Marshmallow Swirls

Children's Sweater

MATERIALS

Tweed Delight

2 (2, 2, 3, 3) skeins of color 16, Pink Confetti (C1)

1 skein of color 02, Ivory Neon (C2)

1 skein of color 01, White Marble (C3)

2 (2, 2, 3, 3) skeins of color 07, Misty Blue (C4)

Circular needle 5 mm (US 8)

6 stitch markers

Darning needle

Scissors

Cable needle

Additional cable or scrap of yarn

YARN QUALITY

 **Tweed Delight**, Hobbii

85% wool, 10% acrylic, 5% viscose

50 g / 1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

GAUGE

19 sts x 25 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

ABBREVIATIONS

K = knit

P = Purl

St st = Stockinette Stitch

PM = Place marker

SM = Slip marker

C1/C2/C3/C4 = colour 1/2/3/4

RS = Right side

WS = Wrong side

Rep = Repeat

2/2 RC = slip 2 sts to cable needle and hold in the back. Knit 2, knit 2 from cable needle

ssk = slip, slip, knit

SIZE

2 (4, 6, 8, 10) yo

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 26 (28, 30, 32, 36) cm / 10" (11, 12, 13, 14)"

Length: 28 (30, 32, 34, 38) cm / 11" (12, 13, 14, 15)"

Sleeve length (from cuff to underarm): 19 (24, 26, 30, 34) cm / 7" (9, 10, 12, 13)"

PATTERN INFORMATION

This children's sweater is knitted bottom up in the flat.

It's a boxy fit, therefore, no decreases are to be made for the armholes.

Both front and back are worked separately, then sewn together at the shoulders to pick stitches up for the sleeves, which have a balloon shape, with a long cuff in 2x2 ribbing.

While it is a simple shape and construction, it requires a bit of expertise on cables, intarsia and stranded colorwork, as these techniques are combined at the front of the body.

The back is split in two different colours and a simple intarsia has to be worked in the middle.

Due to its techniques, the pattern is recommended for confident beginner to intermediate knitters.

INFO AND TIPS

For the cables, you'll have to work intarsia and stranded colorwork. Up until the first cross, you'll have to work intarsia. Once the colors are crossed, you'll have to work stranded colorwork. Try to keep the floats on the WS loose so the cable has the same tension throughout the front.

FRONT PANEL

Rib edge

Cast on 50 (52, 58, 62, 68) sts on 5 mm (US8) circular needles with your preferred cast on technique with C2.

Rows 1 to 7 (7, 9, 9, 13) In C2, work in 2x2 rib (k2, p2 until end of row). Your last row should be a WS row. Cut C2.

Row 8 (8, 10, 10, 14): On the RS, start with C1 and k 7 (8, 10, 11, 13), PM, p2, k2. Without cutting C1, attach C2 and k2, p2, PM, k 6 (6, 7, 8, 9), PM, p2, k2. Without cutting C2, attach C3 and k2, p2, PM, k 6 (6, 7, 8, 9), PM, p2, k2. Without cutting C3, attach C4 and k2, p2, PM, k 7 (8, 10, 11, 13).

Row 9 (9, 11, 11, 15): Work all sts as they appear in St st (purl all purls, knit all knits). SM when you come to them, and work the colour changes with intarsia.

Row 10 (10, 12, 12, 16): Work all sts as they appear in St st.

Rows 11 (11, 13, 13, 17) to 13 (13, 15, 15, 19): Repeat rows 9 (9, 11, 11, 15) and 10 (10, 12, 12, 16).

Row 14 (14, 16, 16, 20): K 7 (8, 10, 11, 13), SM, p2, 2/2 RC (from now until the next cross, you'll swap to stranded colorwork instead of intarsia. **Remember to keep floats loose!**), p2, SM, k 6 (6, 7, 8, 9), SM, p2, 2/2 RC, p2, SM, k 6 (6, 7, 8, 9), SM, p2, 2/2 RC, p2, SM, k 7 (8, 10, 11, 13).

Row 15 (15, 17, 17, 21): Work all sts as they appear in St st. SM when you come to them, and work the colour changes with stranded colorwork.

Row 16 (16, 18, 18, 22): Work all sts as they appear in St st.

Rows 17 (17, 19, 19, 23) to 21 (21, 23, 23, 27): Repeat rows 15 (15, 17, 17, 21) and 16 (16, 18, 18, 22).

Row 22 (22, 24, 24, 28): Repeat row 14 (14, 16, 16, 20). Now you're back to working intarsia.

Rows 23 (23, 25, 25, 29) to 61 (65, 71, 75, 85): Repeat rows 8 (8, 10, 10, 14) to 22 (22, 24, 24, 28). What you'll do is 7 rows in St st, one 2/2 RC row, 7 rows in St st, and another 2/2 RC row. As you work the crossings, you'll swap from intarsia to stranded colorwork and vice versa.

Row 62 (66, 72, 76, 86): Continuing with the sequence (continue with stranded colorwork or intarsia), work 19 (19, 20, 21, 23) sts, cast off 12 (14, 18, 20, 22), and work 19 (19, 20, 21, 23). Slip the 19 (19, 20, 21, 23) sts you first worked onto a cable needle or scrap of yarn. These are the sts for the left shoulder. Leave them on hold as you work the right shoulder.

Row 63 (67, 73, 77, 87) of right shoulder- WS: work sts as they're presented.

Row 64 (68, 74, 78, 88): K2, ssk, work sts as they're presented until end of row. You've decreased one stitch and should have 18 (18, 19, 20, 22) sts on your needles.

Row 65 (69, 75, 79, 89): Work all sts as they appear.

Rows 66 (70, 76, 80, 90) to 71 (75, 81, 85, 95): Repeat rows 64 (68, 74, 78, 88) and 65 (69, 75, 79, 89). You should end up on a WS row with 15 (15, 16, 17, 19) sts.

Row 72 (76, 82, 86, 96): Cast off loosely.

You've finished the right shoulder. Now take the sts you had on hold for the left shoulder and place them back on your needles.

With the WS facing you, attach yarn of the corresponding color to the first stitch.

Row 63 (67, 73, 77, 87) of left shoulder: work sts as they're presented.

Row 64 (68, 74, 78, 88): Work sts as they're presented until 4 sts remain, k2tog, k2. You've decreased 1 st and should now have 18 (18, 19, 20, 22) on your needles.

Row 65 (69, 75, 79, 89): Work all sts as they appear.

Rows 66 (70, 76, 80, 90) to 71 (75, 81, 85, 95): Repeat rows 64 (68, 74, 78, 88) and 65 (69, 75, 79, 89). You should end up on a WS row with 15 (15, 16, 17, 19) sts.

Row 72 (76, 82, 86, 96): Cast off loosely.

You've finished the front, well done!!

BACK PANEL

Rib edge

Cast on 50 (52, 58, 62, 68) sts on 5 mm (US8) circular needles with the same technique you used for the front in C2

Rows 1 to 7 (7, 9, 9, 13): Work in 2x2 rib (k2, p2 until end of row). Your last row should be a WS row. Cut C2.

Row 8 (8, 10, 10, 14): Attach C4 and k 25 (26, 29, 31, 34). Without cutting C4, attach C1 and k 25 (26, 29, 31, 34).

From now on, you'll do the color changes with intarsia.

Row 9 (9, 11, 11, 15): P all.

Row 10 (10, 12, 12, 16): K all.

Rows 11 (11, 13, 13, 17) to 67 (71, 77, 81, 91): Repeat rows 9 (9, 11, 11, 15) and 10 (10, 12, 12, 16). Try to keep the intarsia as neat and even as possible in every row. The color change should look like a straight line in the middle of the back and you don't want it crooked!

Row 68 (72, 78, 82, 92): K 16 (16, 17, 18, 20), cast off 18 (20, 24, 26, 28), k 16 (16, 17, 18, 20). Slip the first 16 (16, 17, 18, 20) sts onto an additional cable or scrap of yarn. This is the right shoulder and it'll be worked later.

Continue working the left shoulder.

Row 69 (73, 79, 83, 93) of left shoulder- WS row: P all.

Row 70 (74, 80, 84, 94): K2, ssk, k all. You've decreased 1 stitch, and should have 15 (15, 16, 17, 19) now.

Row 71 (75, 81, 85, 95): P all.

Row 72 (76, 82, 86, 96): Cast off loosely.

Now onto the right shoulder!

With the WS facing you, attach C4 yarn.

Row 69 (73, 79, 83, 93) of right shoulder- WS row: P all.

Row 70 (74, 80, 84, 94): K all until 4 sts remain, k2tog, k2. You've decreased 1 stitch, and should have 15 (15, 16, 17, 19) sts.

Row 71 (75, 81, 85, 95): P all.

Row 72 (76, 82, 86, 96): Cast off loosely.

Now that you have the front and back, place both panels with the WS facing each other and with the horizontal invisible seam, sew the shoulders together.

SLEEVES

Repeat the same instructions for both sleeves.

First of all, from cast on edge at the front, count 41 (41, 48, 50, 58) rows up and place a stitch marker. Do the same for the back.

Work each sleeve with its corresponding color so it matches the side of the body.

Row 0: Starting at the stitch marker you just placed on the back -for the right sleeve-, or front -for the left sleeve-, with the RS of the body facing you, pick up 48 (50, 50, 54, 60) sts evenly along the edge.

Row 1 -WS row: P all.

Row 2: K all.

Rows 3 to 41 (53, 57, 69, 77): Rep rows 1 and 2.

Row 42 (54, 58, 70, 78) – RS row: *k1, k2tog, k2tog*. Rep from * to * until end of row. You'll end up with 29 (30, 30, 33, 36) sts.

Row 43 (55, 59, 71, 79): Attach yarn in color of other sleeve (if you're working the sleeve with C1, attach C4, and vice versa). You'll start working the cuff in 2x2 ribbing (K2, p2) until end of row.

Rows 44 (56, 60, 72, 80) to 49 (59, 65, 75, 85): Continue working 2x2 ribbing.

Row 50 (60, 66, 76, 86): Cast off loosely. Leave a long tail to sew in the side.

Starting at the cuff, join both edges of the sleeve together with the vertical invisible seam. Continue until underarm and once there, sew down the side of the body to the ribbing. Secure and hide the tail.

NECKBAND

With C2, starting at the left shoulder seam, pick up 56 (60, 64, 68, 72) sts evenly along the neck opening.

Place a SM to indicate the end of the row, as you'll knit in the round now.

Rows 1 to 5: Work a 2x2 ribbing (k2, p2).

Row 6: Cast off loosely.

Optional: Block your sweater with water or steam to even out the cables.

I hope you had as much fun knitting this sweater as I had designing it!
