MATERIALS

Friends Cotton 8/4:

- 1 skein col. White (01)
- 1 skein col. Sunflower (24)
- 1 skein col. Orange (30)
- 1 skein col. Tomato (40)
- 1 skein col. Lilac (63)
- 1 skein col. Sapphire (85)
- 1 skein col. Capri Blue (90)

Glitter Deluxe, 30 g:

- 1 skein color Gold (18121)

- Crochet hook 2.5 mm / US C/2
- DIY Headbands
- Sewing pins
- Stuffing
- Darning needle
- A piece of thin cardboard

YARN QUALITY

 **Friends Cotton 8/4**, Hobbii

100 % cotton

50 g (1.75 oz) = 160 m (175 yds)

Glitter Deluxe, 30 g, Go Handmade

100 % Polyester

30 g (1.1 oz) = 1800-2100 m (1950-2300 yds)

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Length: 14.1 in (35.7 cm) (from end to end)

Width: 0.8 in (2 cm)

Height: approx 3.5 in (9 cm)

ABBREVIATIONS

st = stitch

ch = chain

sl st = slip stitch

sc = single crochet

hdc = half double crochet

dc = double crochet

tc = treble crochet

ch2sp = chain 2 space

blo = back loop only

inc = crochet 2 sts in the same st

dec = crochet 2 sts together

** = repeat from * to * the number of times indicated

[] = work all the stitches between brackets in the same st/place

() = the number of sts at the end of the rounds/rows and the number of rounds worked

INFO AND TIPS

Cover, horn and ears are worked in a spiral.

Use a stitch marker when working in spiral, to keep trace of the beginning of the round.

The flowers are worked in rows or rounds.

Ch 1 in the beginning of a row/round doesn't count as a st.

COVER (make 2)

With col White and hook 2.5 mm (US C/2)

The amount of stitches and rows that you need can vary depending on your tension. Try it

often on the headband and adjust the amount of increase and rows if necessary.

Remember to take notes to work the two pieces in the same way. Work these pieces not too tight, to allow it to have a little elasticity, to make it easier to put the headband inside.

Make a magic circle

Round 1: ch1 (doesn't count as a st), 4 sc in magic circle (4 sts). Place a st marker in the first st and move it as you go to keep it in the first st of your round.

Round 2: inc in each st (8 sts)

Rounds 3 to 12: 1 sc in each st (8 sts, 10 rounds)

Round 13: inc, 1 sc in each st (9 sts)

Rounds 14 to 23: 1 sc in each st (9 sts, 10 rounds)

Round 24: inc, 1 sc in each st (10 sts)

Rounds 25 to 27: 1 sc in each st (10 sts, 3 rounds)

Round 28: inc, 1 sc in each st (11 sts)

Rounds 29 to 34: 1 sc in each st (11 sts, 6 rounds)

Round 35: inc, 1 sc in each st (12 sts)

Rounds 36 to 56: 1 sc in each st (12 sts, 21 rounds) At the end of Round 56, finish with a sl st in next st.

Put the headband inside the cover. The cover must be a little shorter than the half of the headband. Adjust the amount of rounds if necessary. Cut the yarn leaving a long tail for sewing.

Make another piece in the same way but cut and weave in ends for this one.

HORN

With col White and hook 2.5 mm (US C/2)

Make a magic circle

Round 1: ch 1, 4 sc in mc (4 sts) Place a st marker in the first st and move it as you go to keep it in the first st of your round.

Round 2: *inc, 1 sc in next st* twice (6 sts)

Round 3: 1 sc in each st (6 sts)

Round 4: *inc, 1 sc in next 2 sts* twice (8 sts)

Round 5: 1 sc in each st (8 sts)

Round 6: *inc, 1 sc in next 3 sts* twice (10 sts)

Round 7: 1 sc in each st (10 sts)

Round 8: *inc, 1 sc in next 4 sts* twice (12 sts)

Round 9: 1 sc in each st (12 sts)

Round 10: *inc, 1 sc in next 5 sts* twice (14 sts)

Round 11: 1 sc in each st (14 sts)

Round 12: *inc, 1 sc in next 6 sts* twice (16 sts)

Round 13: 1 sc in each st (16 sts)

Round 14: *inc, 1 sc in next 7 sts* twice (18 sts)

Rounds 15 and 16: 1 sc in each st (18 sts, 2 rounds)

Start stuffing the horn and continue as you go.

Round 17: *inc, 1 sc in next 8 sts* twice (20 sts)

Rounds 18 and 19: 1 sc in each st (20 sts, 2 rounds)

Round 20: *inc, 1 sc in next 9 sts* twice (22 sts)

Rounds 21 and 22: 1 sc in each st (22 sts, 2 rounds)

Round 23: *inc, 1 sc in next 10 sts* twice (24 sts)

Rounds 24 and 25: 1 sc in each st (24 sts, 2 rounds)

Round 26: *1 sc blo in next 2 sts, dec blo* repeat from * to * around. (18 sts)

Round 27: *1 sc in next st, dec* repeat from * to * around. (12 sts)

Finish stuffing the horn.

Round 28: dec in each sts (6 sts)

Cut the yarn leaving a long tail for sewing. With the yarn needle, pass the yarn through the front loops of each st and tight to close the hole and secure.

Decorative Spiral

With Glitter Deluxe, holding 3 threads together, and hook 2.5 mm

Make a chain measuring around 35 cm. I worked 125 chs. Before fastening off, place the chain all around the horn, forming a spiral and pinning it. Don't tighten it. Adjust the length if necessary by adding or subtracting chains, fasten off leaving a long tail, sew it on the horn with one thread of Glitter Delux and weave in ends.

EARS (make 2)

With col White and hook 2.5 mm (US C/2)

Make a magic circle

Round 1: ch1, 6 sc in mc (6 sts) Place a st marker in the first st and move it as you go to keep it in the first st of your round.

Round 2: *inc, 1 sc in next 2 sts* twice (8 sts)

Round 3: *inc, 1 sc in next 3 sts* twice (10 sts)

Round 4: *inc, 1 sc in next 4 sts* twice (12 sts)

Round 5: *inc, 1 sc in next 5 sts* twice (14 sts)

Round 6: *inc, 1 sc in next 6 sts* twice (16 sts)

Round 7: *inc, 1 sc in next 7 sts* twice (18 sts)

Round 8: *inc, 1 sc in next 8 sts* twice (20 sts)

Round 9: *inc, 1 sc in next 9 sts* twice (22 sts)

Rounds 10 to 16: 1 sc in each st (22 sts, 7 rounds). Don't cut the yarn.

Draw the shape of the ear on a piece of thin cardboard. Cut the shape a little smaller, so that the cardboard can fit into the ear.

With the piece of cardboard inside the ear. Ch 1, sc across, going through both sides.

Cut the yarn leaving a long tail for sewing.

BIG FLOWER (make 2)

With col Tomato and hook 2.5 mm

Ch 38

Row 1: Ch 4 (counts as 1 dc and ch2sp), work 1 dc in the 6th from the hook. *skip 2 ch, dc in next st, ch 2, dc in the same ch* Repeat across the row. Turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, work 6 hdc in the first ch2sp, ch 1, sl st in the next 2 sts, ch 1, 6 hdc in the next ch2sp, ch 1, *sl st in the next 2 sts, ch 1, work [2 dc, 2 tc, 2 dc] in the next ch2sp, ch 1* 4 times, *sl st in the next 2 sts, ch 1, work [3 dc, 2 tc, 3 dc] in the next ch2sp, ch 1* 4 times, *sl st in the next 2 sts, ch 1, work [3 dc, 6 tc, 2 dc] in the next ch2sp, ch 1* 3 times. Sl st in the 3rd ch of the beginning of row 1.

Fasten off leaving a long tail for assembling and sewing.

Fold the first petal in half (the first petal in row 2). Wrap the other petals all around, shifting them slightly. When you are happy with their shape, sew to fix. It may be useful to put some pins to sew more easily.

Repeat to make a second flower with col Orange.

SMALL FLOWER (make 3)

With col Tomato and hook 2.5 mm

Ch 24

Row 1: work sc in the 2sd ch from the hook, *ch 2, skip 1 st, sc in the next st* repeat to the end of the row. Turn.

Row 2: *sl st in next st, ch 1, work [2 hdc, 2 dc, 2 hdc] in next ch2sp, ch1* repeat to the end of the row.

Fasten off leaving a long tail for assembling.

Fold the first petal in half (the first petal in row 2). Wrap the other petals all around, shifting them slightly. When you are happy with their shape, sew to fix the shape. It may be useful to put some pins to sew more easily.

Repeat to make a second flower with col Lilac and a third with col Capri Blue.

TINY FLOWER (make 3)

With col Sunflower and Sapphire and hook 2.5 mm

Make a magic circle with Sunflower yarn.

Round 1: ch 1 (doesn't count as a st); work 4 sc in the magic ring, yarn over, insert the hook in the ring, pull through, yarn over with Sapphire, sl st in the first st. (5 sts) Fasten off Sunflower.

Round 2: *[ch 2, 2 dc, ch 2, sl st] in the same st, sl st in next st* repeat to the end of the round. Fasten off and weave in ends. (5 petals)

ASSEMBLY

- Place the 2 pieces of the cover on the headband and sew them together.
- Place the horn in the middle and sew it.
- Measure 4 cm from the horn to the bottom of the headband and place a pin here on each side. These are places where you will start to sew the ears.
You will sew the second last row against the end of the headband, but first you must sew the last row. So place the second last row along the end of the headband band and see where you must sew the last one. Sew the last row on the headband and then the second last row.

- Place a pin in the center of each flower and place them like you want on the headband, don't hesitate to try different placements from mine. When you are happy with the placement, sew the flowers one by one.
