# Stellar

**Sweater**

**Design: Lirio knits | Hobbii Design**



## MATERIALS

8 (8) 9 (10) 11 skeins of Friends Wool col. Tomato (40)  
1 skein of Friends Wool col. Off White (02)  
1 skein of Pearly Haze in col. Charcoal (123)  
Optional: 1 skein of Friends Kid Silk col. Off White (02)

Circular needles 4.5mm (US 7)  
Circular needles 5mm (US 8)  
Stitch markers  
Scissors  
Darning needle

## YARN QUALITY

 **Friends Wool**, Hobbii  
100% wool  
50 g / 1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

 **Friends Kid Silk**, Hobbii  
72% Mohair, 25% Silk, 3% Wool  
25 g / 0.9 oz = 200 m / 218 yds

 **Pearly Haze**, Hobbii  
73% viscose, 27% wool  
50 g / 1.75 oz = 110 m / 120 yds

## GAUGE

18 sts x 28 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" in Stockinette stitch in Friends Wool with 5mm (US 8) needles.

## SIZE

S (M) L (XL) XXL

## FLAT MEASUREMENTS

Width: 40 (45) 50 (55) 60 cm / 16" (18") 20" (22)" 24"  
Length: 40 (45) 50 (55) 60 cm / 16" (18") 20" (22)" 24"

## PATTERN INFORMATION

The cropped sweater is knitted bottom up. The body is worked in the round until the sleeves. Then it is split for front and back, which are worked flat. Once the shoulders are seamed together, you'll pick up stitches for the sleeves.

The sleeves are worked in the round with increases to create a bell shape. The hem is casted off without working a ribbing, so that it rolls up. Lastly, stitches are picked up for the turtleneck, which is worked in 1x1 ribbing in the round and cast off with the tubular bind off method. For the stars, you have to follow a color chart and add them to the sweater with the duplicate stitch method.

## ABBREVIATIONS

Co= cast on

K = knit

P = Purl

BORm = Beginning of Row marker

SM = Stitch marker

RS = Right side

WS = Wrong side

Ssk = Slip slip knit (left leaning decrease)

K2tog = Knit 2 together (right leaning decrease)

Rep = repeat

## INFO AND TIPS

The stars are added once the whole sweater is finished (and blocked) with the duplicate stitch method. For a better look, work them from the bottom of the star up and leave the white edges for last.

## BODY

### Rib edge

With Friends Wool in Tomato, co 144 (160) 180 (196) 216 sts on the 4.5mm (US 7) circular needles. Place a BORm and make sure there aren't any twisted stitches, join the round.

Rnd 1: \*k1, p1\*. Repeat until BORm. (Place a different SM after working 72 (80) 90 (98) 108 sts. This is the side marker.)

Rnds 2 to 5: Rep row 1.

Rnd 6: Cut Friends Wool in Tomato. Attach one strand of Friends Wool in Off White and one strand of Friends Kid Silk in the same color (optional). Rep Rnd 1.

Rnd 7: Rep rnd 1.

Rnd 8: Cut yarn in Off White and attach yarn in Tomato. Rep rnd 1.

Rnd 9: Rep rnd. 1.

Rnd 10: Rep rnd 6.

Rnd 11: Rep rnd 1. Cut yarn in Tomato.

Change to 5mm (US 8) circular needles, attach red yarn and work in Stockinette stitch until it measures 23 (25) 29.5 (33.5) 37 cm / 9.4" (9.8)" 11.6" (13) 14.5" from co edge).

### **Split Front / Back**

Next rnd: K until 2 (2) 4 (4) 4 sts before the side marker. Cast off 4 (4) 8 (8) 8 sts, removing the marker when you pass it. Continue knitting until 2 (2) 4 (4) 4 sts before BORm. Cast off 4 (4) 8 (8) 8 sts, removing BORm when you pass it.

You've split for the front and back, and should have 68 (76) 82 (90) 100 sts on each. Place the back sts on an additional cable or scrap of yarn. You'll work on the front now.

### **FRONT**

Next row: (RS)- K2, ssk, k until 4 sts remain, k2tog, k2. You've decreased 2sts and should have 66 (74) 80 (88) 98 sts on your needles.

Next row: P all.

Rep last 2 rows once more. You should have 64 (72) 78 (86) 96 sts.

Work in Stockinette stitch until it measures 35 (40) 45 (50) 55 cm / 13.7" (15.7)" 17.7" (19.6)" 21.6" from cast on edge, ending on a WS row.

Next row (RS): K 22 (26) 27 (29) 34, cast off 20 (20) 24 (28) 28 sts, k 22 (26) 27 (29) 34. Slip the first 22 (26) 27 (29) 34 onto an additional cable or scrap of yarn. These will be the left shoulder. We'll continue working the right shoulder now.

Next row of right shoulder: P all.

Next row: K2, ssk, k all. You should have 21 (25) 26 (28) 33 sts left.

Rep last 2 rows until you have 18 (21) 23 (25) 29 sts on your needles.

Work in Stockinette stitch. Knit all on the RS, purl all on the WS until it measures 40 (45) 50 (55) 60 cm / 16" (17.7)" 19.6" (22) 23.6" from cast on edge.

Next RS row: Cast off knit wise.

Pick up the sts you left on hold for the left shoulder and, with the WS facing you, attach yarn and work as follows:

Next row of left shoulder: P all.

Next row: K until 4 sts remain, ssk, k2. You should have 21 (25) 26 (28) 33 sts left.

Rep last 2 rows until you have 18 (21) 23 (25) 29 sts left.

Work in Stockinette stitch. Knit all on the RS, purl all on the WS until it measures 40 (45) 50 (55) 60 cm / 16" (17.7)" 19.6" (22) 23.6" from cast on edge.

Next row: Cast off knit wise.

The front is finished...now let's move on to the back!

## BACK

Pick up the sts you left on hold for the back, and with RS facing you, attach yarn and follow these instructions:

Next row: K2, ssk, k until 4 sts remain, k2tog, k2. You should have 66 (74) 80 (88) 98 sts on your needles.

Next row: P all.

Rep last 2 rows once more. You should have 64 (72) 78 (86) 96 sts on your needles.

Work in Stockinette stitch until it measures 38 (42.5) 47.5 (52.5) 57.5 cm / 14.9" (16.7)" 18.7" (20.6)" 22.6" from cast on edge, ending on a WS row.

Next row (RS): K 20 (23) 25 (27) 31, cast off 24 (26) 28 (32) 34, k 20 (23) 25 (27) 31. Leave the first 20 (23) 25 (27) 31 sts on hold on an additional cable or scrap of yarn. These will be the right shoulder. We'll work the left shoulder now.

Next row of left shoulder: P all.

Next row: K2, ssk, k all. You should have 19 (22) 24 (26) 30 sts.

Rep last 2 rows once more. You'll end up with 18 (21) 23 (25) 29 sts.

Next row (RS): Cast off knit wise.

Pick up the sts you left on hold for the right shoulder. With the WS facing you, attach yarn and work as follows:

Next row of right shoulder: P all.

Next row: K until 4 sts remain, k2tog, k2. You should have 19 (22) 24 (26) 30 sts.

Rep last 2 rows once more. You'll end up with 18 (21) 23 (25) 29 sts.

Next row (RS): Cast off knit wise.

The body is finished!!!

Join the shoulders together with the horizontal invisible seam, and let's go for the bell sleeves!

## SLEEVES

*Repeat for both sleeves.*

With Friends Wool in Tomato, and 5mm (US 8) circular needles, identify the two center sts from the underarm. Start picking sts up on the one to the left.

Pick up 72 (82) 86 (90) 90 sts evenly around the armhole opening. Your last stitch should be on the center st to the right. Place a BORm to knit in the round and follow the instructions below:

Work in Stockinette stitch (knit all) until sleeve measures 32 (31) 33 (33) 34 cm/ 12.5" (12.2)" 13" (13)" 13.3" from armhole.

Next rnd: K1, M1L, k all until 1 st before BORm, M1R, k1. You've increased 2sts, and should now have 74 (84) 88 (92) 92.

Next 4 rows: K all.

Rep last 2 instructions 11 (16) 16 (16) 17 times more, or until you reach desired sleeve length + 4cm / 1.5" (this will roll up). What you'll do here will be: One rnd of increases, four rnds in stockinette stitch.

If you followed the instructions, you should have a total of 12 (17) 17 (17) 18 increase rnds, and 96 (116) 120 (124) 126 sts on your needles.

Next rnd: K all.

Next rnd: Cast off loosely.

You'll notice the hems roll up. That's because there's no ribbing, but don't worry...this is exactly what we want! ☺

## TURTLENECK

With Friends Wool in Tomato, and 4.5mm (US 7) circular needles, identify the left shoulder seam, and pick up sts in this manner:

Pick up 76 (80) 88 (96) 98 sts evenly around the neckline. Place a BORm as you'll be working in the round.

Rnd 1: \*k1, p1\*. Rep from \* to \* until BORm.

Rnds 2 to 16: Rep rnd 1.

Cut red yarn and attach Friends Wool and Kid Silk in Off White.

Rnds 17 and 18: Rep rnd 1.

Cut Off White yarns and attach Friends Wool in Tomato.

Rnds 19 and 20: Rep rnd 1.

Cut red yarn and attach Off white yarns.

Rnds 21 and 22: Rep rnd 1.

Cut Off white and attach red yarn.

Rnds 23 and 24: Rep rnd 1.

Cast off with the tubular bind off method.

Fold in half.

The sweater is finished, but you have to add the details to make it unique!

Ready to work some duplicate stitches?

## STARS


To add the stars, you'll need to use the duplicate stitch method and follow a chart.

Each square on the chart represents a stitch you'll have to duplicate over the fabric.

The dark grey squares represent the Pearly Haze yarn in Charcoal, and the light grey ones represent the Friends Wool in Off White (optional: you can add the Kid Silk for a bit of fuzz!).

My advice is that you begin from the bottom up on each star and work the dark grey part first and the edges second.

In this part, you have full freedom to add as many stars as you like, and place them wherever you prefer!



### FINISHING TOUCHES

Weave in all ends.
