# Ganseley

Unisex slipover

## MATERIALS

4 (5) 5 (6) 7 skeins of **Highland Wool** color (32)  
Chili

Circular needle 3.5 (US 4) and 4 mm (US 6) – 60  
cm (24")  
Stitch markers

## YARN QUALITY

 **Highland Wool**, Hobbii  
100 % Wool  
50 g (1.75 oz) = 175 m (191 yds)

## GAUGE

24 sts x 32 rows = 10 x 10 cm (4 x 4") with  
needle 4 mm (US 6) in stockinette stitch

## ABBREVIATIONS

st(s) = stitch(es)  
k = knit  
p = purl  
rnd(s) = round(s)  
RS = right side  
WS = wrong side  
co = cast on  
bo = bind off  
BOR = beginning of round

## SIZE

S (M) L (XL) 2XL

## MEASUREMENTS

Width: 42 (46) 50 (54) 58 cm / 16.5" (18") 19.7"  
(21.3") 22.8"  
Length: 50 (52) 54 (56) 58 cm / 19.7" (20.5")  
21.3" (22") 22.8"

## ABOUT THE PATTERN

With a simple pattern consisting of knit and purl  
stitches, you create a beautiful, warm slipover –  
perfect for the cold months. The slipover is  
worked bottom up. The bottom ribbing is  
worked first. The body is then worked in pattern  
until you reach the armholes. At the armholes,  
the work is divided into front piece and back  
piece which are then worked separately. The  
ribbings along the neck opening and armholes  
are folded and knit together.

Gansey has a classic fit – choose the size that  
fits your actual bust measurement.

# Pattern



## INFORMATION AND TIPS

The slipover is worked bottom up. The bottom ribbing is worked first. The body is then worked in pattern in the round until you reach the armholes. At the armholes, the work is divided into front piece and back piece which are then worked separately.

## Pattern

### Pattern in the round

Rnd 1: K to end.

Rnd 2: K to end.

Rnd 3: \*K1, p1; repeat from \* to end.

Repeat rnds 1-3 as stated in the pattern.

### Pattern in the flat

Rows with even numbers: Work as established.

Row 1: K to end.

Row 3: \*K1, p1; repeat from \* until 1 st remains, k1.

Repeat rows 1-3 as stated in the pattern.

## Body

Using circular needle 3.5 mm (US 4), co 200 (224) 240 (264) 280 sts. Work rib stitch in the round like this: \*K2, p2; repeat from \* while placing markers as follows: Place marker, work rib stitch across 100 (112) 120 (132) 140 sts, place marker, work rib stitch to end. Continue working rib stitch until the work measures 4 (4) 4 (4) 4 cm / 1.6" (1.6") 1.6" (1.6") 1.6". Change to needle 4 mm (US 6).

Work pattern in the round as follows: Work pattern (see "Pattern in the round") until the work measures 29 (30) 31 (32) 33 cm / 11.4" (11.8") 12.2" (12.6") 13.0" as follows: From BOR, bo 4 (4) 5 (6) 7 sts, work 91 (103) 119 (119) 125 sts, bo 9 (9) 11 (13) 15 sts, work until 5 (5) 6 (7) 8 sts remain, bo 5 (5) 6 (7) 8 sts, cut off the yarn. There are now 182 (206) 218 (238) 250 sts on the needle. Now the work is divided into back piece and front piece.

### Back piece

Work in the flat and continue in pattern across the 91 (103) 109 (119) 125 sts (see "Pattern in the flat"). Bo more sts for the armhole at the beginning of each row on the RS and WS of the back piece as follows:

\*Bo 2 (2) 2 (2) 2 sts on each side; repeat from \* a total of 3 (3) 3 (5) 5 times = 79 (91) 97 (99) 105 sts.

\*Bo 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 st on each side; repeat from \* a total of 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 times = 71 (83) 89 (89) 95 sts.

Work until the armhole measures 19 (20) 21 (22) 23 cm / 7.5" (7.9") 8.3" (8.7") 13". Bo the 35 (41) 43 (43) 47 middle sts for the neck and finish the shoulders separately.

#### *Left shoulder*

Begin binding off for the neckline at the left side of the neck opening. Bo 2 sts at the beginning of the row and work pattern to end. Then bo 1 st at the beginning of the next row at the neck opening.

Work even until the work measures 50 (52) 54 (56) 58 cm / 19.7" (20.5") 21.3" (22") 22.8". Put the remaining 15 (18) 20 (20) 21 sts on hold on a needle.

#### *Right shoulder*

Proceed as follows: Bo 2 sts at the beginning of the row at the neck opening and work pattern to end. Then bo 1 st at the beginning of the next row at the neck opening.

Work even until the work measures 50 (52) 54 (56) 58 cm / 19.7" (20.5") 21.3" (22") 22.8". Put the remaining 15 (18) 20 (20) 21 sts on hold on a needle.

### **Front piece**

Follow the same procedure as for the back piece until the work measures 41 (43) 45 (47) 49 cm / 16.1" (16.9") 17.7" (18.5") 19.3".

Bo the 27 (33) 35 (35) 39 middle sts for the neck and finish the shoulders separately.

#### *Left shoulder*

Begin at the left-hand side of the neck opening (RS of the work). Bo on every other row at the beginning of the row as follows:

\*Bo 2 (2) 2 (2) 2 sts, work pattern to end; repeat from \* a total of 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 time.

\*Bo 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 st, work pattern to end; repeat from \* a total of 5 (5) 5 (5) 5 times.

Work even until the work measures 50 (52) 54 (56) 58 cm / 19.7" (20.5") 21.3" (22") 22.8". Put the remaining 15 (18) 20 (20) 21 sts on hold on a needle.

#### *Right shoulder*

Begin at the right-hand side of the neck opening (WS of the work). Bo on every other row at the beginning of the row as follows:

\*Bo 2 (2) 2 (2) 2 sts, work pattern to end; repeat from \* a total of 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 time.

\*Bo 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 st, work pattern to end; repeat from \* a total of 5 (5) 5 (5) 5 times.

Work even until the work measures 50 (52) 54 (56) 58 cm / 19.7" (20.5") 21.3" (22") 22.8". Put the remaining 15 (18) 20 (20) 21 sts on hold on a needle.

### **Shoulder**

The two shoulders are knit together by turning the work onto the WS and proceeding as follows: Place the two needles with the sts on hold RS against RS and hold them with your left hand. Knit the first st on one needle together with the first st on the second needle while simultaneously

binding off loosely by passing the previous st over the most recently knit st. Same procedure for the second shoulder.

### Armholes

Work the armhole ribbing as follows:

Using circular needle 3.5 mm (US 4), pick up sts in each st along the armhole. Pick up approx. 120 (128) 136 (144) 152 sts and make sure that you reach an even number.

Work 5 (5) 5 (5) 5 cm / 2" (2") 2" (2") 2" in rib stitch (k2, p2).

Fold and knit the armhole ribbing together. Same procedure for the second armhole.

### Neckline ribbing

Using needle 3.5 mm (US 4), pick up approx. 120 (128) 136 (144) 152 sts along the neck opening from the RS of the work. Work rib stitch (k2, p2) in the round until the ribbing measures 5 (5) 5 (5) 5 cm / 2" (2") 2" (2") 2". Fold and knit the neckline ribbing together.

### Finishing

Weave in all ends on the WS by sewing into the top part of the sts so that it is invisible from the RS. Wash the slipover according to the instructions on the yarn label. Place the slipover on a dry towel and pull it into the correct measurements to make sure it dries in the correct shape.
