# Honeyflower

## Slipover

Design: Jane Green - Beautiful Crochet Stuff | Hobbii Design

## MATERIALS

### Pearly Haze

7, 10, 12, 14, 17 skeins of col. 21

Crochet hook 4 mm / US G/6

## YARN QUALITY

 **Pearly Haze**, Hobbii

73% Viscose, 27% Wool,  
50 g (1.75 oz) = 110 m (120 yds)

## GAUGE

Flower = 5 cm x 5 cm / 2" x 2"

## ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain

sl st = slip stitch

sc = single crochet

dc = double crochet

puff st = puff stitch (Yarn over, insert hook into stitch, pull up a loop (3 loops on hook); repeat [yarn over, insert hook, pull up a loop] 4 more times (11 loops on hook); yarn over, pull through all loops)

Rep = repeat

## SIZE

(1), 2, 3, 4, 5

## MEASUREMENTS

Width, without ties: (38), 42, 50, 56, 61 cm / (15"), 16.5", 19.7", 22", 24"

Length: (51), 51, 51, 60, 60 cm / (20"), 20", 20", 23.5", 23.5" or preferred length

## PATTERN INFORMATION

This slipover is a simple and enjoyable project, suitable for both beginners and experienced crocheters. It's made entirely of puff stitch flowers, joined together to create a lightweight and textured piece. The pattern includes clear instructions on how to crochet each flower and how to join them, along with a helpful photo guide for beginners. Detailed diagrams show the layouts, making it easy to connect the flowers.

## INFO AND TIPS

How to choose the right size:

The width of the slipover is measured without the ties. The ties will add extra width, which you can adjust when layering it over a shirt or dress.

You can make the slipover shorter or longer by making fewer or extra rows of flowers.

Remember to buy extra yarn if you add length to your slipover.

## FLOWER PATTERN

Ch 4, join with sl st to the first ch.

Round 1: Ch 1, 12 sc into the circle, join with sl st to the first sc.

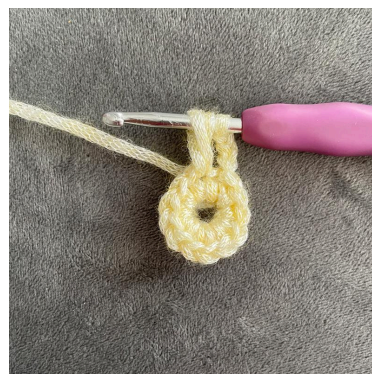
Round 2: Ch 3, puff st in next sc, ch 3, sl st in next sc, \* ch 3, puff st in next sc, ch 3, sl st in next sc \*\*, rep from \* to \*\* four times, join with sl st to the first ch. 6 petals.

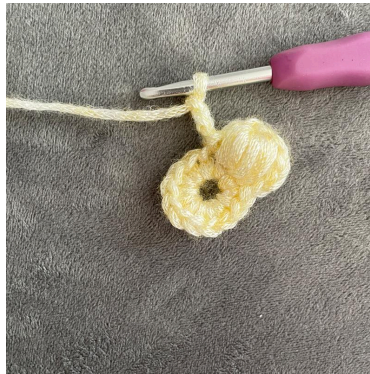

## JOINING

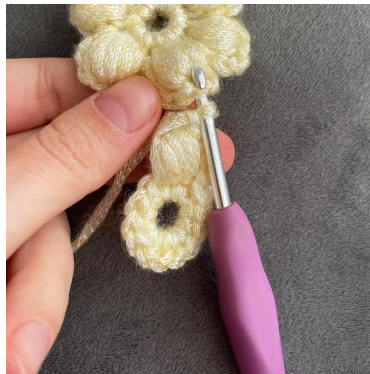
NOTE: You only need to complete the first flower. For each subsequent flower, crochet only the first round, then join each new flower one by one to the previous flower while working the 2nd round in a zigzag sequence. Start joining from the down left corner.

Round 2: Ch 3, puff st in next sc, ch 1 (photo 1), connect with sl st to top of any petal of the first flower (photo 2), ch 2, sl st in next sc of the unfinished flower, ch 3 (photo 3), puff st in next sc, ch 1, connect with sl st to top of next petal of the first flower (photo 4), ch 2, sl st in next sc of the unfinished flower, finish the flower.

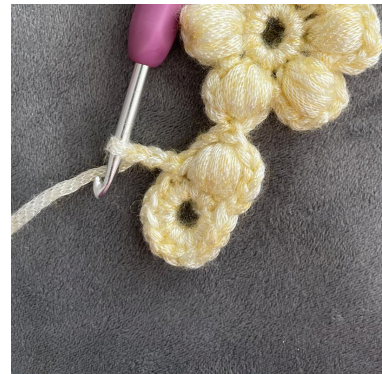
Connect the third flower to the first flower at the two upper left petals (photo 6, the upper flower).

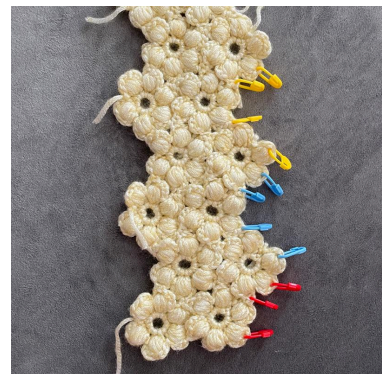
Then, continue connecting the flowers according to the scheme (photo 7 below). The second connected vertical row of flowers is shown in photo 8, along with the marked points for the third row of flowers. The third connected row of flowers, with marked points for the next row of flowers, is shown in photo 9. I recommend marking the connection points to avoid errors when attaching the flowers.

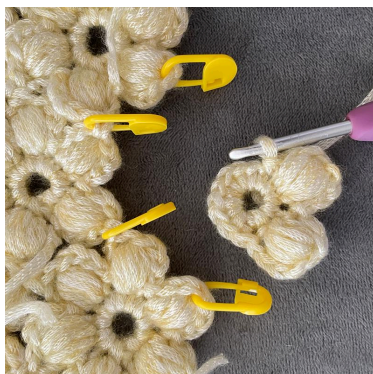

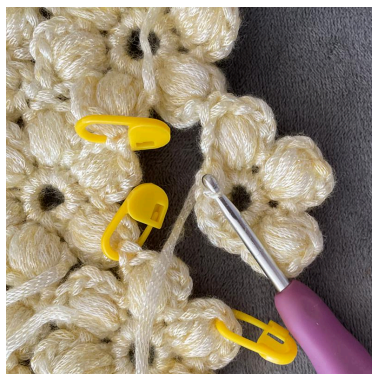
Now, I will show you how to connect 4 petals to the 4 marked points. This process is the same as the previous one, where we connected 2 petals. Start joining from the upper marked petal and work counterclockwise.

Repeat the first round of the flower pattern and crochet only 2 petals as you can see in photo 10,  
 ch 3, puff st in next sc, ch 1, connect with sl st to top of the upper petal, ch 2, sl st in next sc of the unfinished flower (photo 11),  
 ch 3, puff st in next sc, ch 1, connect with sl st to the marked place between two petals, ch 2, sl st in next sc of the unfinished flower (photo 12),  
 ch 3, puff st in next sc, ch 1, connect with sl st to the marked place between two petals, ch 2, sl st in next sc of the unfinished flower (photo 13),  
 ch 3, puff st in next sc, ch 1, connect with sl st to top of the last petal, ch 2, connect with sl st to the first st (photo 14).

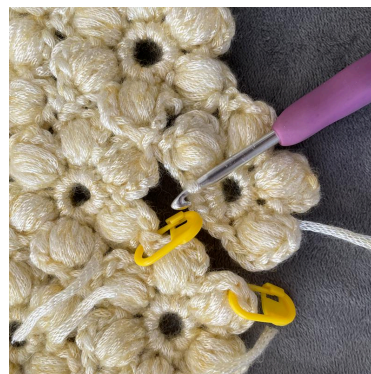




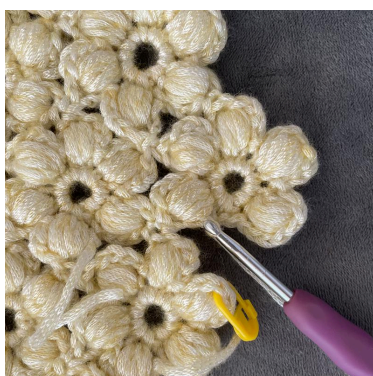

After finishing with the flower joining, start connecting the halves (the gray ones in the diagrams) of the flowers to align the edges of the slipover in this way:

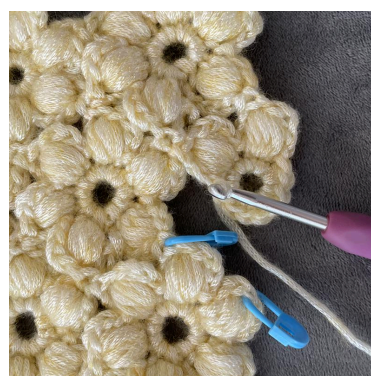
Repeat the previous steps for joining, but skip the first two petals. At the end, work a slip stitch into the next single crochet of the foundation circle.

## SIDES

Photo 1: Right side row. Connect the yarn to the first yellow pin, sc in same space, sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next ch-space marked the second yellow pin, \* dc in the place between two flowers (the first red pin), 2 dc in next ch-spaces (the second red pin), dc in the place between next two petals, 2 dc in next ch-space (marked red), sc in the place between two flowers (marked yellow), 2 sc in next ch-space marked the second yellow pin, sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next ch-space marked the second yellow pin \*\*, rep from \* to \*\* to the underarm (photo 2)

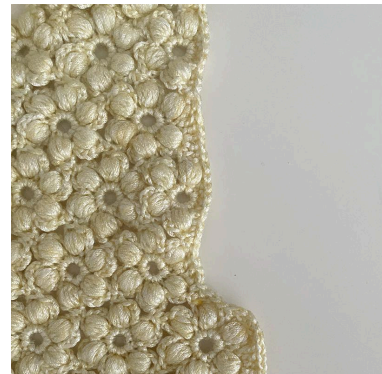
Photo 2-3: 2 sc in the ch-space (marked yellow), dc in the space between next two petals, 2 sc in next ch-space (the second yellow pin), 2 sc in next ch-space (marked red), dc in the place between two petals, 2 sc in next ch-space (the second red pin), sc in the place between 2 flowers, sc in next ch-space, sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in the last marked space. Rep from \* to \*\* to the end of the row.

## TIES

Row 1: Foundation hdc row - 70 stitches (42 cm or 16.5"). You need 4 ties. Sew the ties to the underarms by slip stitches or with a needle and thread.

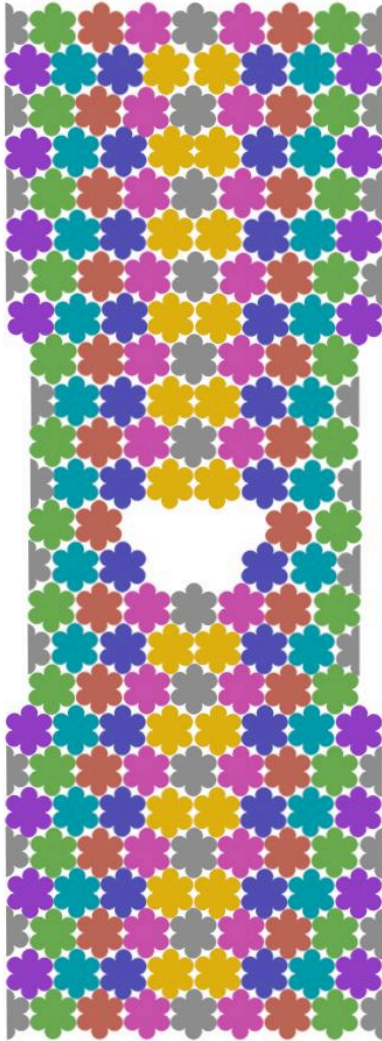

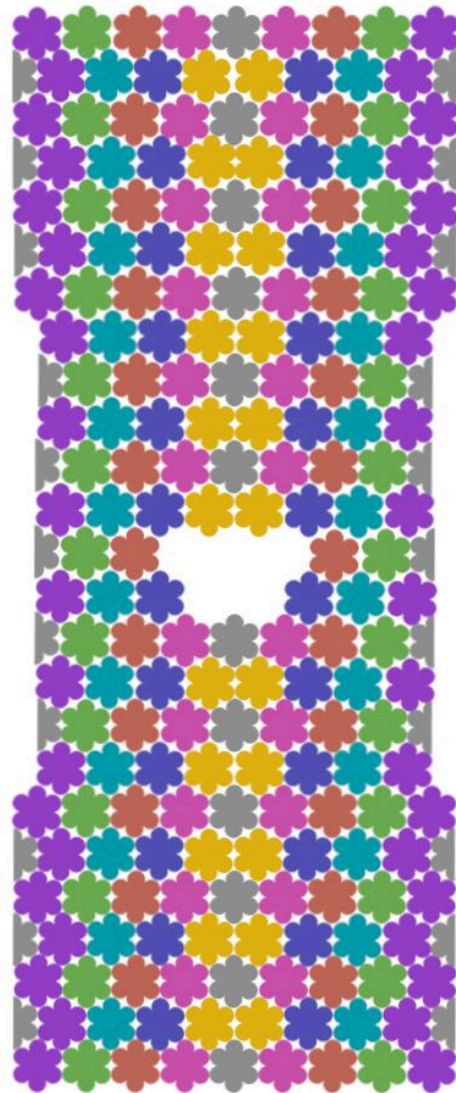
### Charts

For convenience, the layers of flowers are shown in different colors to help distinguish them. The diagrams show the vertical flower connections from left to right.

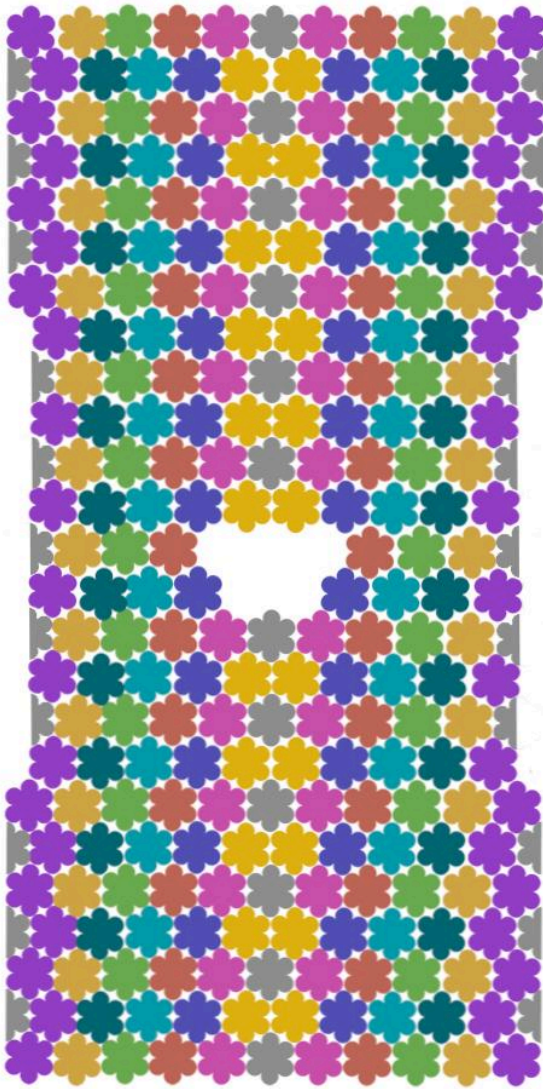

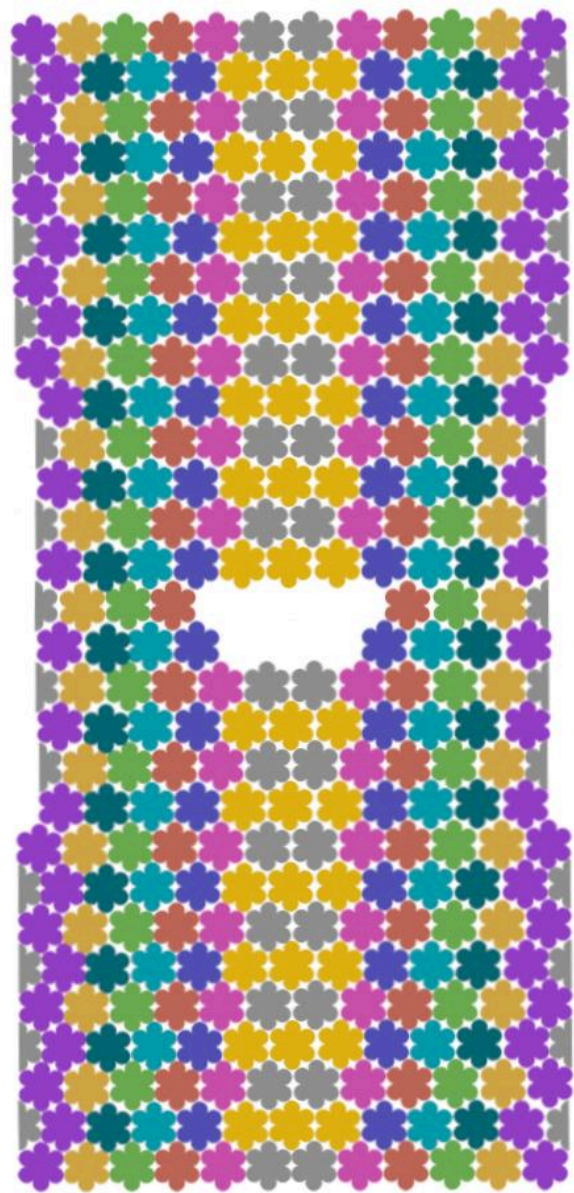
