NOAH - BABY BLANKET

Bias linen stitch receiving blanket with delicate border



Wrap your precious babe in the luxury of alpaca when you make the Noah Baby Blanket. Simply soothing crochet linen stitch is worked on the bias and striped in two colors to accompany baby in Dreamland. The little ridges border makes for the perfect frame, adding a sweet touch to a blankie that will be used for generations. Lofty super bulky weight yarn means you'll finish this fun project in record time – maybe to start a second one!

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PROJECT SUPPLIES

YARN: Hobbii Happy Place Apricity, super bulky weight (#6); 65% alpaca, 28% polyamide, 7% wool [76 yards per 50g skein].

- A Color 01, 6 skeins
- B Color 03, 7 skeins

HOOK: US M/N (9mm) crochet hook, or size needed to achieve gauge.

NOTIONS: Scissors, tapestry needle, tape measure, steam blocking supplies.

DIMENSIONS

FINISHED SIZE: Blanket measures 38" (96.5cm) square after light steam blocking.

GAUGE: 6" (15.25cm) = 17 sts x 10 rows in (sc 1, ch 1) pattern; ch-1 counted as stitch in gauge measurement

ABBREVIATIONS

CC = change color Ch = chain Dc = double crochet Sc = single crochet Sc2tog = single crochet 2 together Sk = skip Sl St = slip stitch Sp = space St(s) = stitch(es) Yo = yarn over

PATTERN DIRECTIONS

NOTES

COLOR CHANGES: Change color every 2 rows throughout pattern unless otherwise instructed. Keep yarn not in use attached to work; carry both colors up the side as the project progresses.

BLANKET PATTERN

INCREASE SECTION

ROW 1: With A, ch 2, (sc, ch 1, sc) in 2nd ch from hook, turn. *(2 sc)*

ROW 2: Ch 1, sc in st at base of ch, ch 1, sc in next ch-sp, ch 1, sc in last sc, cc to B, turn. (3 sc)

ROW 3: Ch 1, sc in st at base of ch, ch 1, (sc in next ch-sp, ch 1) 2 times, sc in last st, turn. (4 sc)

ROW 4: Ch 1, sc in st at base of ch, ch 1, (sc in next ch-sp, ch 1) to last sc, sc in last st, cc to A, turn. (5 sc)

Repeat Row 4, continuing to change to the next color every 2 rows, until the long sides of your blanket measure 38" (96.5cm). I achieved this after 74 total rows. Continue to Decrease Section.

DECREASE SECTION

ROW 1: With next color in sequence, ch 1, sk sc at base of ch, sc in next ch-sp, (ch 1, sc in next ch-sp) to last ch-sp, ch 1, sc2tog over last ch-sp and last sc of row, turn.

Repeat Row 1 and work in color change sequence until there are 3 sc in working row.

NEXT ROW: Ch 1, sk sc at base of ch, sc in next ch-sp. Ch 1, sc2tog over last ch-sp and last sc of row, turn. (2 sc)

You will be setting up your Border in the next row. If you are not already working with your Border color, change to it in the next row.

LAST ROW: Ch 1, sk sc at base of ch, pull up a loop in next ch-sp and the following sc, yo, pull through all 3 loops.

Continue to Border. Fasten off color no longer in use.

BORDER

ROW 1 (WS): With Border color, sc in row end at base of ch, sc in each row end around, catching the floats of the color changes and ch-2 at corners, sl st in first sc of round to join, turn. Ensure there is an ODD number of stitches on each edge.

ROW 2 (RS): Do not ch, (sl st, ch 2, sl st) in corner ch-2 sp, sl st in next sc, (dc in next st, sl st in following st) to ch-2 sp, [(sl st, ch 2, sl st) in corner ch-2 sp, sl st in next sc, (dc in next st, sl st in next st) to corner ch-2] around, fasten off leaving a 5" (12.75cm) tail, join with an invisible join (<u>tutorial</u>).

Weave in all ends.

Steam block to final dimensions.



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
