**Throw**

#### **MATERIALS**

Col A: 2 skeins of Dream Colour color 06 Col B1: 1 skein of Dream Colour color 05 Col B2: 1 skein of Dream Colour color 28

Crochet hook 2.5 mm (US C/2)

### YARN QUALITY

**Dream Colour**, Hobbii 100 % Wool 100 g = 400 m

#### **GAUGE**

10 cm x 10 cm (4'' x 4'') = 21 sts x 22 rows

#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

ch = chain sc = single crochet ss = slip stitch yo = yarn over

#### SIZE

One size

#### **MEASUREMENTS**

Width: 67 cm / 26.4" Length: 67 cm / 26.4"

#### **PATTERN INFORMATION**

This impressive throw is worked in geometrical "log cabin" tiles, joined together "as-you-go". The combination of colorful yarn and yarn in shades of grey create a mesmerising optical effect. The pattern is suitable for intermediate crocheters and comes with a photo-guide and technique videos.

#### **INFO AND TIPS**

Each tile forming the blanket is the same as all the others; what changes – and produces the wonderful optical effect – is the way you join them together. This is a fully beginner-friendly project: all you need to know is the Simple Crochet, Slip Stitch and how to change colour. Just pay attention to the direction you are crocheting into and the stitch count.

Throughout the pattern, you can choose to either work over the yarn tails and hide them as you crochet, or to leave them hanging and weave them all in at the end.

Always rotate your piece towards right by 90° after each log is completed, and work on the sides (tops/bottoms) of previous logs

#### **LOG CABIN TILE**

Each Tile forming the blanket is made of 15 "logs". *Photo 1* shows the chronological sequence of logs in which they should be worked. The arrows indicate on which log side you should start the new log.





# LOG 1 (in col A)

With col A, ch6. ROW 1. 5 sc, ch1, turn. ROWS 2-4. 5 sc, ch1, turn.

ROW 5. 5 sc. Cut off yarn in col A and change to yarn in col B1.

# LOG 2 (in col B1)

ROWS 1-4. 5 sc, ch, turn. ROW 5. 5 sc, cut off col B1.

# LOG 3 (in col B2)

Rotate your piece towards the right by 90°. Attach yarn in col B2 (where you left off in Log 2) and work on the sides of Log 2 and Log 1 (*Photo 2*).

Try and work a sc per row, so as to space out sts regularly.

ROWS 1-4. 10 sc, ch1, turn.

ROW 5. 10 sc, cut off col B2.

# LOG 4 (in col A)

Rotate your piece towards right by  $90^{\circ}$ , attach yarn in col A and work on the side of Log 3 and at the bottom of Log 1.

ROWS 1-4. 10 sc, ch1, turn.

ROW 5. 10 sc, do NOT cut off col A.

### LOG 5 (in col A)

Rotate your piece towards right by 90°, keep on working with col A on the sides of Log 4, Log 1 and Log 2.

ROWS 1-4. 15 sc, ch1, turn.

ROW 5. 15 sc, cut off col A.

# LOG 6 (in col B1)

Rotate your piece towards right by 90°, attach yarn in col B1 and work on the side of Log 5, on the top of Log 2 and on the side of Log 3.

ROWS 1-4. 15 sc, ch1, turn.

ROW 5. 15 sc, do <u>NOT</u> cut off col B1.



Log 6

# LOG 7 (in col B1)

Rotate your piece towards right by 90°, keep on working with col B1 on the side of Log 6, on the top of Log 3 and on the side of Log 4.

ROWS 1-4. 20 sc, ch1, turn.

ROW 5. 20 sc, cut off col B1.





LOG 8 (in col A)

ROWS 1-4. 20 sc, ch1, turn. ROW 5. 20 sc, do <u>NOT</u> cut off col A.



# LOG 9 (in col A)

ROWS 1-4. 25 sc, ch1, turn. ROW 5. 25 sc, cut off col A.





# **LOG 10 (in col B2)**


ROWS 1-4. 25 sc, ch1, turn. ROW 5. 25 sc, do <u>NOT</u> cut off col B2.

### **LOG 11 (in col B2)**

ROWS 1-4. 30 sc, ch1, turn. ROW 5. 30 sc, cut off col B2.



LOG 12 (in col A)

ROWS 1-4. 30 sc, ch1, turn. ROW 5. 30 sc, do <u>NOT</u> cut off col A.



# LOG 13 (in col A)

ROWS 1-4. 35 sc, ch1, turn. ROW 5. 35 sc, cut off col A.



LOG 14 (in col B1)

ROWS 1-4. 35 sc, ch1, turn. ROW 5. 35 sc, do <u>NOT</u> cut off col B1.

# **LOG 15 (in col B1)**

ROWS 1-4. 40 sc, ch1, turn. ROW 5. 40 sc, cut off col A.

Create 16 log cabin tiles following the same instructions. You can swap yarn B1 with B2 (i.e. use col B2 in those logs that should be made in col B1, and vice versa), if you wish.



### **ASSEMBLING**

Join all tiles together using the Slip Stitch sewing method (see video tutorial for this technique, if necessary), positioning the tiles as shown in *Photo 3*.

Though the SS sewing method is barely visible, use the yarn in the same colour for sewing the tiles together.



### **FINISHING**

With yarn in col A, work 4 rounds in sc all around the throw. Work at corners: \*1sc, ch3, 1sc, in the same corner st.

Cut off yarn, weave in all ends and block the throw. Done!
