MATERIALS

Friends Wool

2 skeins of col. 63
2 skeins of col. 117
1 skein of col. 01
1 skein of col. 109

Crochet hook 5 mm / US H/8
Crochet hook 2.5 mm / US C/2
Zipper 40 cm / 15.7"
Pillow 42 x 42 cm / 16.5 x 16.5"
Darning needle

YARN QUALITY

 **Friends Wool**, Hobbii
100 % Wool
50 g / 1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

GAUGE (DC)

10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" = 16 sts x 7 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain
sc = single crochet
dc = double crochet

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 44 cm / 17.3"
Length: 42 cm / 16.5"

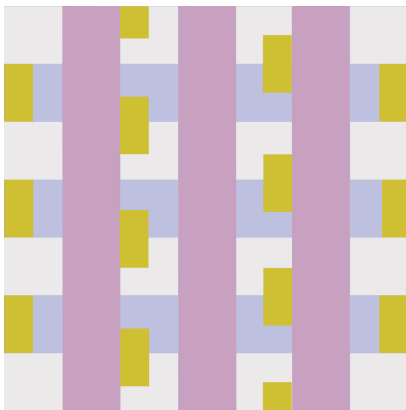

PANELS (MAKE 2)



Start with Light Gray 117 and a 5 mm hook.

Ch 70, Crochet in rows.

Row 1: (Light Gray 117) ch 2, skip 3 ch , dc 9, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Olive 109) dc 5, (Light Gray 117) dc 5, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Light Gray 117) dc 10, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Light Gray 117) dc 10

Row 2: (Light Gray 117) ch 3, turn, dc 9, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Light Gray 117) dc 10, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Light Gray 117) dc 5, (Olive 109) dc 5, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Light Gray 117) dc 10

Row 3: (Light Gray 117) ch 3, turn, dc 9, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Light Gray 117) dc 10, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Light Gray 117) dc 5, (Olive 109) dc 5, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Light Gray 117) dc 10

Row 4: (Light Gray 117) ch 3, turn, dc 9, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Olive 109) dc 5, (Light Gray 117) dc 5, repeat two times: (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Light Gray 117) dc 10

Row 5: (Olive 109) ch 3, turn, dc 4, (White 01) dc 5, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (White 01) dc 10, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (White 01) dc 5, (Olive 109) dc 5, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (White 01) dc 5, (Olive 109) dc 5

Row 6-7: (Olive 109) ch 3, turn, dc 4, (White 01) dc 5, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Olive 109) dc 5, (White 01) dc 5, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (White 01) dc 10, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (White 01) dc 5, (Olive 109) dc 5

Row 8: repeat row 5

Row 9: repeat row 4

Row 10: repeat row 3

Row 11: repeat row 2

Row 12: (Light Gray 117) ch 3, turn, dc 9, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Olive 109) dc 5, (Light Gray 117) dc 5, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Light Gray 117) dc 10, (Lilac 63) dc 10, (Light Gray 117) dc 10

Row 13: repeat row 5

Row 14-15: repeat row 6 and 7

Row 16: repeat row 5

Row 17: repeat row 4

Row 18: repeat row 3

Row 19: repeat row 2

Row 20: repeat row 1

Row 21: repeat row 5

Row 22 -23: Repeat row 6 and 7

Row 24: repeat row 5

Row 25: repeat row 4

Row 26: repeat row 3

Row 27: repeat row 2

Row 28: repeat row 1

Fasten off and weave in the ends.

ASSEMBLE

Take one panel and lay it over the other so that both panels have their right sides facing outward. Now, use single crochet stitches to create an edge around three sides of the pillow. Leave one side open without stitching so that you can easily add a zipper to that side later on:

Sc in the next 55 stitches on one side, 3 sc in the corner, sc 68 in the bottom of the pillow, 3sc in the corner, 55 stitches on the other side. Fasten off and weave in the ends.

ADD ZIPPER

Take a pen or pencil and make 24 dots on both sides of the zipper, resulting in a total of 48 dots. These dots will act as a reference for where you need to cut small holes using scissors. I made 24 holes on each side so that I could fit 3 stitches in every hole. This is because my panels had 70 stitches each.

Using a 2.5 mm crochet hook, I made 3 single crochet stitches in each of these holes. To begin, I single crocheted into a stitch on my front panel and inserted the hook into each hole, repeating this same process for the back panel on the opposite side of the zipper. To transition between front and back, make a couple of single crochets between the panels to change side. Finally fasten off and weave in the ends.
