MATERIALS

5 (6) 6 (7) 8 skeins of Friends Kid Silk, col Pale Matcha (107)

Sizes S and M: Circular needle 8 mm (US 11) – 80 cm (32″)
Sizes L, XL and 2XL: Circular needle 8 mm (US 11) – 100 cm (39″)
Stitch markers

YARN QUALITY

Friends Kid Silk, Hobbii

72 % Kid Mohair, 3 % Wool, 25 % Silk /

25 g (0.9 oz) = 200 meter (218 yds)

GAUGE

11 sts x 15 rows = 10 cm (4'')

ABBREVIATIONS

st(s) = stitch(es)
k = knit
p = purl
tbl = through the back loop
rnd(s) = round(s)
RS = right side
WS = wrong side
k2tog = knit 2 stitches together
co = cast on
bo = bind off
col = color(s)
sm = stitch marker(s)
BOR = beginning of round

SIZE

S (M) L (XL) 2XL

MEASUREMENTS

Circumference, chest: 100 (109) 118 (127) 136 cm / 39.4 (42.9) 46.5 (50) 53.5" Length: 48 (50) 52 (54) 56 cm / 18.9 (19.7) 20.5 (21.3) 22"

ABOUT THE PATTERN

The Suki slipover is as soft as a cloud worked in three strands of Friends Kid Silk. Suki has a loose fit, deep armholes and wide shoulders. The slipover is worked bottom up.

INFORMATION AND TIPS

The slipover is worked bottom up on a circular needle in stockinette stitch with three strands of yarn held together. The work is divided into front and back pieces which are finished separately. Stitches are picked up for the ribbing along the neckline and armholes. It is important to have the correct gauge, so make a swatch and change to another needle size if necessary.

BODY

Using circular needle 8 mm (US 11) - 80/100 cm (32/39″), co 110 (120) 130 (140) 150 sts. Place a sm to mark the BOR. Work 6 cm (2.4″) in rib stitch (k1, p1).

Work stockinette stitch in the round until the work measures approx. 22 (23) 23 (24) 24 cm / 8.7 (9.1) 9.1 (9.4) 9.4".

If you want the slipover to be shorter or longer, just work until you reach your desired length.

Bo sts for the armhole and divide the work into front piece and back piece like this: Bo 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 sts, k 51 (56) 61 (65) 70 sts (back piece), bo 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 sts, k 51 (56) 61 (65) 70 sts (front piece).

Put the back piece sts on hold.

Front piece

Work even until the armhole measures 15 (16) 17 (19) 21 cm / 5.9 (6.3) 6.7 (7.5) 8.3". End with a WS row.

Work decreases for the neckline.

Binding off for the neckline

From the RS: K 22 (24) 26 (27) 28 sts, bo 7 (8) 9 (11) 14 sts, k 22 (24) 26 (27) 28 sts.

Finish each shoulder separately.

Right shoulder

P 1 row.

Decrease 1 st at the neckline on the following 7 (8) 9 (9) 9 RS rows like this:



K1, k2tog tbl, k1, k to end

= 15 (16) 17 (18) 19 sts.

Work another 4 (4) 4 (6) 8 rows in stockinette stitch.

Put the sts on hold.

<u>Left shoulder</u>

Join the yarn.

P 1 row.

Decrease 1 st at the neckline on the following 7 (8) 9 (9) 9 RS rows like this: K until 3 sts before neckline, k2tog, k1

= 15 (16) 17 (18) 19 sts.

Work another 4 (4) 4 (6) 8 rows in stockinette stitch.

Put the sts on hold.

Back piece

P 1 row.

Work following the same procedure as for the front piece until the work is approx. 3 cm (1.2'') shorter than the front pieces. End with a WS row.

Binding off for the neckline

K 15 (16) 17 (18) 19 sts, bo 21 (24) 27 (31) 32 sts for the neckline, k 15 (16) 17 (18) 19 sts.

Join the shoulders with 3 needles like this: Let the RS of the pieces face each other. Using a third needle, k 1 st from each needle together, k another 2 sts together, pass 1 st over the other. Continue like this until all sts are bo.

Ribbing, neckline

Pick up 68 (72) 76 (80) 82 sts along the neckline. BOR is midway on the neck. Work 4 cm (1.6'') in rib stitch (k1, p1) using the magic loop technique and bo.

Ribbing, armhole

Pick up 1 st in each st (the number of sts must be even) along the armhole. BOR is midway under the sleeve. Work 4 cm (1.6") in rib stitch (k1, p1) using the magic loop technique and bo.

Finishing

Weave in all ends. The slipover is now done!
