## MATERIALS

### Friends Cotton 8/4:

- 1 skein color Beige (05)
- 1 skein color Chestnut (11)
- 1 skein color Sunflower (24)
- 1 skein color Tomato (40)
- 1 skein color Malachite (106)

Crochet hook 2.5 mm / US C/2  
DIY Headbands  
Sewing pins  
Stuffing  
Darning needle  
Markers

## YARN QUALITY

 **Friends Cotton 8/4**, Hobbii  
100 % cotton  
50 g (1.75 oz) = 160 m (175 yds)

## ABBREVIATIONS

st = stitch  
ch = chain  
sl st = slip stitch  
sc = single crochet  
hdc = half double crochet  
dc = double crochet  
yo = yarn over  
inc = crochet 2 sts in the same st  
dec = crochet 2 sts together  
Picot: chain 2, slip stitch in the second chain from the hook.  
\*\* = repeat from \* to \* the number of times indicated  
( ) = amount of sts at the end of the round

## SIZE

One size

## MEASUREMENTS

Length: 14.1 in (35.7 cm) (from end to end)  
Width: 0.8 in (2 cm)  
Height: 4.7" (11 cm)

## PATTERN INFORMATION

Dasher is a cute headband with reindeer ears and antlers, decorated with a holly and a pretty poinsettia. Perfect for adding some Christmas magic whatever the season Dasher will bring joy throughout the year and lots of play and fun for your child.

You will work the cover and each detail separately. Then all is sewn on the headband.

This pattern is beginner-friendly.

# Pattern



## INFO AND TIPS

You work in a spiral. Use a stitch marker when working in spiral, to keep trace of the beginning of the round.

Ch 1 in the beginning of a round doesn't count as a st.

## COVER (make 2)

With col Beige and hook 2.5 mm (C/2)

The amount of stitches and rows that you need can vary depending on your tension. Try it often on the headband and adjust the amount of increase and rows if necessary. Remember to take notes to work the two pieces in the same way. Work these pieces not too tight, to allow it to have a little elasticity, to make it easier to put the headband inside.

Make a magic circle

**Round 1:** 4 sc in mc (4 sts)

**Round 2:** inc in each st (8 sts)

**Rounds 3 to 12:** 1 sc in each st (8 sts, 10 rounds)

**Round 13:** inc, 1 sc in each st (9 sts)

**Rounds 14 to 23:** 1 sc in each st (9 sts, 10 rounds)

**Round 24:** inc, 1 sc in each st (10 sts)

**Rounds 25 to 27:** 1 sc in each st (10 sts, 3 rounds)

**Round 28:** inc, 1 sc in each st (11 sts)

**Rounds 29 to 34:** 1 sc in each st (11 sts, 6 rounds)

**Round 35:** inc, 1 sc in each st (12 sts)

**Rounds 36 to 56:** 1 sc in each st (12 sts, 21 rounds) At the end of Round 56, finish with a sl st in next st.

Try on the cover, it must be a little shorter than the half of the headband. Adjust the amount of rows if necessary. Fasten off leaving a long tail for sewing.

Make another piece in the same way but cut and weave in ends for this one.

## **EARS (make 2)**

With col Beige and hook 2.5 mm

Make a magic circle

**Round 1:** 6 sc in mc (6 sts)

**Round 2:** \*inc, 1 sc in next 2 sts\* x 2 times (8 sts)

**Round 3:** \*inc, 1 sc in next 3 sts\* x 2 times (10 sts)

**Round 4:** \*inc, 1 sc in next 4 sts\* x 2 times (12 sts)

**Round 5:** \*inc, 1 sc in next 5 sts\* x 2 times (14 sts)

**Round 6:** \*inc, 1 sc in next 6 sts\* x 2 times (16 sts)

**Round 7:** \*inc, 1 sc in next 7 sts\* x 2 times (18 sts)

**Round 8:** \*inc, 1 sc in next 8 sts\* x 2 times (20 sts)

**Round 9:** \*inc, 1 sc in next 9 sts\* x 2 times (22 sts)

**Round 10:** \*inc, 1 sc in next 10 sts\* x 2 times (24 sts)

**Round 11:** \*inc, 1 sc in next 11 sts\* x 2 times (26 sts)

**Round 12:** \*inc, 1 sc in next 12 sts\* x 2 times (28 sts)

**Round 13:** \*inc, 1 sc in next 13 sts\* x 2 times (30 sts)

**Rounds 14 to 18:** 1 sc in each st (30 sts, 5 rounds) At the end of Round 18, finish with a sl st in next st.

Fasten off leaving a long tail for sewing. Make a second ear in the same way.

## **ANTLER (MAKE 2)**

With col Chestnut and hook 2.5 mm (C/2).

### **First part**

Make a magic circle

**Round 1:** 6 sc in mc (6 sts)

**Round 2:** inc in each st (12 sc)

**Rounds 3 to 16:** 1 sc in each st (12 sts, 14 rounds) Stuff as you go.

**Round 17:** 9 sc, leaving the last 3 sts unworked (9 sts). Fasten off, leaving a long tail to sew and put it on hold. Leave the marker in the first st.

You will now work another piece and then join them together.

### Second part

Make a magic circle

**Round 1:** 6 sc in mc (6 sts)

**Round 2:** inc in each st (12 sc)

**Round 3:** \*3 sc, inc\* x 3 times (15 sts)

**Rounds 4 to 18:** 1 sc in each st (15 sts, 15 rounds). Stuff as you go.

**Round 19:** work 12 sc and leave 3 sts unworked. Grab the first part, and work 1 sc in the marked st in the first part, \*dec, 1 sc\* x twice, dec. Still leave the 3 sts from the first part unworked. (18 sts)

You will now continue to work in rounds. After a few rounds, sew to close the hole between the two parts, sewing the sts unworked together. Continue to stuff as you go.

**Round 20:** 1 sc in each st (18 sts)

**Round 21:** 1 sc in the next 5 sts, dec, 1 sc in each st until 4 sts remains. Dec, 1 sc in last 2 sts. (16 sts)

**Rounds 22 to 30:** 1 sc in each st (16 sts, 9 rounds) At the end of Round 30, finish with a sl st in next st.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail to sew.

## POINSETTIA

### Flower (make 2)

With col Sunflower and Tomato and hook 2.5 mm (C/2)

With col Sunflower, make a magic circle

**Round 1:** ch 1, 6 sc in the ring. Change to Tomato in the last yo of the last st. Sl st in first st.

**Round 2:** you will now work the first half of the petal. \*Ch 6, sl st in the 2nd ch from the hook, 1 sc in the next 2 ch, hdc in the next 2 ch, sl st in the st of round 1 at the base of chain, sl st in next st\* repeat all around. (6 petals)

**Note:** now work the second half of the petals, you will work in the back loops of the chains you made for the first petals and then sl sts on the first half to rejoin the center of the flower.

### Round 3: .

\*Hdc in the next 2 ch, sc in the next 2 ch, sl st in the next 2 ch. Turn to work around the petal. Sl st in the sl st of the first half of the flower (this sl st can be tricky, you can sl st in the back loop if it's easier). Sl st in the next 4 sts from the first petal. Sl st in the st of round 1 at the base of the chain.\* Repeat from \* to \* around.

Fasten off leaving a long tail to sew. Work a second flower in the same way but in Tomato only and weave in ends.

## LEAVES

With col Malachite and hook 2.5 mm (C/2)

Ch 12

Dc in the 3rd ch from the hook, dc in the next 2 ch, 1 hdc in the next 3 ch, 1 sc in the next 3 ch, (sl st, ch 1, sl st) in the last ch.

Turn to work around and work in the back loops of the ch that you just worked.

1 sc in the next 3 ch, 1 hdc in the next 3 ch, dc in the next 3 ch, ch 2, sl st in the same ch.

Do not cut the yarn and continue with the second ch.

Ch11

Sc in the second ch from the hook, sc in the next 2 ch, 1 hdc in the next 3 ch, 1 dc in the next 3 ch, ch 2 and sl st in the same st. Don't work the last ch. Turn to work in the back loops of the ch. Ch 2, dc in the same ch, dc in the next 2 ch, hdc in the next 3 ch, sc in the next 3 ch, sl st in the last ch.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

## HOLLY

With col Malachite and hook 2.5 mm (C/2)

### Leaves

Ch 12

**Round 1:** Dc in the 3rd ch from the hook, dc in the next 2 ch, 1 hdc in the next 3 ch, 1 sc in the next 3 ch, 3 sc in the last ch.

Now you work in the back loops of the ch.

1 sc in the next 3 ch, 1 hdc in the next 3 ch, dc in the next 3 ch, ch 2, sl st in the same ch.

**Round 2:** Ch2, sl st in the first dc of round 1, \*picot, sl st in next 3 sts\* x 3, [sl st, picot, sl st] in the next st, \*sl st in next 3 sts, picot\* x 3, sl st in next st, ch 2. Sl st in the first st of the foundation ch.

Do not cut the yarn and continue with the second ch.

Ch12

**Round 1:** Sc in the second ch from the hook, sc in the next 3 ch, 1 hdc in the next 3 ch, 1 dc in the next 3 ch, ch 2 and sl st in the same st. Don't work the last ch. Turn to work in the back loops of the ch. Ch 2, dc in the same ch, dc in the next 2 ch, hdc in the next 3 ch, sc in the next 3 ch, 2 sl st in the last ch. Sl st in the first st of the round.

**Round 2:** sl st in the next 2 sts. \*picot, sl st in the next 3 sts\* x 2 times. Picot, sl st in next st. Ch 2, sl st in the ch of the foundation ch, where you started the leaf. Ch 2, sl st in the first dc of round 1. \*Picot, sl st in the next 3 sts\* x 3. Picot, sl st in the next st.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

### **BERRIES (make 3)**

With Tomato yarn, and hook 2.5 mm (C/2)

Make a magic circle, work 6 sc in the ring. Sl st in the next st.

Fasten off leaving a long tail. With the yarn needle, pass the yarn through the front loops of each st and tight to close the hole and secure.

### **ASSEMBLY**

- Place the 2 pieces of the cover on the headband and sew them together.
- Place the antlers on the headband at 0.8" (2 cm) from the center and sew them in place. Before closing the hole completely, add some stuffing.
- Fold ears in half and sew the first half 0.4" (1 cm) under each antler. Sew the second half leaving a small space.
- Take the holly's leaves (the two leaves with picots). Lay the leaves lightly on top of each other, sew the 3 berries on the leaves, fixing the leaves at the same time. Finally sew the holly in front of the right antler (when wearing).
- Take both parts of Poinsettia and put them on top of each other. The flower with the yellow center at the top and the red flower below with the right side up, shifting the petals. Sew them together and then sew the leaves under the flower. Finally sew the holly in front of the left antler (when wearing).
