## MATERIALS

**Pearly Haze** from Hobbii

2(3,3,3,3) Colour 110 Artichoke

2(2,2,2,3) Colour 88 Turkish Blue

2(2,2,2,3) Colour 67 Misty Violet

Crochet hook 6 mm

Stitch markers

Tape measure

Darning needle

Scissors

## YARN QUALITY

 **Pearly Haze**, Hobbii

73% Viscose, 27% Wool

50 g / 1.75 oz. = 110 m / 120 yds.

## GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 2 repeats x 7 rows of the stitch pattern.

## ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain

st(s) = stitch(es)

slst = slip stitch

sc = single crochet

hdc = half double crochet

dc = double crochet

ex-dc = extended double crochet

blo = back loop only

\*...\* = repeat between

{...} = end stitch count

RS/WS = right/wrong side

## SIZE

XS(S,M,L,XL)

## MEASUREMENTS

Actual Garment Measurements:

**Chest circumference:** 80(90,100,110,120) cm / 31.5(35.5,39.5,43.25,47.25)"

**Length:** 52(53,53.5,54.5,55) cm / 20.5(20.75,21,21.5,21.75)"

Designed to be worn with 4-10cm/1.5-4" positive ease around the bust. When choosing a size, pick the size that is between 4-10cm/1.5-4" larger than your actual bust measurement.

## PATTERN INFORMATION

Here is the Waves top. It is designed to be slightly oversized to give a flowy and relaxed fit.

This pattern is suitable for advanced-beginner levelled crocheters.

## INFO AND TIPS

### Gauge



## CHAIN CORD

**Step 1:** Using colour Artichoke and two strands held together make a slip knot (for the purpose of the pictures, I am using two contrasting colours for this). Now separate the two strands so one is at the top (working yarn) and one at the bottom (waste yarn),





**Step 2:** Wrap the waste yarn front to back around the hook,



**Step 3:** Wrap the working yarn back to front around the hook and draw through all loops on the hook (this completes 1 chain)



Repeat steps 1 and 2 for as many chains as the pattern calls for. At the end, fasten off the waste yarn (yarn at the bottom)

## BODY - make 2

### Set-up row

Using the chain cord method and colour Artichoke, ch 64(72,80,88,96), fasten off waste yarn, turn,

**Note:** At the end of each row you will change colours, do not fasten off the colours but carry them up the edge of the work. Make sure that you leave some slack when doing this so it does not create negative tension.

**Row 1 [WS]:** place a standing dc in first st, dc back into the same st, dc in next 2, \*sk 2, dc in next 3, ch 2, dc in next 3\* rep until 5 sts remain, sk 2, dc in next 2, dc 2 in last st, change to colour turkish blue, turn, {64(72,80,88,96) incl chs}

**Row 2 [RS]:** place a standing dc in first st, dc back into the same st, dc-blo in next 2, \*sk 2, dc-blo in next 2, dc in blo of 1st ch, ch 2, dc in blo of next ch, dc in blo in next 2\* rep until 5 sts remain, sk 2, dc-blo in next 2, dc 2 in last st, change to colour misty violet, turn, {64(72,80,88,96) incl chs}

**Row 3 [WS]:** place a standing dc in first st, dc back into the same st, dc in next 2, \*sk 2, dc in next 2, (dc 1, ch 2, dc 1) in ch 2 sp, dc in next 2\* rep until 5 sts remain, sk 2, dc in next 2, dc 2 in last st, change to next available colour on the side, turn, {64(72,80,88,96) incl chs}

**Row 4 [RS]:** place a standing dc in first st, dc back into the same st, dc-blo in next 2, \*sk 2, dc-blo in next 2, dc in blo of 1st ch, ch 2, dc in blo of next ch, dc in next 2\* rep until 5 sts remain, sk 2, dc-blo in next 2, dc 2 in last st, change to next available colour on the side, turn, {64(72,80,88,96) incl chs}

Repeat rows 3 and 4 until your panel measures 52(53,53.5,54.5,55)cm, do not fasten off, turn,

### Final Row

**If your next row is RS facing:** ch 1, sc 2 in first st, \*hdc-blo 1, dc-blo 1, ex-dc-blo in next 2, dc-blo 1, hdc-blo 1, sc the next two chs together using the blo\* repeat until 7 sts remain,



hdc-blo 1, dc-blo 1, ex-dc-blo in the next 2, dc-blo 1, hdc-blo 1, sc 2 in last st, fasten off.  
 {59(66,73,80,87)}

**If your next row is WS facing:** ch 1, sc 2 in first st, \*hdc 1, dc 1, ex-dc 2, dc 1, hdc 1, sc 1 in ch2sp\* repeat until 7 sts remain, hdc 1, dc 1, ex-dc 2, dc 1, hdc 1, sc 2 in last st, fasten off.

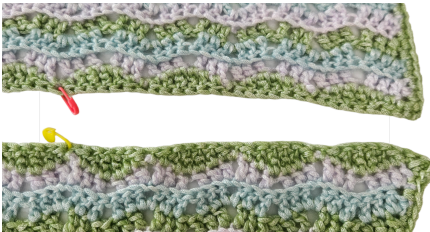
### Side of the panel edging

Using colour artichoke, and right side facing, attach yarn in the corner, place 2 sc for each row along the edge, making sure to encase the carried yarn, fasten off, and repeat for the other side and the two sides on the other panel.



### Seaming the shoulders to make the neck opening

With the RSs facing and working along the final row of the panels, insert stitch markers in the 22nd(22nd,26th,28th,30th) st from both outside edges. Feel free to adjust this for a smaller/larger neck opening.



Repeat for both sides

Working with the RS facing, WS together

**Step 1:** Attach yarn in the first/last sc made on the side edging, ch 3,



**Step 2:** Now grab the second panel slst into the first/last sc made on the side edging, ch 3,



**Step 3:** working back on the other panel, slst into the first/last sc made on the final row of the panels, ch 3,



**Step 4:** working back on the other panel, slst into the first/last sc made on the final row of the panels,

**Step 5:** \*ch 3, working back on the other panel, sk 1 st, slst in the next st\* repeat until you reach the st markers, fasten off.



### Seaming the sides

With the RSs facing and working along the side rows of the panels, insert stitch markers in the 50th(50th,48th,48th,46th) st from bottom edge. Feel free to adjust this for a smaller/larger arm opening.

### Repeat for both sides

### Working with the RS facing, WS together

**Step 1:** Attach yarn in the first/last sc made on the side edging, ch 3,

**Step 2:** Now grab the second panel slst into the first/last sc made on the side edging,

**Step 3:** \*ch 3, working back on the other panel, sk 1 st, slst in the next st\* repeat until you reach the st markers, fasten off.

### Edging

Sc around the armholes

Enjoy!
