Sweater Kim

- Little One's & Tweens



Knitted with Teddy
- 100 % Polyester 50g/ 65 m
Ribbed edges in Cosy
- 60% Cotton/40% Acrylic 50g/ 100 m

YARN USAGE

Size	Teddy	Cosy
1-2 yrs:	300 g	50 g
3-4 yrs:	350 g	50 g
5-6 yrs:	400 g	50 g
7-8 yrs:	500 g	100 g
9-10 yrs:	500 g	100 g
11-12 yrs:	550 g	100 g

MATERIALS

Circular needles and
Double pointed needles:
3,0 and 3,5 mm
Gauge Teddy:
19 stitches x 33 rows = 10 x 10 cm

Skill Level:

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11-12 yrs:	550 g	100 g

MATERIALS

Circular needles: 3,0 and 3,5 mm (60 cm)

Double pointed needles: 3,0 and 3,5 mm

Markers

Gauge Teddy:

19 stitches x 33 rows in stockinette stitch on needle 3,5 mm = 10 x 10 cm

The given amounts of yarn are for guidance only.

Teddy

Soft like a dream and a yarn many have been longing for, to be used for knitting and crocheting baby ware, teddies and blankets. Perfect for knitted teddy jackets and sweaters that are wonderful to wear. A "fluffy" yarn, that doesn't require any special techniques or stitches to get a nice and chunky result.

100% Polyester, 50 g/65 m.

Cosy

The thread is quite lightspun, soft and with a very special elasticity, which preserves the knit beautiful. The Cosy yarn is a bit vintage in its expression – warm, strong and even breathable.

60% Cotton/40% Acrylic, 50 g/100 m.



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DEFINITIONS

Raglan decrease Before the marker: Knit 2 stitches together.

After the marker: Slip 1 stitch off the right needle, knit 1 stitch, pass the slipped stitch over.

Increase Insert the left needle from behind into the loop between the stitches. Knit it as a regular stitch.

* ... * What is stated in between is repeated throughout the round/row.

(..) At the end of the round/row - indicates the total number of stitches.

FINAL MEASUREMENTS

GUIDE:

- Knit from the bottom.
- Ribbing in Cosy - then stockinette stitch in Teddy.
- At the armholes, pick up back piece, front piece, and sleeves. From there, work raglan decreases.
- Finish at the neckline with a ribbed edge in Cosy.

SWEATER KIM

1-2 yrs (3-4 yrs) 5-6 yrs (7-8 yrs) 9-10 yrs (11-12 yrs)

BACK PIECE AND FRONT PIECE

Cast on **96 (108) 116 (120) 132 (136)** stitches using a 3.0 mm needle and Cosy. Knit in the round in rib *knit 2, purl 2*.

Place a marker at the beginning of the round and another marker after **48 (54) 58 (60) 66 (68)** stitches.

The stitches after the 1st marker are for the back piece, the stitches after the 2nd marker are for the front piece.

Knit for **3.5 (3.5) 4 (4) 4.5 (4.5)** cm. Change to a 3.5 mm circular needle and Teddy yarn.

Knit in the round in stockinette stitch.

When the work measures **26 (27) 30 (33) 35 (37)** cm, bind off for the armhole by **2 (2) 3 (3) 3 (3)** stitches on each side of the markers.

There are a total of **88 (100) 104 (108) 120 (124)** stitches on the needle.

SLEEVES X 2

Cast on **28 (28) 28 (32) 32 (32)** stitches using 3.0 mm double-pointed needles in Cosy, distribute the stitches across 4 needles. Mark the beginning of the round.

Knit in the round in a rib pattern *knit 2, purl 2*.

Knit for **3.5 (3.5) 4 (4) 4.5 (4.5)** cm.

Switch to 3.5 mm double-pointed needles and use Teddy yarn.

Knit in the round in stockinette stitch. Knit for **2** rounds.

On the next round, increase **1** stitch on each side of the marker. Repeat this increase every **12th (13th) 10th (11th) 10th (9th)** round a total of **5 (5) 7 (7) 8 (10)** times.

There are a total of **38 (38) 42 (46) 48 (52)** stitches on the needle.

When the work measures **26 (27) 30 (33) 35 (37)**

cm, bind off **2 (2) 3 (3) 3 (3)** stitches on each side of the marker.

There are a total of **34 (34) 36 (40) 42 (46)** stitches on the needle.

YOKE

Begin by placing all pieces on a 3.5 mm circular needle: the back piece, one sleeve, the front piece, and another sleeve.

Knit **2** stitches together between each part on the 1st round and place a marker on each stitch that has been knitted together. There are a total of **152 (164) 172 (184) 200 (212)** stitches on the needle, and **4** markers.

Knit in the round in stockinette stitch. Knit for **2** rounds.

On the next round, begin the raglan decreases.

Make a decrease on each side of each marker, which means there will be **8** stitches less on each round where decreases are made.

Repeat the decreases every **2nd** round a total of **7 (8) 7 (7) 7 (8)** times and every **4th** round **4 (4) 5 (6) 7 (7)** times.

There are a total of **64 (68) 76 (80) 88 (92)** stitches on the needle.

Knit **1** round after the last decrease round.

On the next round, decrease **6 (6) 8 (4) 12 (10)** stitches evenly spaced.

There are a total of **58 (62) 68 (76) 76 (82)** stitches on the needle.

NECK

The work now measures **36.5 (38.5) 42.5 (46) 49 (51)** cm.

Switch to a 3.0 mm circular needle and Cosy.

Knit **1** row in garter stitch. On the next row, knit in rib *knit 2, purl 2*. Knit for **2.5 (3) 3 (3.5) 4 (4)** cm.

Bind off in rib.

³ Sew together and weave in all ends.

Good to know

Needle Size + Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us.

The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles.

Therefore, we will recommend a range of needle sizes.



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
