

PULSE - BUCKET HAT

Striped chunky bucket hat with extended brim



The onset of cooler weather doesn't have to mean packing up your beloved bucket hats. Keep the trend alive with the Pulse Bucket Hat. This cute striped bucket hat is made with chunky yarn in a two-tone pattern that really pops. The extended brim means you can fold it, roll it, or wear it straight. No matter how you style it, you'll be reaching for this bucket hat all season long.

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PROJECT SUPPLIES

YARN: Hobbii Happy Place Apricity, super bulky weight (#6); 65% alpaca, 28% polyamide, 7% wool [76 yards per 50g skein].

Sample uses 2 skeins of color 08 (A) and 1 skein of color 23 (B) for both sizes.

HOOK: US J/10 (6mm) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge.

NOTIONS: Scissors, tapestry needle, locking stitch markers, steam blocking supplies.

DIMENSIONS

SIZE: 1 (2). Measurements taken after light steam blocking:

- Circumference 20 (22.5)" (50.75 (56) cm)
- Crown height 6.25" (15.75cm). Crown height measured from Round 1 of Crown to bottom edge of Body when laid flat.

GAUGE: 3" (7.5cm) = 8 sts x 8 rows in single crochet

ABBREVIATIONS

CC = change color
Ch = chain
MR = magic ring
RS = right side
Sc = single crochet
Sk = skip
Sl St(s) = slip stitch(es)
St = stitch

PATTERN DIRECTIONS

NOTE

- Hat crown will curl a bit as you work your rounds. This is normal, and we will address this with blocking at the end.
- Pattern is written for the smallest size, with adjustments for the larger size in parentheses.
- Carry colors not in use up side of work until instructed to fasten off.
- Portions of this pattern are written in crochet shorthand. For example “2sc” means to place 2 single crochet in the same stitch (increase made). “Sc 2” means to place a single crochet in each of the next 2 stitches.

HAT PATTERN

CROWN

ROUND 1 (RS): With A, ch 1 and sc 8 in MR, close ring, continue to work in a spiral. (8 sc)

ROUND 2: 2sc in each st around. (16 sc)

From here, place a marker on the first stitch of each round and move it up as you make more rounds.

ROUND 3: (2sc, sc 1) around. (24 sc)

ROUND 4: (Sc 2, 2sc) around. (32 sc)

ROUND 5: (2sc, sc 3) around. (40 sc)

ROUND 6: Sc 2, 2sc, (sc 4, 2sc) around to last 2, sc 2. (48 sc)

ROUND 7: (2sc, sc 5) around. (56 sc)

For larger size only

ROUND 8: Sc 3, 2sc, (sc 6, 2sc) around to last 3, sc 3. (64 sc)

BODY

ROW 1 (RS): Continuing with A, ch 11, sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across to Crown, sl st in st at base of ch and next sc on Crown, turn. (10 sc)

ROW 2: Sk 2 sl sts, sc in each sc across row, cc to B, turn.

ROW 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across to Crown, sl st in each of the next 2 sts on Crown, turn.

ROW 4: Sk 2 sl sts, sc in each sc across row, cc to A, turn.

Repeat Rows 3-4 around Crown of hat, changing color every 2 rows. Keep both colors attached to work and carry them along as you progress.

After last row, fasten off both colors, leaving a long tail of the last color for seaming. Whip stitch seam the first and last rows together using the attached tail.

Weave in all ends.

BRIM

ROUND 1 (RS): With A, join with a sl st at seam of Body, ch 1, sc in each row end around, catching the yarn floats in your stitches, join with a sl st in first sc of round. Continue to work in a spiral. [56 (64) sc]

From here, place a marker on the first stitch of each round and move it up as you make more rounds.

ROUND 2: Sc in each st around.

ROUND 3: Evenly place 6 stitch markers around the Brim, sc in each st around, placing 2sc in each marked st, drop markers. [62 (70) sc]

ROUNDS 4-7: Repeat Rounds 2-3 two times. [74 (82) sc]

ROUND 8: Repeat Round 2.

ROUND 9: Sl st loosely in each st around.

Fasten off. Weave in any remaining ends. Lightly steam block to final dimensions. When steam blocking the Crown, place a round of cardboard or some other rigid material to help flatten the crown.



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
