# Rose Garden

Top

Design: Crochet by Belladonna | Hobbii Design



## MATERIALS

1 (1) 2 (2) 2 (3) 3 skein(s) of **Rainbow Lace**  
color Pastel Pink ( 042)

Crochet hook 2 mm / US B  
2 stitch markers

## YARN QUALITY

 **Rainbow Lace**, Hobbii  
100% Cotton  
50 g / 1.75 oz = 280 m / 306 yds

## GAUGE

30 sts x 10 rows of dc = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

## ABBREVIATIONS

st = stitch  
ch = chain  
sl st = slip stitch  
fsc = foundation single crochet  
sc = single crochet  
dc = double crochet

## SIZE

XXS (XS) S (M) L (XL) XXL

## MEASUREMENTS

Panel width: 38 (42) 46 (53) 59 (66) 72 cm / 15 (16.5) 18 (20.75) 23.25 (26) 28.25"  
Length: 49 (50) 51 (52) 53 (54) 65 cm / 19.25 (19.75) 20 (20.5) 29.75 (21.25) 25.5"

## PATTERN INFORMATION

The top is crocheted from the bottom and up with a 2 mm hook, working from side to side, following a grid pattern to create a flower pattern with double crochets. The straps are crocheted with foundation single crochet, making them long enough so the top is laceable in the back.

The model is 180 cm / 5 feet 11" tall and is wearing a size XS. The top comes with a matching skirt.

# Pattern



## INFO AND TIPS

The Rosegarden Top is crocheted from the bottom up, working side to side following the grid pattern on the next page. Initially you are creating a square, followed by some work on the side, so the top can be laced like a corset in the back with the 2 long foundation single crochet straps.


### Grid Pattern

The grid pattern consists of blank and colored squares.

**A blank square** includes a dc followed by a ch 1 (by chaining 1 you will skip one stitch from the previous row), followed by a dc into the next stitch which is the beginning of a new square

**A colored square** follows the same structure, but the ch 1 is replaced with a dc, followed by another dc into the next stitch which is the beginning of a new square. Each row will end with a dc - if not it will be stated differently.

From row 2 and onwards, each row starts with a ch 4, followed by a dc into 2nd stitch from the chain.



## BODY

Ch 116 (128) 140 (160) 180 (200) 220

### Row 1:

Skip the 1st st, sc into the 2nd st. Then, sc into each ch across the row.

### Row 2-43

From row 2-43 you will follow the grid pattern as seen on the previous page. Since the grid pattern itself goes across fewer stitches than the actual base you have created, you will do blank squares prior to and after the grid pattern.

Make **8 (11) 14 (19) 24 (29) 34** blank squares. Place your stitch marker by the last blank squares dc.

Follow the grid pattern from left to right:

- For a blank square: 1 dc + 1 ch (skip a stitch) and dc into the next square.
- For a colored square: 1 dc + 1 dc, then dc into the next square.

After completing the first row of the grid pattern, place another stitch marker at the last square of the grid. Continue by making **8 (11) 14 (19) 24 (29) 34** blank squares. You finish the row with a dc.

Turn your work and continue with the grid pattern from right to left.

Once the grid pattern is complete, you continue to make 7 (7) 8 (8) 9 (9) 10 rows by alternating 1 dc + 1 ch, finishing the row with a dc. Add more rows if you want the top to be longer.

### Last row

Ch 1, sc into the first st. Then, sc into each st across the row

## WORKING DOWN THE SIDES

### First Row

Begin at the bottom of one side. Attach your yarn, ch 1, and sc into the same st where you attached the yarn.

Sc across the row until you reach the end.

Turn your work, chain 1, and proceed to the next row.

### Second Row

Sc into the first stitch.

ch 2, skip the next 2 stitches, and sc into the 3rd st.

Work 9 sc in the following stitches.

Repeat the **ch 2, skip 2, sc into the 3rd st, and 9 sc** pattern until you have created 6 (6) 6 (6) 7 (7) 7 holes.

Finish the row with a single sc in the last stitch.

Repeat the exact same on the other side.

## THE STRAPS

The straps are crocheted as a fsc chain, and they are attached to the top afterwards.

### How to make a fsc

1. Start with a slip knot
2. Chain 2
3. Insert hook into the first chain. There should be two loops on your hook.
4. Yarn over and pull through the chain. You'll have two loops on your hook.
5. Yarn over and pull through the first loop only. This creates the fsc at the bottom of your stitch.
6. Yarn over again and pull through both loops on the hook to complete the single crochet.
7. Repeat these steps:
  - Insert your hook into the foundation chain you just created (the small "v" at the base of your stitch).
  - Yarn over and pull up a loop (2 loops on the hook).
  - Yarn over and pull through the first loop (foundation chain).
  - Yarn over and pull through both loops (single crochet).

Continue until the chain is approx. 3 meters.

Go 13 (16) 19 (24) 29 (34) 39 squares in on one side, and attach it by the dc with 2 sl st.

Repeat the above written steps to make the 2nd strap, and attach it to the top.
