MATERIALS

Rainbow Bamboo

1 skein of color 21 (A) 1 skein of color 03 (B)

Circular needle 4.5 mm, 100 cm / US 7, 40" Measuring tape Scissors Stitch markers Tapestry needle

YARN QUALITY

Rainbow Bamboo, Hobbii 60% Bamboo Viscose, 40% Cotton 100 g / 3.5 oz = 250 m / 273 yds

GAUGE

16 sts x 21 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit k2tog = knit 2 stitches together m = marker p = purl pm = place marker RS = right side sm = slip marker ssk = slip, slip, knit WS = wrong side yo = yarn over

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 132 cm / 52" Length: 38 cm / 15"

PATTERN INFORMATION

This boho chic wrap is the perfect beginner-friendly project. Knit the Anton Shawl if you're in the mood for playful color blocking, stripes, and a sprinkling of delicate eyelets. The shawl is finished with easy-to-learn textured stitches for beautiful dimension. Knit from the top down with luxurious bamboo and cotton blend yarn, this shawl creates a flattering half-moon shape that drapes effortlessly.

INFO AND TIPS

Pattern is worked flat. Increases are worked on RS (knit side). Yarn overs form a column. Keep a keen eye on ensuring your yarn overs are forming a straight line.

On each RS row, the first 2 stitches are always followed by a yarn over, and the last 2 stitches are always preceded by a yarn over.

We recommend a light steam block to open the lace.

CONSTRUCTION

Using yarn A, cast on 17 sts using preferred cast-on method.

Section 1

Row 1 (RS): K2, pm, yo, k2, pm, yo, k2, pm, yo, k5, yo, pm, k2, yo, pm, k2, yo, pm, k2 = 23 stitches.

Row 2 (WS): Purl to end.

Row 3 (RS): K2, sm, yo, knit to next m, sm, yo, knit to next m, sm, yo (should be at beginning of center section), knit to next m, yo, sm, knit to next m, yo, sm, knit to last m, yo, sm, k2 (6 stitches increased).

Row 4 (WS): Purl to end.

Repeat (Rows 3 and 4) 35 more times, ending with a WS row (piece measures approximately $25.5 \text{ cm} / 10^{\circ}$ from center of cast-on edge) = 239 stitches.

<u>Section 2</u> – Stripes (when changing yarn colors, carry your yarn up the side edge)

Set 1: Using yarn B, repeat Rows 3 and 4 (6 stitches increased).

Set 2: Using yarn A, repeat Rows 3 and 4 (6 stitches increased).

Work Sets 1 and 2 a total of 3 times (6 stripes) = 275 stitches. Cut yarn A.



Section 3

Continuing with yarn B, work (Rows 3 and 4) 8 more times, ending with a WS row = 323 stitches.

Section 4

Row 1 (RS): P2, sm, yo, purl to next m, sm, yo, purl to next m, sm, yo, purl to next m, yo, sm, purl to next m, yo, sm, purl to last m, yo, sm, p2 = 329 stitches.

Row 2 (WS): Knit to end.

Row 3: Repeat Row 1 = 335 stitches.

Row 4: Purl to end.

Section 5 - Lacework

Row 1 (RS): K2, yo, (k7, k2tog, yo) to last 9 stitches, k7, yo, k2 = 337 stitches.

Row 2 (WS): Purl to end.

Row 3: K2, yo, k2, (k4, ssk, yo, k1, yo, k2tog) to last 9 stitches, k7, yo, k2 = 339 stitches

Row 4: Purl to end.

Row 5: K2, yo, knit to last 2 sts, yo, k2 = 341 stitches.

Row 6: Knit to end.

Row 7: K2, yo, knit to last 2 sts, yo, k2 = 343 stitches.

Row 8: Knit to end.

Do not cut yarn B.

Switch to yarn A.

Row 9 (RS): K2, yo, knit to last 2 sts, yo, k2 = 345 stitches.

Row 10 (WS): Knit to end.

Cut yarn A.

Switch to yarn B.

Row 11 (RS): K2, yo, knit to last 2 sts, yo, k2 = 347 stitches.

Row 12 (WS): Knit to end.

Row 13: K2, yo, knit to last 2 sts, yo, k2 = 349 stitches.

Bind off as follows: K2, slip 2 stitches from right needle to left needle, k2tog through the backloop, *k1, slip 2 stitches from right needle to left needle, k2tog through the back loop; repeat from * to end. Pull yarn through the last stitch. Cut yarn. Weave in tail.
