Chevron Cardigan with Pockets

MATERIALS

Hobbii Friends Wool Yarn A: Dune (07); 9 (10, 10, 11, 11, 12, 12, 13, 14, 14) balls Yarn B: Chocolate (12); 4 (4, 4, 4, 4, 5, 5, 5, 6, 6) balls Yarn C: Dark Magenta (48); 2 (2, 2, 2, 2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 3) balls Yarn D: Deep Ocean (89); 2 (3, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3, 4) balls

4mm / US 6 circular needles 80-100cm/ 32-40" length and 40cm/ 16" length and needles suitable for working smaller circumferences in the round.

4.5mm / US 7 circular needle 80-100cm/ 32-40" length and 40cm/ 16" length and needles suitable for working smaller circumferences in the round.

Always use a needle size that will result in the correct gauge after blocking.

1 place marker, stitch holder, tapestry needle, 4 x 30mm / 1.1" wooden buttons

YARN QUALITY

Friends Wool, Hobbii
 Worsted weight
 100% Wool
 50 g (1.75 oz) = 100 m (109 yds)

SIZE

1 (2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10)

MEASUREMENTS

Finished chest (fullest point) circumference: 100(108, 115, 122, 129, 137, 144, 151, 158.5, 166)cm / 39¹/₄ (42¹/₂, 45¹/₄, 48, 50³/₄, 54, 56³/₄, 59¹/₂, 62¹/₂, 65¹/₄)", to be worn with 20-30cm / 8-12" positive ease.

Model has a 94cm / 37" chest circumference and is wearing a size 4.

PATTERN INFORMATION

The Ottolie cardigan is knitted from the hem up. Stitches are picked up and sleeves are knitted top down. The body of the cardigan is worked back and forth in one piece to the underarms. Work is then divided into fronts and back and each part is then worked separately. Shoulders are joined using the three-needle bind off method. The sleeves are picked up and worked down in the round. Stitches are picked up around the front and neck for the button band.

GAUGE

22 sts & 25 rows = 10cm / 4" over st st in stranded colourwork on 4.5mm needles after gentle steam blocking.

ABBREVIATIONS

h a n	
beg	Beginning
k	Knit
k2tog	Knit 2 stitches together
LH	Left-hand (e.g. LH needle)

p2tog	Purl 2 stitches together

STITCH GLOSSARY

One Row Buttonhole:

(4 stitches wide - worked over 5 sts)

Step 1: Wyif, sl 1 st from LH needle to RH needle.

Step 2: Wyib slip next st from LH needle to RH needle and pass the first stitch over it to cast it off. Rep Step 2 another 3 times.

Step 3: Slip the last st on the RH needle back to the LH needle and turn work.

Step 4: Wyib, insert the tip of the right needle between the 1st and 2nd stitch on the LH needle and cast on 1 st. Cast on another 4 sts in this method (Cable Cast On Method), turn work.

Step 5: Slip the first stitch from the LH needle to the RH needle, pass the last cast on stitch over this slipped stitch.

PATTERN BEGINS

BODY

Hem

Using smaller, longer circular needles and Yarn A, cast on 202 (218, 234, 250, 266, 282, 298, 314, 330, 346) sts.

Row 1 (RS): K2, [p2, k2] to end. Row 2 (WS): P2, [k2, p2] to end. Rep rows 1-2 a further 6 times.

Next row (RS)(dec): K2tog, k to end. 201 (217, 233, 249, 265, 281, 297, 313, 329, 345) sts Knit 5 rows.

Commence Charts

Change to larger needles.

Next row (RS): Work row 1 of Chart A, working 4-st rep 50 (54, 58, 62, 66, 70, 74, 78, 82, 86) times across row and ending with final st of chart.

Next row (WS): Reading chart from left to right, work first st, then work 4-st rep 50 (54, 58, 62, 66, 70, 74, 78, 82, 86) times to end.

Working next row of Chart A each time, continue as set until round 28 of Chart A is complete.

Insert Pockets

Next row (RS, Row 1 of Chart A): K7 (9, 11, 13, 15, 17, 19, 21, 23, 25), **using shorter circular needle, k32, turn. Work 55 rows in St st over these 32 sts for pocket using the short circular needle, then knit these sts back onto the longer circular needle to complete the pocket**.

K123 (135, 147, 159, 171, 183, 195, 207, 219, 231) sts, rep from ** to ** for left pocket, k7 (9, 11, 13, 15, 17, 19, 21, 23, 25).

Continue Body

Work Rows 2-22 of Chart A.

Shape Neck

Work rows 1-16 of Chart B once. 193 (209, 225, 241, 257, 273, 289, 305, 321, 337) sts

LEFT FRONT

Next row (RS, Row 1 of Chart C): Using yarn B, k2tog, k40 (44, 48, 52, 56, 60, 64, 68, 72, 76), place rem 151 (163, 175, 187, 199, 211, 223, 235, 247, 259) on hold. *41 (45, 49, 53, 57, 61, 65, 69, 73, 77)* sts

Work Rows 2-32 of Chart C over Left Front sts. Rep Rows 1-18 (19, 22, 23, 26, 28, 30, 32, 32, 32) of Chart C once more.

Size 2 ONLY: Purl 1 row in Yarn D.
Size 4 ONLY: Purl 1 row in Yarn A.
Size 9 ONLY: Rep Row 1 of Chart C. Purl 1 row in Yarn B.
Size 10 ONLY: Rep Rows 1-4 of Chart C.

ALL sizes again: Place sts on hold. 29 (33, 36, 40, 43, 47, 50, 54, 57, 61) sts

UPPER BACK

Return 109 (117, 125, 133, 141, 149, 157, 165, 173, 181) sts from stitch holder to needles, leaving rem 42 (46, 50, 54, 57, 62, 66, 70, 74, 78) sts for Right Front on hold.

Set-up row (RS, Row 1 of Chart D): With Yarn B, k to end. Work Rows 2-32 of Chart D over Upper Back sts. Rep Rows 1-17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31, 32, 32) once more.

Size 9 ONLY: Knit 1 row in Yarn B. Size 10 ONLY: Rep Rows 1-3 of Chart D once more.

ALL sizes again

Next row (WS): Work 29 (33, 36, 40, 43, 47, 50, 54, 57, 61) sts in patt, cast off 51 (51, 53, 53, 55, 55, 57, 57, 59, 59) using yarn A (D, C, A, B, B, C, D, B, A), work in patt to end.

ALL sizes again: Place sts on hold.

RIGHT FRONT

Place remaining held sts on needles. Set-up row (RS, Row 1 of Chart E): With yarn B, k to last 2 sts, ssk. 41 (45, 49, 53, 57, 61, 65, 69, 73, 77) sts

Work Rows 2-32 of Chart E. Rep Rows 1-18 (19, 22, 23, 26, 28, 30, 32, 32) once more.

Size 2 ONLY: Purl 1 row in Yarn D.
Size 4 ONLY: Purl 1 row in Yarn A.
Size 9 ONLY: Rep Row 1 of Chart E. Purl 1 row in Yarn B.
Size 10 ONLY: Rep Rows 1-4 of Chart E.

ALL sizes again: Place sts on hold. 29 (33, 36, 40, 43, 47, 50, 54, 57, 61) sts

Join the Shoulders:

Align shoulders with RS together, use 3-needle cast off to join shoulders using colours below. Sizes 1 & 2: Yarn D. Sizes 3 & 7: Yarn C. Sizes 4, 6 & 10: Yarn A. Sizes 5, 8 & 9: Yarn B.

BUTTONBAND

Using smaller, longer circular needle, and yarn A, join yarn with RS facing at hem edge of Right Front, pick up and knit 65 sts up the Right Front to beginning of neck shaping, 66 (68, 70, 72, 74, 76, 78, 80, 82, 84) sts up Right Front neck, 52 (52, 52, 52, 56, 56, 56, 56, 60, 60) sts across the Back Neck, 66 (68, 70, 72, 74, 76, 78, 80, 82, 84) down Left Front neck, and 65 sts down Left Front. Total should be a multiple of 4+2 sts. 314 (318, 322, 326, 334, 338, 342, 346, 354, 358) sts Knit 6 rows.

Row 1 (WS): P2, [k2, p2] to end. **Row 2 (RS):** K2, [p2, k2] to end, Rep rows 1-2 a further 2 times.

Buttonhole Row (WS): Work 251 (255, 259, 263, 271, 275, 279, 283, 291, 295) sts in rib, until there are 63 sts rem on LH needle, [make buttonhole, work 13 sts in patt] 3 times, work buttonhole, work in patt to end.

Rep rows 1-2 a further 3 times. Cast off in patt.

SLEEVES

With RS facing and yarn A, using larger needles suitable for working small circumferences in the round, beg at underarm, pick up and knit 104 (108, 112, 116, 120, 124, 128, 132, 136, 140) sts around armhole. Join for working in the round and PM to indicate beg of round.

Work rounds 2-28 of Chart F. Rep rounds 1-28 of Chart F a further 2 (2, 2, 2, 2, 2, 1, 1, 1, 1) times. Rep rounds 1-11 (11, 7, 7, 4, 0, 25, 25, 21, 21) once more.

Cuff

Change to smaller needles suitable for working small circumferences in the round.

Round 1: [K2, k2tog] around. 78 (81, 84, 87, 90, 93, 96, 99, 102, 105) sts Round 2: P to end. Round 3: K to end. Rep rounds 2-3 a further 2 times.

Sizes 1, 3, 5, 7 & 9 ONLY: [K1, k2tog, p1, p2tog] to end. 52 (-, 56, -, 60, -, 64, -, 68, -) Sizes 2, 4, 6, 8 & 10 ONLY: K2, [p1, p2tog, k1, k2tog] to last 7 sts, p2, k1, k2tog, p2. - (56, -, 60, -, 64, -, 68, -, 72)

Work 13 rounds in 2x2 Rib. Cast off in patt.


FINISHING

Sew up pocket sides. Weave in ends and gently steam block to measurements. Sew buttons opposite buttonholes.


SCHEMATIC



- A. Chest Circumference: 100 (108, 115, 122, 129, 137, 144, 151, 158.5, 166)cm / 39¹/₄ (42¹/₂, 451/4, 48, 503/4, 54, 563/4, 591/2, 621/2, 651/4)"
- B. Length to underarm: 35cm / 13³/₄"
- C. Armhole depth: 21.5 (23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28.5, 30, 31, 32)cm / 81/2 (9, 91/2, 93/4, 10, 101/2, 111/4, 113/4, 121/4, 121/2)"
- D. Upper arm circumference: 47 (49, 50, 52, 54, 56, 58, 60, 62, 64) cm / 181/2 (191/4, 193/4, 201/2, 211/4, 22, 223/4, 231/2, 241/2, 251/4)"
- E. Cuff circumference: 19 (20.5, 20.5, 22, 22, 23.5, 23.5, 25, 25, 26.5) cm / 71/2 (8, 8, 83/4, 83/4, 91/4, 91/4, 93/4, 93/4, 101/2)"
- F. Sleeve length: 45 (45, 43.5, 43.5, 42, 41, 39, 39, 38, 38) cm / 17³/₄ (17³/₄, 17, 17, 16¹/₂, 16, 15¹/₂, 15¹/₂, 15, 15)"
- G. Neck width: 23 (23, 24, 24, 25, 25, 26, 26, 27, 27) cm / 9 (9, 9¹/₂, 9¹/₂, 9³/₄, 9³/₄, 10¹/₄, 10¹/₄, 10³/₄, 103/4)"
- H. Shoulder width: 13 (15, 16.5, 18, 19.5, 21.5, 22.5, 24.5, 26, 27.5) cm / 5¹/₄ (6, 7, 7³/₄, 8¹/₂, 9¹/₂, 10¹/₄, 10³/₄)"


