MATERIALS

2 skeins of Friends Cotton 8/8 Col 63 2 skeins of Rainbow Cotton 8/8 Col 071 1 skein of Rainbow Cotton 8/8 Col 031

Crochet hook 3.5 mm / E-4 US Lilac Jumbo zipper Scissors Yarn needle Thread and needle 2 Lobster Clasps 2 D rings

YARN QUALITY

100 % Cotton 50 g / 1.75 oz = 75 m / 82 yds

Rainbow Cotton 8/8, Hobbii 100 % Cotton 50 g / 1.75 oz = 75 m / 82 yds

GAUGE

24 hdc sl st blo x 23 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

ABBREVIATIONS

Ch = chain
Sc = single crochet
Hdc = half double crochet
Hdc sl st = half double crochet slip stitch
Blo = back loop only
Inc = increase
Sts = stitches

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Total Length: 110 cm / 43.25" Leash Width: 3 cm / 1.25"

Fanny pack Width: 13 cm / 5" Fanny pack length: 35 cm / 13.75"

FANNY PACK

Main Panel (Make 2)

Ch 5. Crochet in rows. Alternate col. 63 and col. 71 every row.

Row 1: hdc sl st 4 starting from the second chain from the hook. Ch 1, turn. (4)

Row 2: hdc sl st blo 3, inc* in the next stitch, ch 1, turn (5)

*Here's how to increase (inc):

Make 2 hdc sl st blo in the same stitch.

Row 3: inc in the first stitch, hdc sl st blo 4, ch 1, turn (6)

Row 4: hdc sl st blo 5, inc* in the next stitch, ch 1, turn (7)

Row 5: inc in the first stitch, hdc sl st blo 6, ch 1, turn (8)

Keep increasing on only one side of the project until you reach row 20.

Rows 21-40: hdc sl st blo all. Ch 1 and turn at the end of each round. (23)

Row 41: Start with a dec*, then hdc sl st blo 21, ch1 and turn. (22)

*Here's how to decrease (dec):

Insert your hook in the first stitch (blo), pull up a loop, insert your hook in the next stitch, pull up a loop, then pull through all the loops on your hook.

Row 42: hdc sl st blo 20, dec, ch 1 and turn. (21)

Row 43: dec, hdc sl st blo 19, ch 1 and turn. (20)

Row 44: hdc sl st blo 18, dec, ch 1 and turn. (19)

Keep decreasing on only one side of the project until row 60. Weave in the ends and block your panel. Crochet a hdc border on the top of the piece.





Pocket (optional)

Ch 48. Crochet in rows. Alternate col. 63 and col. 71 every row. Row 1: hdc sl st 47 starting from the second chain from the hook. Ch 1, turn. (47) Row 2-20: hdc sl st blo all. Ch 1 and turn at the end of each round. (47) Weave in the ends.

Make a fold at the top of the piece, 10 sts long. Secure it in place with thread and needle in a color similar to your yarn.



ASSEMBLY

Sew the Jumbo zipper by aligning both panels with the sides of the zipper. Use your preferred method to attach the zipper; I'm using a sewing machine.

If you want to attach your zipper with a hook, here's a tutorial:

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Once the zipper is sewn in, crochet a sc border all around the fanny pack. Make sure the panels line up nicely with the striped pattern.



Attach the pocket between rows 20 and 40 of the main panels using thread and needle in a color similar to your yarn. Ensure the pocket aligns nicely with the striped pattern.

To complete your fanny pack, attach one lobster clasp to the right side of the bag and a D-ring to the left side using yarn and a yarn needle.







LEASH

I'm making my leash 160 cm / 63 inches long. I'll use 60 cm / 23.75 inches for the crossbody part (which I'll later attach to the fanny pack), and 100 cm / 39.5 inches for the rest of the leash. You can adjust the length of the foundation chain as needed.

Ch 385. Crochet in rows. Alternate each row with Alternate col. 63, col. 71 and col.31. Row 1: starting from the second ch from the hook, crochet 384 hdc sl st, ch 1, turn. (384) Rows 2-7: 384 hdc sl st blo, ch 1, turn. (384)

Fasten off and weave the ends.



To attach the clasps, work on both ends of the leash by crocheting in rows with col. 63.

Row 1: sc 7, ch 1, turn. (7) Row 2: dec, sc 3, dec, ch 1, turn. (5) Rows 3-5: sc 5, ch 1, turn. (5)

Leave a long tail for sewing.

Fold the short col. 63 strap we just created through the lobster clasp on one end and through the D-ring on the other end. Then, sew the ends of the strap to the leash, creating a loop.









Now create the crossbody strap by measuring 60 cm / 23.75 inches and sewing a D-ring onto the leash using your yarn and yarn needle. Feel free to adjust the length to fit your body measurements.

Tip: You can measure your waist and make it a belt instead.
