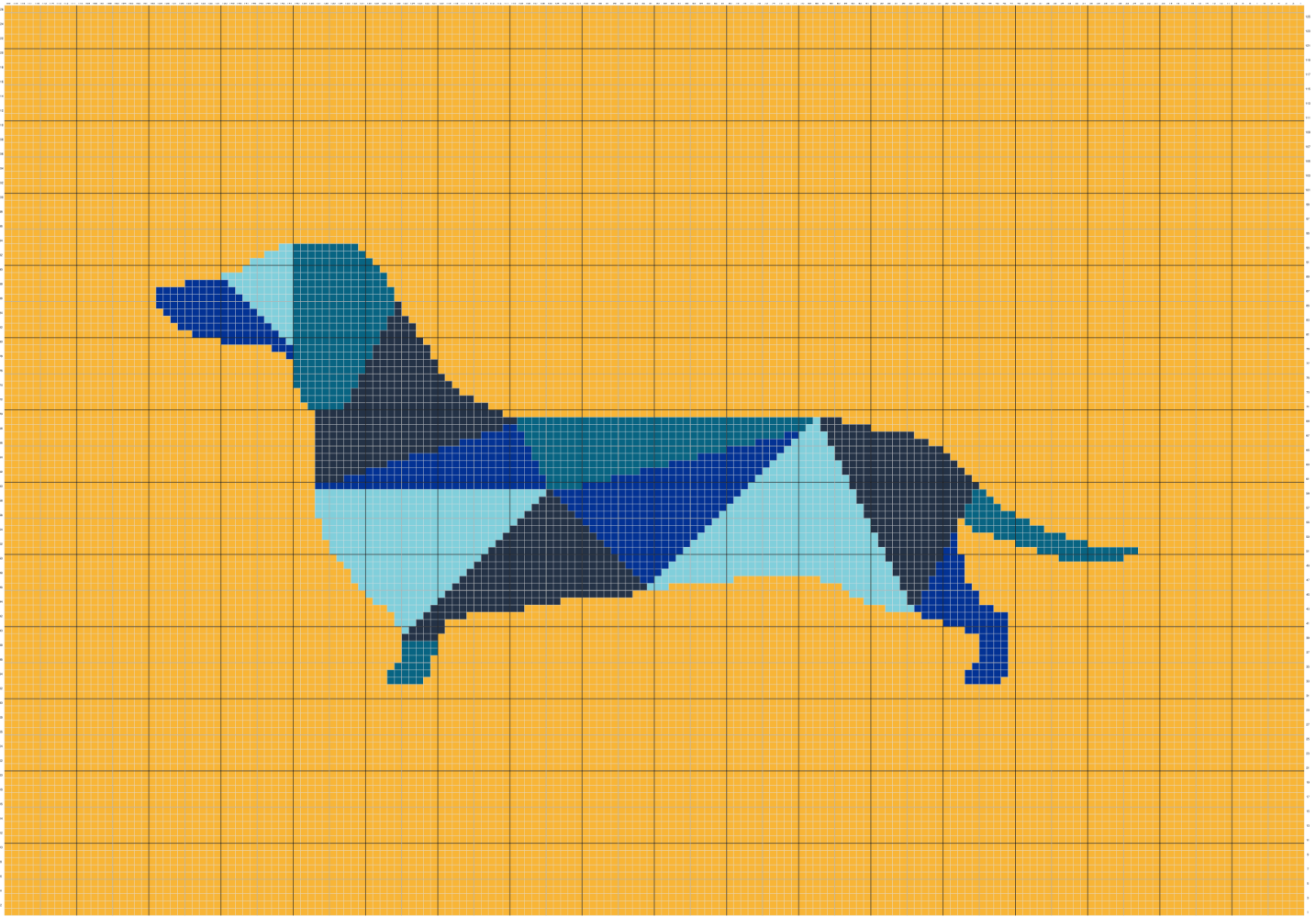

FINISHING

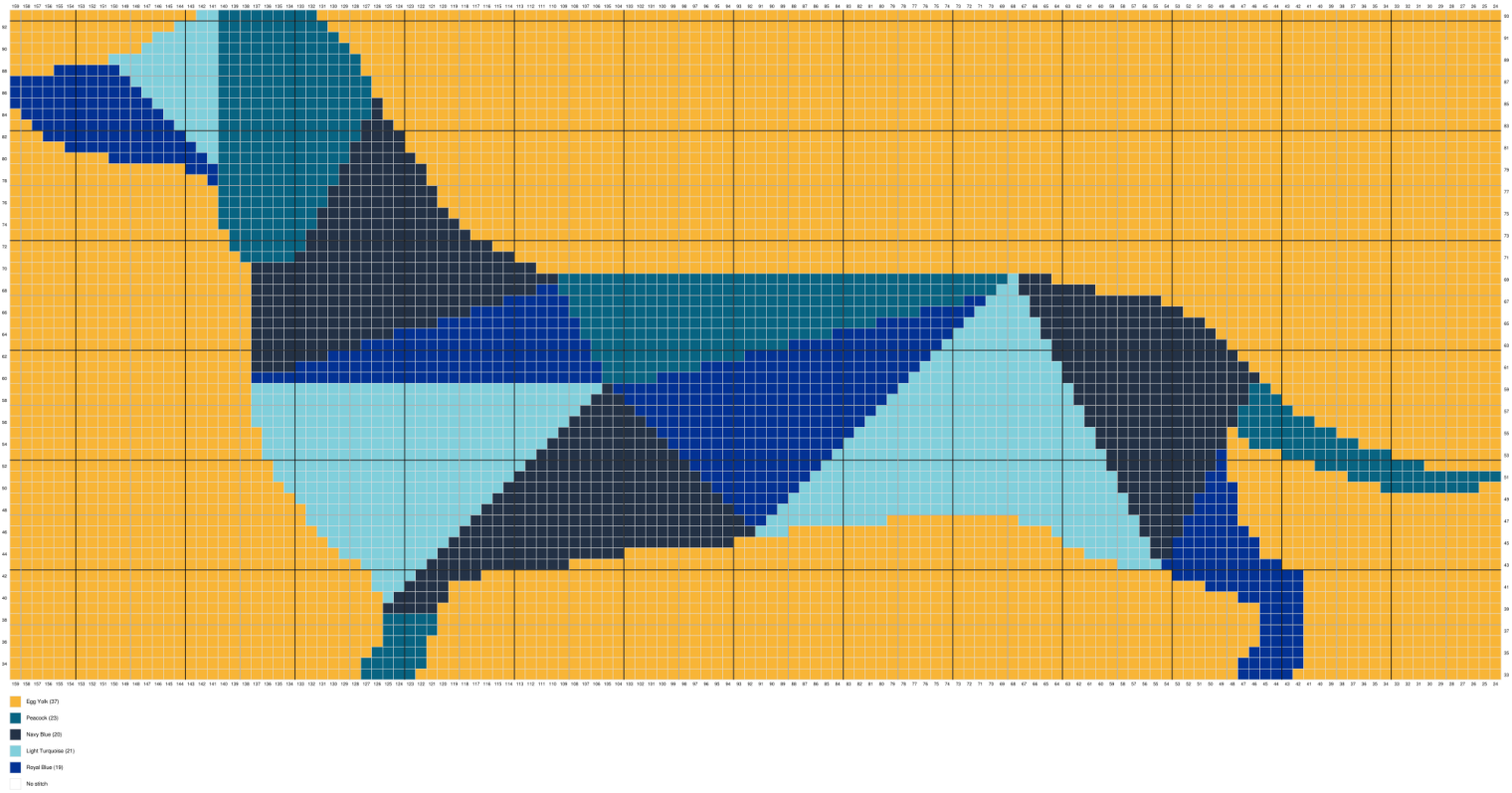
Fasten off your working yarn and weave in all ends.
