Sweater Kim

- Adult



Knitted with Teddy
- 100 % Polyester 50g/ 65 m
Ribbed edges in Cosy
- 60% Cotton/40% Acrylic 50g/ 100 m



YARN USAGE

Size	Teddy	Cosy
XS:	600 g	100 g
S:	700 g	100 g
M:	750 g	100 g
L:	850 g	100 g
XL:	950 g	100 g
XXL:	1000 g	100 g

MATERIALS

Circular needles and
Double pointed needles:
3,0 and 3,5 mm
Gauge Teddy:
19 stitches x 33 rows = 10 x 10 cm

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MATERIALS

Circular needles: 3,0 and 3,5 mm (80 cm)

Double pointed needles: 3,0 and 3,5 mm

Markers

Gauge Teddy:

19 stitches x 33 rows in stockinette stitch on
needle 3,5 mm = 10 x 10 cm

The given amounts of yarn are for guidance only.

Teddy

Soft like a dream and a yarn many have been longing for, to be used for knitting and crocheting baby ware, teddies and blankets. Perfect for knitted teddy jackets and sweaters that are wonderful to wear. A "fluffy" yarn, that doesn't require any special techniques or stitches to get a nice and chunky result.

100% Polyester, 50 g/65 m.

Cosy

The thread is quite lightspun, soft and with a very special elasticity, which preserves the knit beautiful. The Cosy yarn is a bit vintage in its expression – warm, strong and even breathable.

60% Cotton/40% Acrylic, 50 g/100 m.



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DEFINITIONS

Raglan decrease	Before the marker: Knit 2 stitches together. After the marker: Slip 1 stitch off the right needle, knit 1 stitch, pass the slipped stitch over.
Increase	Insert the left needle from behind into the loop between the stitches. Knit it as a regular stitch.
* ... *	What is stated in between is repeated throughout the round/row.
(..)	At the end of the round/row - indicates the total number of stitches.

FINAL MEASUREMENTS

Size. XS (S) M (L) XL (XXL)

Chest 84 (88) 98 (108) 116 (122) cm.

Length 56 (60) 62 (64) 68 (70) cm.

Arm Length 40 (41) 42 (45) 47 (47) cm.

GUIDE:

- Knit from the bottom.
- Ribbing in Cosy - then stockinette stitch in Teddy.
- At the armholes, pick up back piece, front piece, and sleeves. From there, work raglan decreases.
- Finish at the neckline with a ribbed edge in Cosy.

SWEATER KIM

XS (S) M (L) XL (XXL)

BACK PIECE AND FRONT PIECE

Cast on **144 (152) 168 (184) 200 (208)** stitches using a 3.0 mm needle in *Cosy*. Knit in the round in ribbing *knit 2, purl 2*. Place a marker at the beginning of the round and place another marker after **72 (76) 84 (92) 100 (104)** stitches.

The stitches after the first marker are for the back piece, and the stitches after the second marker are for the front piece.

Knit for **5 (5) 5 (6) 6 (6)** cm. Switch to a 3.5 mm circular needle and use *Teddy* yarn. Knit in the round in stockinette stitch.

On the first round, decrease **2 (2) 2 (0) 2 (0)** stitches evenly spaced.

There are a total of **142 (150) 166 (184) 198 (208)** stitches on the needle.

When the work measures **38 (40) 42 (45) 47 (49)** cm, bind off **3** stitches on each side of the markers for the armholes.

There are a total of **130 (138) 154 (172) 186 (196)** stitches on the needle.

SLEEVES X 2

Cast on **40 (40) 40 (40) 44 (44)** stitches using 3.0 mm double-pointed needles in *Cosy*, distribute the stitches across 4 needles. Mark the beginning of the round.

Knit in the round in ribbing *knit 2, purl 2*.

Knit for **5 (5) 5 (6) 6 (6)** cm. Switch to 3.5 mm double-pointed needles and use *Teddy* yarn.

Knit in the round in stockinette stitch. Knit for **2** rounds.

On the next round, increase **1** stitch on each side of the marker. Repeat this increase every **14th (10th) 9th (8th) 9th (8th)** round a total of **7 (10) 12 (14) 13 (14)** times.

There are a total of **54 (60) 64 (68) 70 (72)** stitches

on the needle.

When the work measures **40 (41) 42 (45) 47 (47)** cm, bind off **3** stitches on each side of the marker. There are a total of **48 (54) 58 (62) 64 (66)** stitches on the needle.

YOKE

Begin by placing all pieces on a 3.5 mm circular needle: the back piece, one sleeve, the front piece, and another sleeve.

Knit **2** stitches together between each piece in the first round and place a marker on each stitch that has been knitted together. There are a total of **222 (242) 266 (292) 310 (324)** stitches on the needle and **4** markers.

Knit in the round in stockinette stitch. Knit for **2** rounds.

On the next round, begin the raglan decreases. Perform a raglan decrease on each side of every marker, resulting in a total reduction of **8** stitches on each decrease round.

Repeat the raglan decreases every **2nd** round a total of **9 (10) 12 (12) 12 (13)** times, and then repeat them every **4th** round for **7 (8) 7 (8) 9 (9)** times.

There are a total of **94 (98) 114 (132) 142 (148)** stitches on the needle.

Knit **1** round after the last round of raglan decreases.

On the next round, decrease **6 (8) 16 (22) 28 (28)** stitches evenly distributed.

There are a total of **88 (90) 98 (110) 114 (120)** stitches on the needle.

NECK

The work now measures **52 (56) 58 (59) 63 (65)** cm. Switch to a 3.0 mm circular needle and *Cosy*.

Knit **1** row in garter stitch (all stitches knit). On the next row, work ribbing *knit 2, purl 2*. Knit for **4 (4) 5 (5) 5 (5)** cm. Bind off in ribbing.

³ Sew together and weave in all loose ends.

Good to know

Needle Size + Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us.

The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles.

Therefore, we will recommend a range of needle sizes.



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
