

## CROCHET PATTERN

# Hello Squares 

## Sweater

## MATERIALS

$2(2,3)$ skeins of Wheel of Alpaca col. Pretty
Graceful (01)

Crochet hook 3.5 mm / US E/4
Tapestry needle

## YARN QUALITY

(22) Wheel of Alpaca, Hobbii

80 \% Acrylic, 20 \% Alpaca
$250 \mathrm{~g} / 8.8 \mathrm{oz}=940 \mathrm{~m} / 1028 \mathrm{yds}$

## GAUGE

12 sts $\times 16$ rows $=10 \mathrm{~cm} \times 10 \mathrm{~cm} / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime \prime}$

## ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain
sl st = slip stitch
sc = single crochet
hdc = half double crochet
dc = double crochet

## SIZE

XS/S (M/L, XL/2XL)

## MEASUREMENTS

Width: $48 \mathrm{~cm} / 19^{\prime \prime}$ ( $52 \mathrm{~cm} / 20,5^{\prime \prime}, 56 \mathrm{~cm} / 22^{\prime \prime}$ )
Length: $48 \mathrm{~cm} / 19^{\prime \prime}\left(52 \mathrm{~cm} / 20,5^{\prime \prime}, 56 \mathrm{~cm} / 22^{\prime \prime}\right)$

## PATTERN INFORMATION

Sometimes a simple sweater is all you need. This turtleneck square sweater is crocheted using Hobbii Wheel of Alpaca to create a unique graphic look. The sweater has a high neck and long sleeves. The size can easily be adjusted. The sweater is assembled by sewing together the squares.

Skill-level: intermediate

## INFO AND TIPS

The size can easily be adjusted by adding or subtracting rounds of the squares. If you would like to do a longer or shorter version you can also add or subtract a row of squares in the bottom. The sweater also looks super cute with rolled up sleeves,but if you are not a fan of long sleeves you can also leave out the two squares at the wrist. If you do so, remember to also leave out the 4 rows of sc in the section: "SLEEVES (Underarm)"

The model in the photos is 178 cm and wears a size M/L.

Before starting the pattern make one square to test your gauge. Adjust hook size if necessary.

## Squares

Make 52 squares in total - 16 per front and back, 8 per sleeve, 4 for the turtleneck.
Crochet rounds according to your size:

XS/S: Crochet 5 rounds per square $=12 \times 12 \mathrm{~cm} / 4.8^{\prime \prime} \times 4.8^{\prime \prime}$
M/L: Crochet 6 rounds per square $=13 \times 13 \mathrm{~cm} / 5.1^{\prime \prime} \times 4.1^{\prime \prime}$
XL/2XL: Crochet 7 rounds per square $=14 \times 14 \mathrm{~cm} / 5.5^{\prime \prime} \times 5.5^{\prime \prime}$
ch-5, join with sl st to the 1st ch

Round 1: ch-1, pull the loop to the height of dc (don't count as a stitch) < - this step helps you to avoid holes between the first and the last dc sts, 4 dc into the circle, (ch-2, 4 dc into the circle, ch-2) rep twice, join with sl st to the 1st pulled st

Round 2: ch-1, pull the loop to the height of dc, dc in next dc BUT in the POST of dc stitch (only
the 1 st dc ) <—this step helps to get rid of an unwanted seam, dc in next $3 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-2
space, ch-2, 2 dc in same space, * dc in next $4 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-2 space, ch-2, 2 dc in same space ** rep from * to ** twice, join with sl st to the 1st pulled st

Round 3: ch-1, pull the loop to the height of dc, dc in next dc BUT in the POST of dc stitch (only
the 1 st dc ), dc in next $5 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-2 space, ch-2, 2 dc in same space, * dc in next 8 $\mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-2 space, ch-2, 2 dc in same space ** rep from * to ** twice, dc in the last 2 dc , join with sl st to the 1st pulled st

Round 4: ch-1, pull the loop to the height of dc, dc in next dc BUT in the POST of dc stitch (only
the 1 st dc ), dc in next $7 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-2 space, ch-2, 2 dc in same space, * dc in next 12 dc,
2 dc in next ch-2 space, ch-2, 2 dc in same space ** rep from * to ** twice, dc in the last 4 dc, join with sl st to the 1st pulled st

Round 5: ch-1, pull the loop to the height of dc, dc in next dc BUT in the POST of dc stitch (only
the 1 st dc ), dc in next $9 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-2 space, ch-2, 2 dc in same space, * dc in next 16 dc,
2 dc in next ch-2 space, ch-2, 2 dc in same space ** rep from * to ** twice, dc in the last 6 dc, join with sl st to the 1st pulled st

Round 6: ch-1, pull the loop to the height of dc, dc in next dc BUT in the POST of dc stitch (only
the 1 st dc ), dc in next $11 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-2 space, ch-2, 2 dc in same space, * dc in next 20 dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 space, ch-2, 2 dc in same space ** rep from * to ** twice, dc in the last 8 dc , join with sl st to the 1 st pulled st

Round 7: ch-1, pull the loop to the height of dc, dc in next dc BUT in the POST of dc stitch (only
the 1st dc), dc in next $13 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-2 space, ch-2, 2 dc in same space, * dc in next 24 dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 space, ch-2, 2 dc in same space ** rep from * to ** twice, dc in the last 10
dc, join with sl st to the 1 st pulled st

## JOINING

Lay out your squares, according to the illustration below, in your preferred color order and start joining the body and the sleeves separately. Be careful not to close up the neck-opening (green line in illustration). Set 4 squares a side for the turtleneck.


Start with the vertical lines this way:
Lay 2 squares together with the right sides facing each other. Join 2 corners with sl st, then sl st through the outside loops only in each stitch (or through the back loops only), sl st through 2 corners, ch-1, sl st through the next 2 squares corners and keep connecting the squares through the back loops only. When you finish with "vertical lines" start joining "horizontal lines".

Seaming of sides and sleeves will be done after the next step.

## SLEEVES (Underarm)

Row 1: connect the yarn to the 1st corner of the sleeve square (count from the armhole), ch-3, dc in each dc to the next corner, dc in next corner, hdc in next corner of the 2nd square, hdc in each dc to the next corner, hdc in the next corner, sc in next corner of the 3rd square, sc in each dc to the next corner, sc in the next corner

Row 2: ch-1, turn, sc in each sc , hdc in each hdc, dc in each dc
Row 3: ch-3, turn, dc in each dc, hdc in each hdc, sc in each sc, sc across the 4th square
Row 4: ch-1, turn, sc in each sc, hdc in each hdc, dc in each dc
Row 5: ch-3, turn, dc in each dc, hdc in each hdc, sc in each sc only across the 3rd square
Row 6: ch-1, turn, sc in each sc, hdc in each hdc, dc in each dc
Row 7: ch-3, turn, dc in each dc, hdc in each hdc, sc in each sc, sc across the 4th square,
Row 8: ch-1, turn, sc in each sc, hdc in each hdc, dc in each dc, cut the yarn
You get 8 rows of stitches across the first 3 squares and 4 rows of sc across the 4th square (wrist square).

Repeat these steps for the opposite side of the sleeve and the 2nd sleeve.

Join the sleeves to the body with sl sts, and after that make side seams and sleeve seams (join through the back loop only).

## TURTLENECK

Connect 2 squares to the front and the back part of the neckline (total 4 squares).

## Finishing Touches

Make a row of sc and crab stitches around the neck, bottom and sleeves.
