



**KNITTING PATTERN**

## **MATERIALS**

12 (13) 14 skeins of Portobello col. Wild Berry (56)

Knitting needles 4 mm (US 6) and 4.5 mm (US 7)
Circular needles 4 mm (US 6)
Tapestry needle for sewing
Cable needle

Optional: a piece of thin elastic to sew into the neckline

## **YARN QUALITY**

Portobello, Hobbii 60% Cotton, 28% Acrylic, 12% Wool 50 g (1.75 oz) = 120 m (131 yds)

#### **GAUGE**

10 cm x 10 cm  $(4'' \times 4'')$  = 20 sts in seed stitch x 32 rows

## **ABBREVIATIONS**

k = knit
p = purl
k2tog = 2 knit sts together
yo = yarn over
bs = bobble stitch
CO = cast on
BO = bind off

#### SIZE

S(M)L

## **MEASUREMENTS**

Width: 51 (56) 61 cm / 20 (22) 24" Length: 53 (58) 63 cm / 20.8" (22.8) 24.8"

## PATTERN INFORMATION

Outstanding sweater with cute cable patterns. Perfect for the mountain walk as well as for a romantic dinner at the restaurant. The pattern at first sight seems very complicated, in fact, by the constant repetition of the same sequences it is not so, however, basic knowledge of cable patterns is needed.

# **Pattern**







## **INFO AND TIPS**

The length and width of the sweater for each size are adjusted with a seed stitch. The number and arrangement of cable patterns are the same for all sizes. It is important to start the patterns correctly, according to the description of the first rows, this will make it easier to continue working, and since the crossing of cable stitches is repeated regularly, the work only seems complicated.

Stitches used in the pattern:

Rib stitch: k2, p2.

**Stockinette stitch:** k on the right side, p on the wrong side.

**Double seed stitch:** row 1- k1, p1 to the end of the row, row 2- work the sts as they come up, row 3- p1, k1 to the end of the row, row 4 and all even rows - work the sts as they come up.



## Cable 1 (C1):

12 knit sts- put 3 sts to the back on a cable needle, work 3 sts, then 3 sts from a cable needle, put 3 sts to the front on a cable needle, work 3 sts, then 3 sts from a cable needle, repeat in every 8th row.



## Cable 2 (C2):

6 knit sts- put 3 sts to the back on a cable needle, work 3 sts, then 3 sts from a cable needle, repeat in every 10th row.





Cable 3 (C3):

6 knit sts- put 3 sts to the back on a cable needle, work 3 sts, then 3 sts from a cable needle, repeat in every 6th row.



Cable 4 (C4):

6 knit sts- put 3 sts to the front on a cable needle, work 3 sts, then 3 sts from a cable needle, repeat in every 6th row.



## **Bobbles pattern:**

5 knit sts- k2, bobble, k2, repeat after 9 rows of stockinette stitch.

Sleeves: repeat after 15 rows of stockinette stitch

**Bobble stitch (bs):** make 5 sts from 1 st (k, yo, k, yo, k), turn your work, purl these 5 sts, turn your work, knit these 5 sts, turn your work and knit these 5 sts together.



#### Cable 5 (C5):

15 knit sts- put 5 sts to the back on a cable needle, work 5 sts, then 5 sts from a cable needle, work 5 sts,

work 5 rows in stockinette stitch and in the next row: work 5 sts,

put 5 sts to the front on a cable needle, work 5 sts, then 5 sts from a cable needle, work 5 rows in stockinette stitch and in the next row repeat the entire sequence.



## **FRONT PIECE**

With 4 mm knitting needles CO 110 (122) 134 sts. Work 12 rows in rib stitch. In the last row inc:

size S- 23 sts: Increase evenly 23 sts = 133 sts size M- 21 sts: Increase evenly 21 sts = 143 sts size L- 19 sts: Increase evenly 19 sts = 153 sts.

The further rows will be counted from the end of the ribbing.

Change to 4.5 mm needles and work as follows:

**Row 1:** 1 edge st, 15 (20) 25 sts in seed st, p2, k12, p2, k6, p2, k6, k5, k6, p2, k15, p2, k6, k5, k6, p2, k6, p2, k12, p2, 15 (20) 25 sts in seed st, 1 edge st.

**Row 2 and all even rows** work the sts as they come out i.e. knit the k sts and purl the p sts.

**Row 3:** 1 edge st, 15 (20) 25 sts in seed st, p2, C1, p2, k6, p2, C3, k5, C4, p2, k15, p2, C3, k5, C4, p2, k6, p2, C1, p2, 15 (20) 25 sts in seed st, 1 edge st.

**Row 5:** 1 edge st, 15 (20) 25 sts in seed st, p2, C1, p2, C2, p2, C3, k2, bs, k2, C4, p2, C5, p2, C3, k2, bs, k2, C4, p2, C2, p2, C1, p2, 15 (20) 25 sts in seed st, 1 edge st.

In the following rows, continue to work the even and the odd rows as described. After 76 (90) 90 rows, start to work the raglan.

**NOTE**: The number of raglan rows must be the same for all sweater pieces! BO 4 sts on both sides of the front piece, then decrease 1 st on each side in every other row (always on the right side) as follows:

- at the beginning of the row: 1 edge st, k3, k2tog
- at the end of the row: k2tog, k3, 1 edge st.

Work this way 70 (70) 86 rows counting from the beginning of the raglan. In the next row, transfer the middle 30 sts to the circular needles, then in every other row transfer 3 sts, 2 sts, and 1 st. At the same time, continue to work the raglan until the 80<sup>th</sup> (80<sup>th</sup>) 96<sup>th</sup> row.

## **BACK PIECE**

Work the same way as the front piece up to the 80th (80th) 96th row but without decreasing sts for the neckline.

Place the finished piece on the spare needle.

## **SLEEVES**

The number of stitches for all sizes is the same, as the patterns used stretch easily. The width of the sleeve will change according to its length, i.e. increased stitches.

With the 4 mm needles CO 54 sts. Work 12 rows with rib stitch. In the last row, after the edge stitch, start increasing 1 st every 6 sts. You will increase this way 9 sts = 63 sts. Change to 4,5 mm needles and work as follows:

**Row 1:** 1 edge st, 12 (all sizes) sts in seed st, p2, k6, p2, k6, p2, k6, p2, k6, p2, k6, p2, t1 sts in seed st, 1 edge st.

**Row 2 and all even rows** work the sts as they come out i.e. knit the k sts and purl the p sts. **Row 3:** 1 edge st, 12 sts in seed st, p2, k6, p2, k6, p2, k6, p2, k6, p2, 12 sts in seed st, 1 edge st.



**Row 5:** 1 edge st, inc 1 st, 12 sts in seed st, p2, C2, p2, C3, k2, bs, k2, C4, p2, C2, p2, inc 1 st, 12 sts in seed st, 1 edge st.

Continue to work the even and the odd rows as described increasing on both sides of the sleeve 1 st every 5 rows.

Work this way 100 (110) 110 rows. In the next row start to work the raglan. BO 4 sts on both sides of the sleeve, then decrease 1 st on each side in every other row, the same way as in the front and back piece.

Work this way 80 (80) 96 rows counting from the beginning of the raglan.

Place the finished piece on the spare needle.

## **FINISHING**

Place the pieces of the sweater on the circular needle in the following order: front piece, sleeve, back piece, sleeve.

To make it easier to finish the sweater, sew the sides of the raglan first.

Knit one round with the k sts working k2tog every 5 sts, then work 6 rounds in a rib stitch. Sew the sleeves and the sides of the sweater.

If you think that the ribbing on the neckline stands out too much, you can sew a thin elastic into the center of the last round.

Secure all ends.
